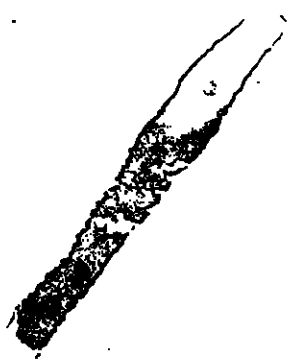

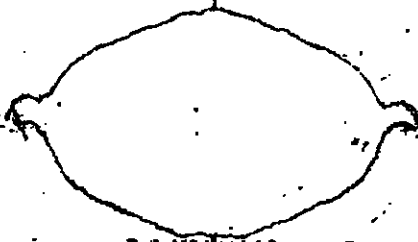

the least jealousy or territorial feeling springs up, by reason of a tie vote resulting in the board and a dead lock - each side adhering to the supposed interests of the geographical section it represents, regardless often of the general good.

Thirdly: That owing to the said natural division and the equal distribution of voters on either side, all the official transactions of the township officers are more or less affected by the same spirit of local jealousy, detrimental alike to the harmony and successful working of the township officials and to the general welfare of the people of the township, and

Fourthly: That owing to the great size of the township - some forty-five square miles - many of the voters and tax-payers are compelled to travel many miles to go to the present polling place and to the place fixed by law for the payment of County taxes, and are compelled to cross this high, mountainous ridge in going to and returning from said election house.

Fifthly: The interests of the two sides thus naturally separated are in no way identical, and there is scarcely a citizen living

within a mile of this natural division line of Chest Creek, on either side, and owing to the character of the land, it being rocky, steep and unfit for cultivation, there is no probability of any future settlers along this belt of about two miles in width almost in the heart of the present township, along said Creek.

For these and many other reasons the present township is inconvenient to the inhabitants thereof, and the convenience and advantage of said inhabitants would be greatly promoted by dividing said township by a line commencing in the middle of Chest Creek, on the South side of said township where the lines of Carroll township and Clearfield township meet on said Creek, thence down the middle of the said Creek in its several courses to the line of the County of Clearfield, on the Northern boundary of said township of Chest. Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to divide the said township by the aforesaid line and in accordance with the Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided and they will ever pray &c.
