appointed by the aforesaid order of Court do report that we gave due and timely notice of time and place of meeting of the Jurors by three written advertisements put up in three public places in said Townships and we do further report that we met at time and place designated in said notices and after all being duly sworn according to law we proceeded to the duties of our appointment and we did view and locate the following parts of said road in our opinion it being useful convenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of Chest and Chronfield Townships Beginning at a point on Public road leading from Brown Council to Chest Springs on land of James Frank and Sons thence South seventy three degrees East thirty eight perches thence North thirty six and one half degrees East twelve perches thence North seventy six degrees East eight perches thence South seventy degrees East thirty perches thence North eighty four degrees East thirty six perches thence South eleven degrees East twenty perches thence South six and one half degrees West forty six perches thence South eight East eighteen perches thence South eighty eight and one half degrees East eighteen perches to point on Public road leading from Mud lick to Brown dam on land of James Frank and Sons See draft herewith annexed

To the inhabitants of West and Westfield Townships in Cambria County  
That by virtue of an order of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County we will  
meet in Dingytown on the road leading from Lewis Powell to West Springs for  
the purpose of locating a public road leading from said Lewis Powell road to a  
bridge over Mud lick on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> August A.D. 1851 at 10 o'clock A.M.  
whom and where those interested can attend if they see proper

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg, in and for said County, on Tuesday the nineteenth day of July A.D. 1881, before the Honorable Judges of said Court.

The petitions of sundry Citizens of said County were presented, representing, that a road was formerly laid out, beginning near a Bridge on Mudlicks run in Clearfield Township, and intersecting with the Chest Springs and Genesee road, about three fourths of a mile west of said Bridge, (the same being supplied by another road) which road said petitioners conceive has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, and praying the Court that the same may be vacated according to law.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Henry Scantlan, E. L. Guides and J. W. Cuffaday to view the road proposed to be vacated, who, after having first been duly sworn or affirmed according to law to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity, they shall proceed to view the same, and if all of them view the same, and a majority of them agree, that there is no occasion for such road they shall proceed to vacate the same. The parties interested in vacating said road having previously given public notice by written or printed advertisements of the time and place when said Viewers shall meet for the purpose of vacating said road at least ten days before such meeting.

And the said Viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road vacated, with references to the improvements through which the same passes; in which report they shall state that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law.

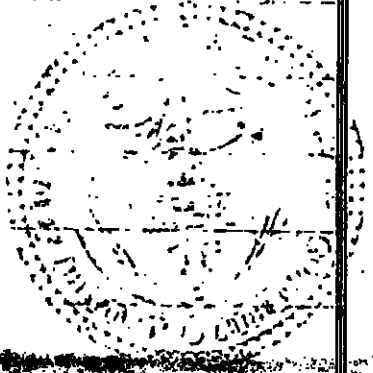
