

Cambria County

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for said County on the fifth day of January A.D. 1881 before the Honorable Judges of said Court.

The petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Susquehanna in said County was presented representing that a public road leading from the state road from Cherrytree to Hollidayburg at or near the premises or residence of Daniel Fritz to a point at or near the saw-mill of Joseph Holtz in said Township has become burthensome and inconvenient on account of steep hills, snow-drifts in the winter season and length of route.

And praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view, vacate and supply said road.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint Henry Seaman Daniel S. McKelty and John B. Baum to view the ground proposed to be vacated and supplied who after having first given due and legal notice of the time and place of meeting by printed or written advertisements, and having been duly qualified according to law, to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view the same, and if all the said viewers view the same, and a majority of them agree that there is occasion for said road to be vacated and supplied, they shall proceed to vacate and supply the same, as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, and in such manner as shall do the

least injury to private property.

If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of vacating and supplying said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose land the road may pass releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such land refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed with the papers relating to said road.

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road, the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which the same passes

and in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed, and also whether they judge said road necessary for a public or private road.

appointed viewers by the aforesaid order of Court do Report that having given due and timely notice of time and place of view by posting four notices in most public places in Susquehanna Township And after all being duly sworn according to law we proceeded to the duties of our appointment and did view and locate the following parts of a public road leading from State road at Stripes to Holtz's Sawmill viz Beginning at a Post on public road leading from Holtz's Sawmill to Plattville on land of John Mainion three South Seventy four and one half degrees East twenty two perches by road by same South Eighty four and one half degrees East eighteen perches by same road South Seventy five and one half degrees East twenty two perches by same road North Eighty degrees East thirty four perches by same road North Sixty and one half degrees East Eleven perches by same road South Sixty two and one half degrees East thirty two perches by same road South Eighty six degrees East two perches to Pointers in line of land of John Mainion and Isaac Wrohlund which parts we do locate in consequence of steep hills and injury to private property and supply the same as follows for a Public road or high-way viz Beginning at Pointers on line of land of John Mainion and Isaac Wrohlund thence by said line of land South fifty six degrees West Eighty seven perches to Post on line of land of John Mainion and Elizabeth Fultz thence by said line of land North fifty nine degrees West thirty perches to locust stump in road leading to Joseph Holtz's Sawmill See draft herewith annexed And we do further report that we do award and assess a damage of ten dollars to Elizabeth Fultz improved land and also we do award and assess a damage of ten dollars to Charles Wrohlund improved land all of which is respectfully submitted &c

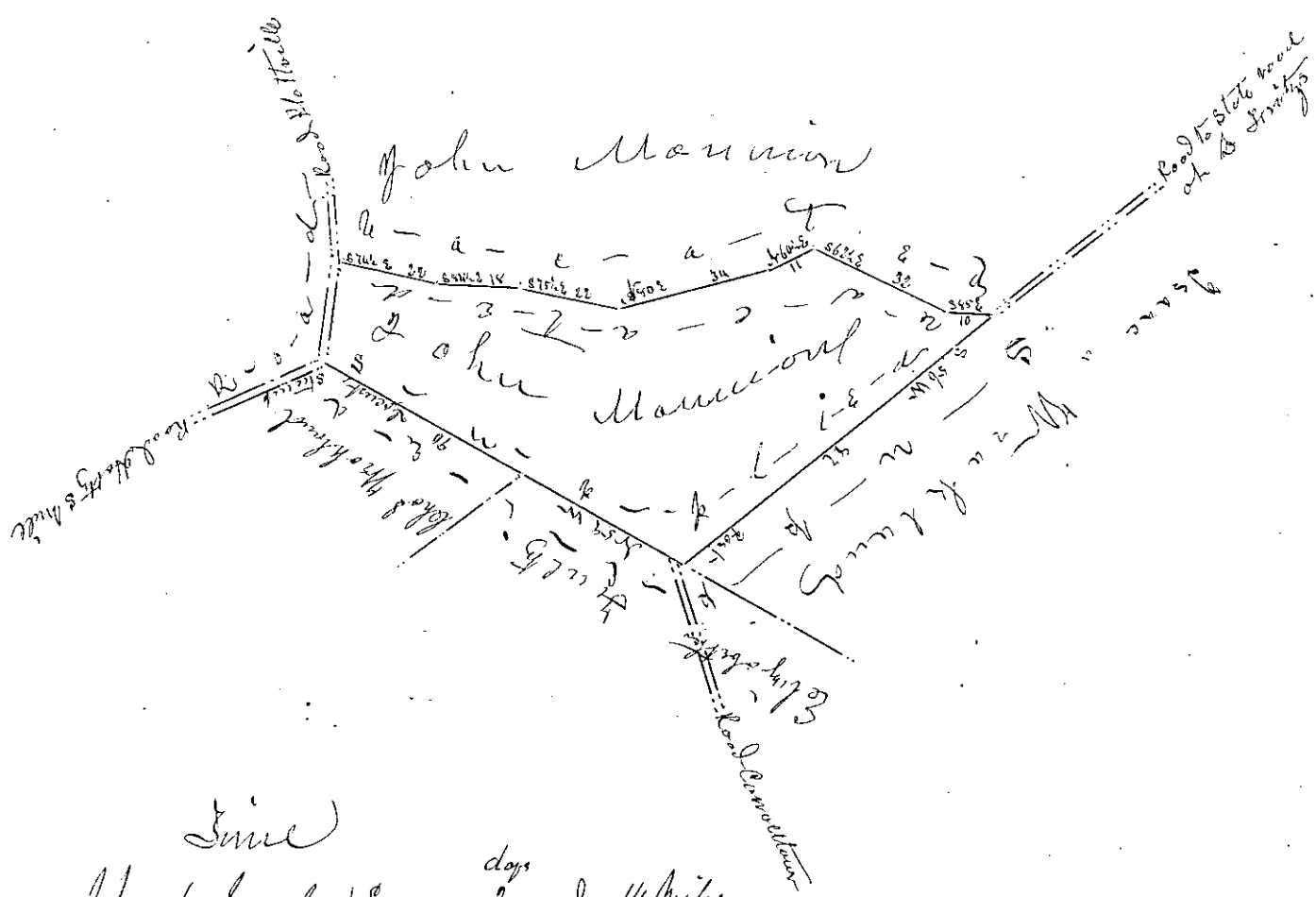
