We the subscribers, the Viewers appointed
by the Court to view the place proposed for
the Bridge in the within Order mentioned,
Respectfully report, that having given
due notice according to law, of time
and place of view, and having been present
at the view of the place proposed for the
bridge within mentioned and having
all been first affirmed in pursuance
of said order, We viewed the said prem-
ises, and are of opinion that a bridge over
Charles Helsel's mill dam (Paint Creek) where
the public road or highway to the village of
Elton and to Johnstown crosses the said dam
and Creek, is necessary, and that the erecting
of such a bridge would be attended with more
expense than it is reasonable the said Township
should bear. We further state that Charles Helsel is
the only person on whose premises said bridge
passes, who has released all damages appearing.

Office Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace
held at Ellensburg in and for the County of Cambria
before the Honorable Judges of the said Court on
the eighth day of August A.D. 1882. The petition
of sundry Citizens of Adams township in said
County was presented setting forth that a bridge is much
wanted over Charles Weibel's Mill Dam at the place where the
public road to Johnstown crosses the said dam in said
township the present bridge being unsafe and not upon the
view and that the aforesaid owner refuses to have a new one
laid upon the breastwork of his dam and that the expense of
erection said bridge would be too heavy and burthensome up-
on the inhabitants of said township and praying the said
Court to appoint proper persons to view the premises and take
such order on the subject as is required and directed by the
Act of General Assembly in such cases made and provided.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order
and appoint Weirand Shaffer, Henry Eichenlaub and David
Stuffer to view the premises aforesaid. Subsequent having first lawfully
qualified according to law, to discharge the duties of their appointment
with fidelity, are to go upon the premises, and enquire whether it
is necessary to build said bridge and whether it would be too
expensive for the township of Adams to bear the costs of its erec-
tion, and make report of their proceedings hereon to the
next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County
in which report they shall state distinctly that they had
been sworn or affirmed according to law.
