or affirmed in the manner and form prescribed  
by said order. That all said viewers to wit S. H. Miller  
Jacob Singer John S. Snider at the time and place  
advertised and having viewed the ground for the  
proposed road and all of us concurring and  
agreeing that the same is necessary for public use, did  
lay out and now return the same for a public road.

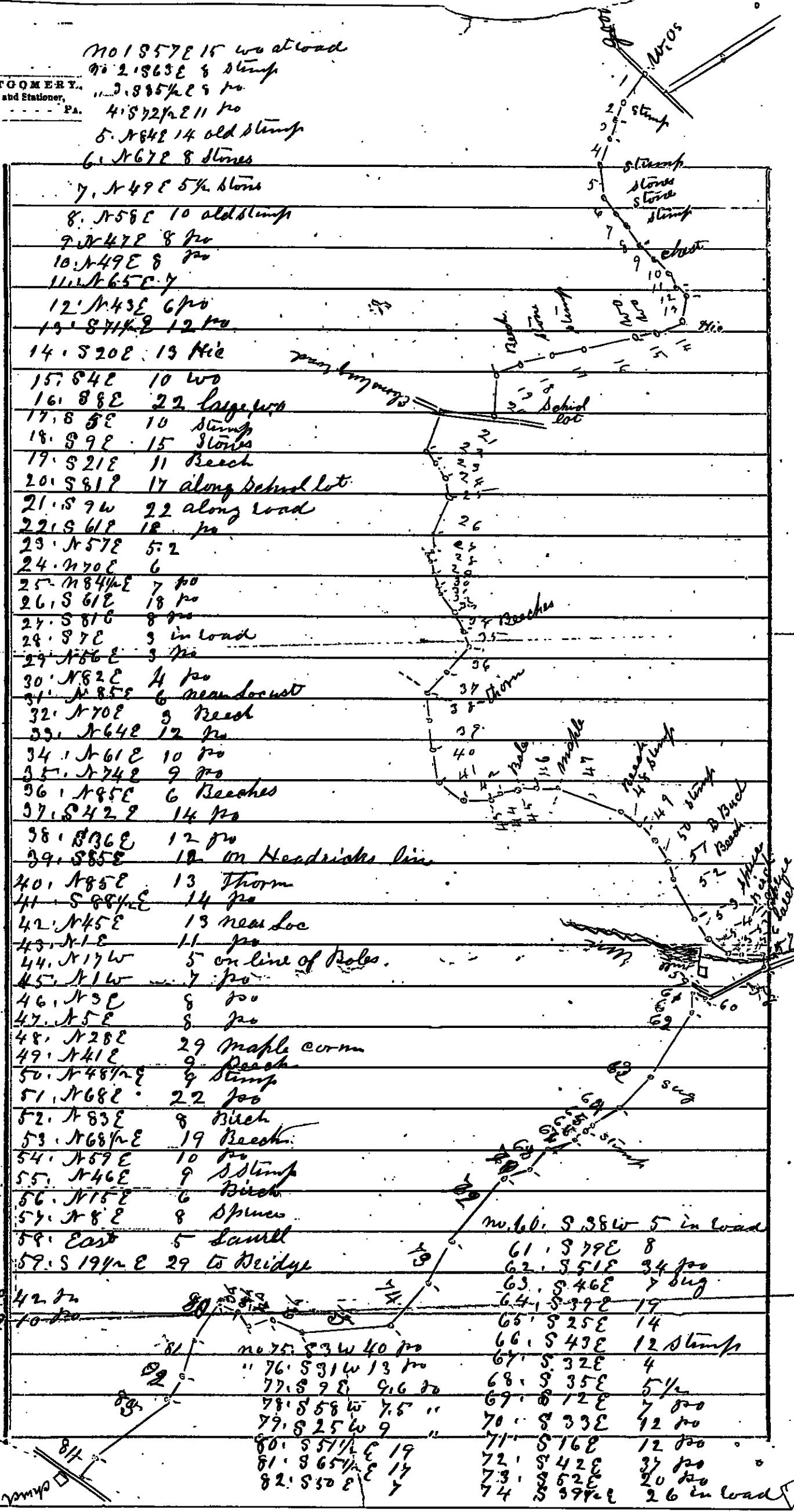

At a Court of General Sessions held at Elmer for Columbia County on the 15. December A.D. 1846

before the Honorable the Judge of the said Court.

The Petition of divers Citizens of Cayuga County was presented showing that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a Public Road or Highway to lead from a point on the road from Millville to the Chertons Pike over the Rensselaer hills, at or near the Dunkard Church to East Cornsack Brook and thence praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to Law.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises did Order and appoint Samuel W. Miller Jacob Singer and John S. Snyder to view the ground proposed for said Road, who after first having been duly sworn & affirmed to discharge the duties of their Appointments with fidelity, shall proceed to view the same, and if all the said Viewers appointed view the same, and a majority of said Viewers agree that there is occasion for such Road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property. The persons intended in said Road having previously given public notice by written or printed advertisements of the time and place when said Viewers shall meet for the purpose of locating said Road at least ten days before such meeting.

If the Viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor  
of locating said road it is hereby made the duty  
to obtain from the persons through whom land the road may  
pass releases from any damages that may arise to  
them in opening the same. And in every case where  
the owner of such land refuses releasing them clear of  
damages, the said Viewers shall assess the damages  
and make Report thereof signed by a majority of the  
Viewers present, and transmit the same together  
with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions,  
to be filed with the papers in said Office relating to said  
road.

And the said Viewers shall make Report of their  
proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to  
be held for said City, accompanying the same with  
a Plan or Map of said road, with the course and  
distances and references to the improvements through  
which the same may pass. In which Report they  
shall state also how they have been sworn or affirmed, and  
also whether they judge said road necessary for a  
Public or Private Road.
