

Camden County N.J.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the

Peace held at Elmhurst for Camden County

on the 6th day of December A. D. 1846

before the Honorable Judges of the same Court.

The Petition of sundry Citizens of Camden and Black-Bottom
Township representing that they have undergone great disadvantages
for want of a Road or Highway from a point on Road leading
thence to lands of Mr. Griffith Thomas Jones and others
at a point where said road turns off said road to Thomas
Jones' house and crossing the land of said Jones and
land of John R. Williams, from the Road to Thomas R. Williams
to another Public road leading from Perth to Camden
at a point on said road near to Thomas R. Williams house
and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons
to view and locate the same.

The Court upon due consideration of the premises
do Order and appoint Henry Seaman, Hugh Edwards
and Elias Penland to view the ground proposed for said
road, who after first being duly sworn or affirmed to
discharge the duties of the appointment with fidelity,
shall proceed to view the same, and if all the said
viewers appointed view the same, and a majority of the
said viewers agree that there is occasion for such
a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as
agreed by the wishes of the petitioners as may be shown
respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance
and in such manner as shall do the least injury to

private property

The persons interested in said road having
frequently given public notice by written or printed advertisements,
of the time and place when the said Juries shall meet
for the purpose of locating said road at least ten days
before such meeting.

If the Juries aforesaid shall decide in favor of
locating said road, it is hereby made the duty to
obtain from the persons through whose lands the road
may pass releases from any damages that may
arise to them in opening the same: and in every case
where the owners of such lands refuse releasing their
claim to damages, the said Juries shall assess the
damages and make report thereof signed by a majority
of the Juries present; and hereunto the same together
with all releases to the next Court of Deuts Sessions,
to be held in said Office with the papers relating to said
road.

And the said Juries shall make report of the
foregoing herein to the next Court of Deuts Sessions to
be held for said County accompanying the same with
a Part or Drafts of said road with reference to
the improvements thereof to be made; in which
reports they shall state the the how be seen or affirmed
and also what they judge the said Road necessary
for a public or private Road. By the Court

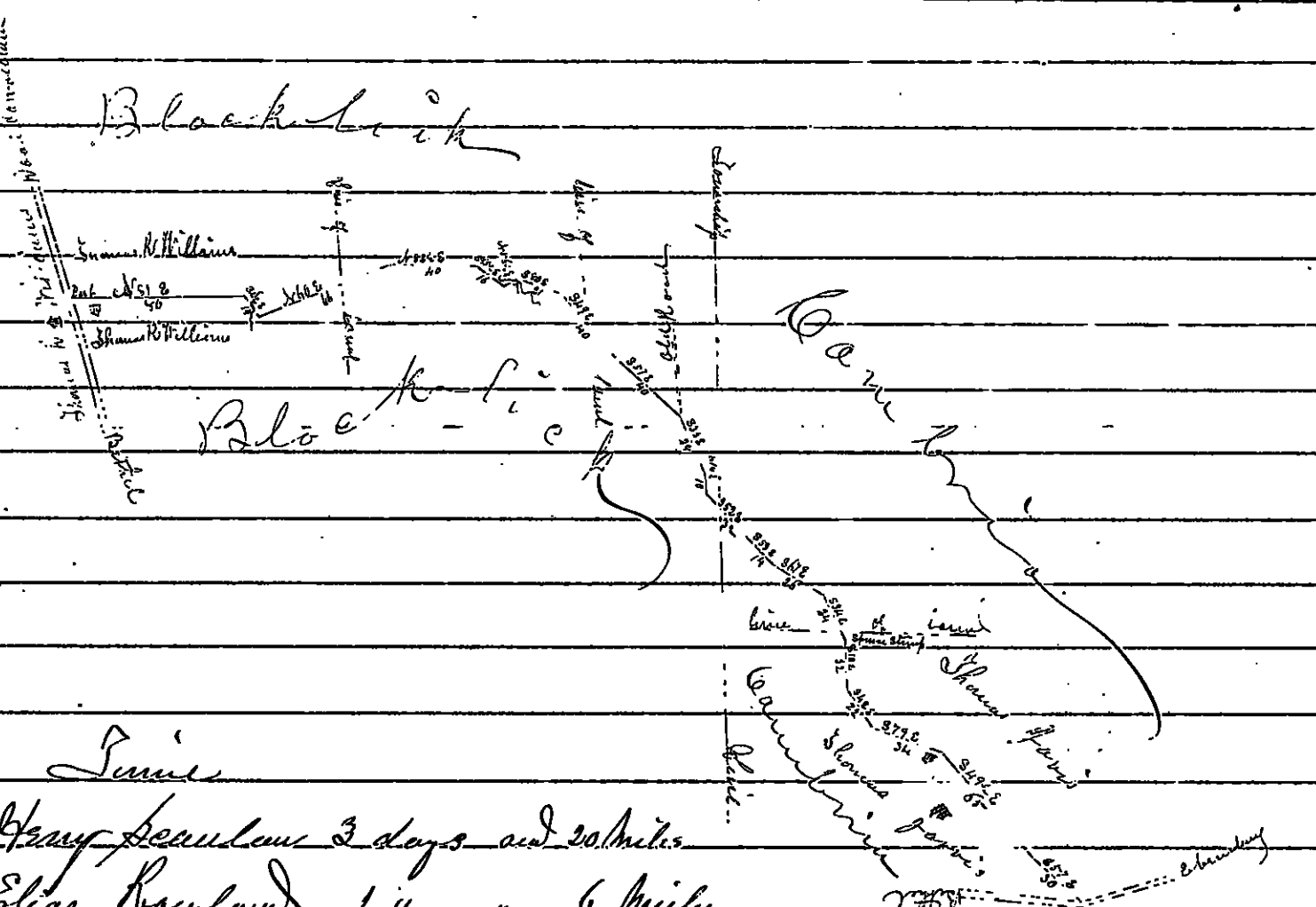

Columbia County N. S.

At the Court of General Quarter Sessions of
the Peace held at Ebenezer in and for said
County on the 17. day of June A. D. 1846
before the Hon. John Dean, President and
Reas. John Lloyd and John Blamason Esqs. Assise Judges.

The Petition of divers Citizens of ^{Berkley} Township in
said County was presented. Representing that a Public Road was
long since laid out from a point near the Clay Pike at
John Wilsons to Orms Saw Mill in said Township.

That part of said road commencing where said road
crosses the south line of land of James S. Bennett to
the north line of said land of Bennett is incumbered and
does not damage to private property, and that the remainder
of said road commencing at the north line of said Bennett
land to Orms Saw Mill has not been opened for public
use. That to open the same would be very expensive to said
Township, and when opened would be incumbered by the same
and not needed for either public or private use. And
praying the Court to appoint persons to locate the part of
said road running through Bennett land and supply
the same by a road to run from the south line of said
land and intersect a road lately laid out leading from
Brier School House to W. Holmes Saw Mill, at or near
said School House, also, to locate the part of said road
from the south line of said Bennett land to Orms Saw
Mill.

The Court upon due consideration

do order and appoint Henry Scanlon & John B. Nicks
and William Bracken to view the ground proposed to be
located and surveyed, who, after having first been duly
sworn or affirmed according to law to discharge the
duty of their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view
the same, and if all the said view appointees view the
same and a majority of them agree that this is occasion
for locating and surveying said road they shall proceed to
do so according to the desire of the petitioners as much
convenient to the best ground for a road and the
shortest distance and in such manner as to do the
least injury to private property. These persons interested in
said road having previously given public notice by
written or printed advertisements of the time and place
where said view shall meet for the purpose of locating
said road at least ten days before such meeting.

If the view shall decide in favor of locating said
road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons
to whose lands the road may pass releases from any
damages that may arise to them in opening the same.
And, in every case where the owner of such lands refuses
releasing their claim to damages, the said view shall
assess the damages and make a report thereof signed
by a majority of the view persons, and transmit the same
together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions
to be held in said office with the papers relating to said
road. And the said view persons shall make report of
their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions

who held for said County, accompanying the same with a return
draft of said road, with reference to the improvements therein
which it passes. In which report they also state
that they have been sworn or affirmed, and also
whether they judge the said road necessary for a
Public or Private road.

In the Honorable the Judges then Constituting
a Court of Quarter Sessions in and for the County
of Cambridge at Worcester Term of S. 1876

That the undersigned persons appointed by virtue of the aforesaid Order of Court do report that we met at time and place given in public notice given to owners and occupiers of certain lands over which said road was used and that we did view and locate the following parts of said mentioned road in said order viz beginning at a Post on South line of James Bennett's land thence by said old road North seven degrees East Sixty perches North twenty four and one half degrees West Eighty perches North four and one half degrees East Eight perches North forty four degrees East Eight perches North eighty nine degrees East sixteen perches North thirty four degrees East fifteen perches North fifty five degrees East Eight perches North sixty two degrees East thirty perches to Post in old road which in our opinion should be located and supplied as follows for a Public Road or highway viz Beginning at North line of land of James Bennett's land thence thence South twenty four and one half degrees West Seventy Eight perches to Post thence North eighty seven and one half degrees West thirty perches to Post which in our opinion is necessary to accommodate the public traffic and we further do report that we do award and give a damage to James Bennett
