The petition of
the undersigned, citizens and tax-payers of
the Townships of Coxsenburgh and Storey
Creek, Respectfully Represent: That
a petition having been presented to the
said Court at the last March Term
praying for a view to open and lay
out a Public Road from a point
on the Frankstown Road at or near
Jacob Singers in Coxsenburgh Town-
ship, to a point on the Johnstown and
Scalp Level Turnpike intersecting
with a Township road leading from
the said Turnpike past Von Lewens,
in Storey Creek Township: Your
petitioners respectfully demonstrate
against the opening of said Road for
the reason that the same, is unneces-
sary and would be unduly burden-
some on the tax-payers of said Town-
ship especially upon those of
Storey Creek Township, who would
reap no advantage whatever from
the said Road if opened although
about the three fourths of said Road
would be in said Storey Creek
Township; and your petitioners
further represent, that the said

proposed road if granted would cost
 an enormous outlay of money to make
 it, without a corresponding advantage
 to the large majority of the taxpayers
 of said Township; - Your petitioners
 therefore pray that your Honors will refuse
 to confirm the report of Assessors in favor
