Exception to the report of viewers to lay out a public road in Blacklick Township from Bethel School House No. 2 to a point on the "Murray Road" on the line of the land between Mahan & Rees 1st. That the road as laid out by the viewers is unnecessary, and will be burdensome to the inhabitants of the township.

2nd. That if the proposed road be opened it will inure to the sole benefit of Isaac Mahan, and a private road is all that the said Mahan should have.

3rd. The report is defective for the reason that it does not show that said viewers endeavored to obtain a release from Elizabeth Rees, one of the persons through whose land the proposed road passes.

4th. That there are now opened, through the land of said Elizabeth Rees, two township roads, and should the proposed road be opened, it would be to the damage and injury of her property.

5th. The report of the viewers does not show whether the land, through which the road passes, is improved or not.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for said County on the fifth day of January A.D. 1881 before the Honorable Judges of said Court.

The petition of Jacob Pringle of said County was presented representing that he labors under inconvenience for want of a private road leading from his dwelling in Summerhill Township to a point on the public road leading from Wilmore to Ebensburg at or near the late residence of Jacob Emigh deceased in said Township, and praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and locate said road according to law.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint Wm. McConnell, Alex. B. Pringle and Henry Brown to view the ground proposed for said road who after having first given due and legal notice by printed or written advertisements of the time and place of meeting and having been duly qualified according to law to discharge their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view the same, and if all the said viewers view the same, and a majority of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioner as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property.

If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor

of locating said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from persons through whose land the same may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such land refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present, and transmit the same together with all releases to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed with the papers relating to said road.

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for said County accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road, and the courses and distances and references to the improvements through which the same passes. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed, and also
witnessed by the Court
