

We agree to settle and compromise our old dispute about  
a private road, in Blacklick Township, upon the following  
terms to wit: -

That John Rees shall have a private road over the land of the  
said Isaac Mohan, commencing at a chestnut tree standing in  
the public road, about twenty rods, southwardly from the white  
oaks standing, on the same road, near where the private road used by  
the said Isaac Mohan, comes into the said public road; and  
thence to run southwesterly, over the land of said Isaac Mohan  
to a large white oak tree standing in the south west corner of the  
land of said Isaac Mohan, being the same tree at which a  
private road was viewed and laid out for said Rees by A. V.  
Parker Esq. John A. Plain, and John T. Williams; which has  
been confirmed nisi by the Court, and to re-view the same  
an order has been granted upon the petition of the said Isaac  
Mohan; - the said road to be opened, fenced and kept up at  
the expense of the said John Rees, the party who desires to use the  
same his heirs and assigns.

And it is agreed further, that the said view, confirmed  
nisi, upon the petition of said John Rees shall be dismissed; and  
no view shall be made upon the order issued to said Isaac  
Mohan to re-view said road; and that this agreement shall  
be taken and deemed to be a final settlement and compromise  
of all disputes between said parties respecting the location  
of the said road.
