

To the Hon. the Judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of Cambria County.

The undersigned, Citizens of Conemaugh
Township Cambria County, Humbly represent:

That the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria
County granted and confirmed a Public Road
leading from the Red Bridge in Conemaugh
Township, to Bens Creek Furnace in Goder
Township, which said road was opened at
great expense by the Citizens of Conemaugh
Township; and whereas said road intersects
a Public Road leading from Bens Creek Fur-
nace to the Ligonier Turnpike at the mouth
of George W. Osborn's Lane, at a point on
the bank of Stony Creek, both roads occu-
-pying the same ground from said point to
Bens Creek Furnace, a distance of one hun-
-dred and twenty-six perches, in Goder
Township; Stony Creek being the line between
said Townships; and whereas your petitioners
are informed that certain citizens have petition-
ed to your Honors to vacate a certain por-
-tion of said road leading from Bens Creek
Furnace to the Ligonier Turnpike aforesaid, which
if done would include that portion of the road
from the Red Bridge in Conemaugh Township
to Bens Creek Furnace, which lies in Goder
Township, thus completely shutting up our
outlet to Mill and Market by the road we
were at so much expense to open, and by conn-
-necting with said road leading from Bens
Creek to the Ligonier Turnpike at the
mouth of G. W. Osborn's Lane we have
a level road to Johnstown, our nearest
market, whereas if said road is vacat-
ed, we would have to travel around

out of our course, and ever stop till,
to get to market, thus defeating our
primary object in praying for a
making the road from the Red Bridge
to Bens Creek Furnace. We therefore
pray your Honors not to vacate any
portion of the public road from Bens
Creek Furnace to the Ligonier Turn-
pike at the mouth of George W. Adams lane.

Cambridge Counties.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ekeus by in and for said County on the 9th day of November A. D. 1877. before the Honorable Judges of the same Court.

The Petition of John Blum was presented to the Court Representing that he labors under great inconvenience for want of a Private Road to lead from his residence in Leavelle Township and to intersect a private road of John Otto Senior. Beginning at the residence of Peterson to a point at or near line of the Steins of Charles Pass descend. in said township.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do. order and appoint Henry Scanlan, Benjamin Watson and Edmund S. Binder to view the ground proposed for the said road. Who, having been first duly sworn and affirmed to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity - are to go upon the premises, and if all the said Viewers view the same and a majority of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as generally to the wishes of the Petitioner as may be having respect to the best good for a road and the shortest distance and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private rights.

The party interested in said road having previously given Public notice by printed or written

Advancements of this time and place when such
Viewers shall meet, at least ten days before such
Meeting.

If the Viewers aforesaid shall decide that
there is occasion for such Road, it is hereby made
their duty, to obtain from the persons that where
land the Road may pass Releases from any
damages that may arise to them in opening the
same. And in Every case when the owner of such
land refuse releasing their claims to damages,
the said Viewers shall assess the damages, and
make Report thereof signed by a Majority of the
Viewers present, and transmit the same together
with all releases to the Court of Quarter Session to
be held in said Court with the papers relating to
said Road.

And the said Viewers shall make Reports
of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Session
to be held in said County, accompanying the same
with a Petition or Draft of said Road, with the names
and distances and reference to the improvements
that which the same may pass. In which
Reports they shall state that they have been sworn
or affirmed: and also what they judge to be
necessary for a Public or Private Road.

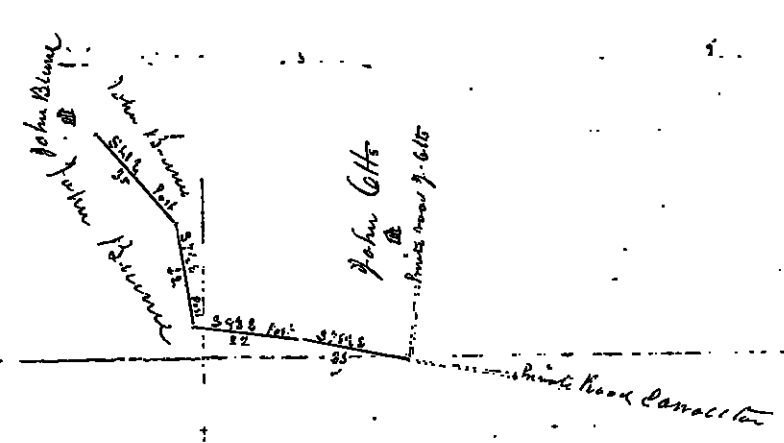
