

Cambria County, St.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and
for said County on the seventh day of
April A. D. 1881. Before the Honorable
Judges of said Court.

The petition of sundry citizens of Jackson Twp.
in said County was presented representing that
a road has been long since laid out from the
mill of the heirs of George Wehm in said Twp. to
a point near the old saw mill of W. W. Harris
Esq. on the road from W. W. Harris in said Twp.
to Emanuel Klinfeld's, your petitioners con-
cieve is now become useless, inconvenient and
burthensome to the inhabitants of said township
praying the Court that said road may be
vacated agreeably to the Act of Assembly in
such case made and provided.

The Court upon due consideration had of
the premises do order and appoint J. A. Shoemaker
Christ. Goodrd and Samuel Leidy to view the
ground proposed to be vacated who after
having first been duly sworn or affirmed accord-
ing to law shall proceed to discharge the duties
of their appointment, and if all of them view the
same and if a majority of them agree that there
is no occasion for said road they shall proceed
to vacate the same. The parties interested in
vacating said road having previously given

public notice by written or printed advertisements of the time and place where such viewers shall meet for the purpose of vacating said road at least ten days before such meeting. And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, Accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road vacated and reference to the improvements through which the same passes in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed.
