At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for said County, on the 14th day of March A. D. 1882 before the Honorable Judges of said Court. The petition of sundry citizens of Susquehanna township in said County was presented, setting forth, that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway leading from the public road at or near James A. Porter's residence in said township, to a public road at or near Pleasant Hill Church, and praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint Paul Yahner, Jacob Johnston and Augustine Craver to view the ground proposed for said road who after having given due and legal notice by printed or written advertisements of the time and place of meeting, and after being duly qualified according to law to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity shall proceed to view the same, and if all the said Viewers view the same, and a majority of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground and the shortest distance, and in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property: If the Viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from persons through whose lands the road may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such lands refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said Viewers shall assess the damages, "if any;" and make report thereof signed by a majority of the Viewers present, and transmit the same, together with

all releases, to be filed with the papers relating to said road. And the said Viewers shall make report of their proceedings therein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road, the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which the same passes; and in which report they shall state distinctly; that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law: and further: whether they judge said road necessary for Public or Private use

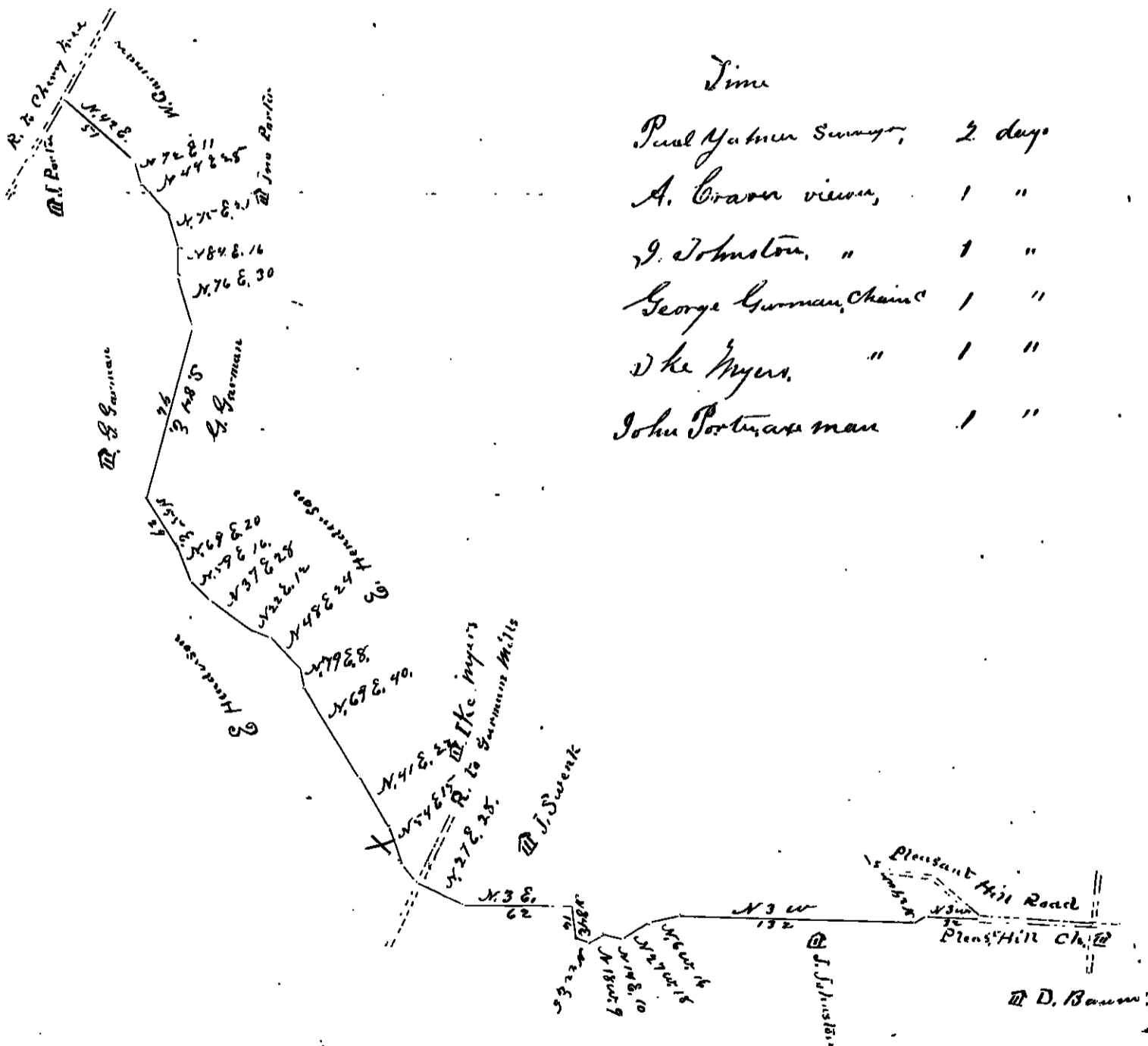

We the undersigned viewers appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned do report: That after having given due notice of the time and place of holding the said view were present at the same and after all being first duly sworn according to Law in pursuance of the said order we have viewed and laid out and do return for public use the following road viz: Beginning at a point near the residence of James Porter on the Public road leading to Cherry-tree Thence North forty two degrees East fifty one perches thence by land of Wm. Gorman and James Porter North seventy two degrees East eleven perches thence North forty nine degrees East twenty five perches thence on land of G. Gorman North seventy five degrees East twenty one perches thence North eighty four degrees East six teen perches thence North seventy six degrees East thirty perches thence South seventy four degrees East ninety six perches thence North fifty five degrees East twenty nine perches thence North sixty nine degrees East twenty perches thence North fifty nine degrees East sixteen perches thence North thirty seven degrees East twenty eight perches thence North twenty two degrees East twelve perches thence North forty eight degrees East twenty four perches thence North seventy nine degrees East eight perches thence North sixty nine degrees East forty perches thence ^{South} forty one East twenty two perches thence North fifty nine degrees East twenty nine perches. The last six courses being on land of E. Henderson. Thence on land of V. H. Myers North seventy degrees East twenty two perches thence North fifty four degrees East fifteen perches to a road leading to "Gorman's Mills" thence North twenty seven degrees East twenty eight perches thence on line of land of J.
