Exceptants to the report of viewers, to lay out a  
private road from the house of Jacob Pringle to  
the public road leading from Wilmore to Ebersburg.

- 1.<sup>st</sup> One of the viewers, to wit, Alexander B. Pringle is  
a relation of the said Jacob Pringle, for whom the  
said road is proposed to be laid out and opened,  
and from this cause was disqualified from acting  
in the said matter.
- 2.<sup>d</sup> The report is defective and insufficient, because  
the said viewers do not find and report, that said  
road is necessary, and that there is occasion for  
the said proposed road.
- 3.<sup>d</sup> That the said proposed road if opened will require  
eighty rods of the fence of George Settlemyer to be  
moved, and would go through the best part of the  
meadows of the said Settlemyer, during the whole dis-  
tance of the said eighty rods; and that the amount  
of damages awarded to said Settlemyer, if the said  
road should be opened, are entirely inadequate.
