

Cambria County, Pa.

At a Court of General Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg and for said County, on Tuesday the 24<sup>th</sup> day of October a.d. 1882, before the Honorable Judges of said Court:

The petition of Joseph T. Hollow of Reads Township in said County was presented, representing that he labors under great inconvenience for want of a Private Road of lead from the road running from Thos. M. Apple's to Mountain Dale, at a point where the line between Oliver Hill and George W. Case intersects said road, along said line north to land of Oliver Hill, and through the said land of Oliver Hill, to the dwelling house of said petitioner in said Township, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint Theodore M. Apple, A. H. Fiske and James W. McCortney to view the ground proposed for said road, who after having first given due and legal notice by printed or written advertisements of the time and place of meeting, and having been duly qualified according to law to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity shall proceed to view the same, and a majority of them agree that there is occasion for such road; they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeable to the wishes of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for said road; and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property: If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from persons through whose land the same may pass releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case, where the owners of

 5 accompanying the same with a plot or draft thereof, the courses

 7 the same may pass, together with releases, or amount of damages  
 8 assessed (if any) and whether they judge said road necessary  
 9 for Public or Private use; and in which report they shall state  
 10 distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed according  
 11 to law.

Upon the foregoing order of Court, the undersigned,  
appointed therein to view and lay out the road therein  
mentioned, having attended to that duty, respectfully

Report: -

All were present at the view, and all were first  
sworn as the law prescribes.

In furtherance of duty assigned we have laid  
out the following described road: - Beginning at  
the "Ridge Road", so called, in Reade township, where  
the line between lands of Oliver Hill, and John A.  
and George W. Caw, either or both, as the case may be,  
touches or crosses it and running North  $23\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West  
seventy-one and a half rods; thence North  $53\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  West,  
seven and a half rods; thence North  $83^{\circ}$  West seventeen  
rods; thence North  $84^{\circ}$  West twelve rods; thence North  
 $88^{\circ}$  West twenty-two rods; thence North  $85^{\circ}$  West  
thirty-nine rods; thence West  $20^{\circ}$  South eighteen  
rods, to the dwelling house of Joseph G. Hollen - a  
plot or draft thereof follows this report. This road  
so laid out we think necessary for a Private Road.

A release of damages by Oliver Hill through whose  
land this road passes is also appended to this report.

And to John A. Caw and George W. Caw, either or  
both as the case may be, some thirty-five rods of whose  
land is taken but from whom we obtained no  
release of damages, inasmuch as we believe

their premises will be benefitted more than damaged  
by making this road, we decline to award them  
any damages
