We the undersigned Jurors do report that after all being
first duly sworn according to law we proceeded to the
duties of our appointment And it being made known
to the Jurors that due and timely notice of time and place
of view was given to owners and occupiers of Sotted land over
which road paper a Copy of which is hereto annexed
we did view mark and lay out the following for a Private Road
viz Beginning at a Post on Township Road near Saw Mill of Joseph
Holtz in Susquehanna Township Thence by the said Township Road
the three following courses and distances North fifty and one half degrees
East forty perches Thence North Eighty nine degrees East twenty
perches Thence North Sixty nine degrees East thirty eight perches
Thence South Seventy five degrees East twelve perches Thence South
thirty three degrees East two perches Thence South three degrees West
twelve perches Thence South forty four and one half degrees East twelve
perches Thence South fifty four degrees East sixteen perches Thence South
forty one and one half degrees East sixteen perches Thence South Seven
and one half degrees East twenty perches Thence South thirty and one
half degrees East twenty perches Thence South Sixty seven and one half
degrees East thirty six perches to line of land of Heirs of Peter Shero
Thence by ^{said} line of land South fourteen degrees East fifty two perches Thence
through land of Heirs of P. Shero South forty degrees East nine perches to
Post continuing through same land South thirty degrees West four and
five tenths perches to Post on line of land of Heirs of P. Shero and

George H. Miller thence by said line of land South fourteen
degrees East one hundred and fifty perches to Fashow Eberly
and Sargunhoun Plank Road at a Point Near Residence of George
Miller in Carroll Township which Private Road we consider in
our Opinion Necessary and Conducive to accommodate Settlers
in that locality and owners and occupiers of private land
being present at said view by themselves or by their agents at
said view and further we do report and assess a damage
of five dollars to heirs of said Peter Shro as our
view will cut off about twenty perches of land of said Estate
which will be useful to said farm after said road is made
which must be done to avoid a steep hill on line of land

of the Peace held at Ebenezer in and

for said County on the fourth day of January

A. D. 1876. Before the Honorable John Dean

President and Rees J. Lloyd and John Blainigan Esquires

Associate Judges. The Petition of Joseph Kelly and

George Miller of the County of Columbia was presented

representing that they labor under great inconveniences for

want of a Private Road to lead from Public Road running

from Canellon to Cherry Tree, at or near the residence of George

Miller in Canellon Township to a point at or near the

Saw Mill of Joseph Kelly in Seneca County Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint Surveyors on the

View and lay out said road according to Law.

The Court upon due consideration had of

the premises do order and appoint Henry Scobean, Julius

Stech and P. C. Eck, to view the ground proposed for said

road, who, after having been duly sworn as aforesaid

to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity,

and if all of them view the same and a majority of them

agree that there is occasion for such a road, they shall

proceed to lay out the same as agreeably to the views

of the Petitioners as may be, having respect to the best

grounds for a road and the shortest distance and

in such manner as to do the least injury to private

property. The views aforesaid shall give matter in writing

written of the views and plans of the meeting, to the

clerk, being duly attested that which the proposed road is to run.

And thence do and perform their acts enjoined by
 the provisions of the Act of Assembly relating to roads
 and make reports of their proceedings first to the
 next City Quarters Session to be held in the County
 City, accompanying their Reports with a Draft
 in which they must report whether they judge the same
 necessary for a Public or Private Road.
