At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace
held at Elizabeth in and for said County, on Tuesday
the 24th day of October A.D. 1882, before the Honorable
Judges of said Court: The petition of divers inhabitants
of the Township of Deepfield in said County read
presented, representing that they labor under great inconvenience for
want of a road or highway to lead from a point on the road through
the farm of Peter DeLogis to the West Creek, to intersect the road
leading to Henry Eckhard's Mill in Carroll Township and therefore
praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration of the
premises appointed Henry Eckhard, James McIlroy and Silatthier
McMillen, to view the ground proposed for said road, who, after
having first given due and legal notice by printed or written word:
bills, of the time and place of meeting, and having been duly
qualified according to law to discharge the duties of their appoint-
ment with fidelity, shall proceed to view the same, and if all said
viewers view the same, and a majority of them agree that there
is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same
as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having
respect to the best ground and the shortest distance, and in such
manner as to do the least injury to private property.

If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating said road,
it is hereby made their duty to obtain from persons through whose
lands the same may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue
to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners
of such lands refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said
viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make reports
thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present.

And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings
herein, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be

held for said County, together with a plot or draft of said road,
 the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
 which the same may pass, also, all releases, and amount of damages
 assessed, if any, and whether they judge the same necessary for
 Public or Private use; and in which report, they shall state,
 distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed according
 to law.

James Mellon and Matthew McMillin Jurors appointed by
said Court do report that having given due and timely notice
of time and place of the meeting of Jurors by three
written advertisements posted up in three most public
places in said Township of Clearfield adjacent to said
road and we the said Jurors having met at time and
place designated in said notices and after first being
all duly sworn according to law we proceeded to the
duties of our appointment and did view mark
and lay out the following for a public road or high
way being beginning at junction of Public road leading from
our Coenrobes Mills to Saint Augustus on farm of
Roselia Fitzgerald in Clearfield Township thence North
Seventy five degrees East twenty four perches North Eighty
nine degrees East five perches South Seventy Eight degrees
East ten perches South Sixty six degrees East twenty perches
South Sixty two degrees East thirty eight perches to
line of land of James Mulligan & others thence by said
line of land South Eighteen and one half degrees East thirty
one perches to post three South Seventy six and one half
degrees East four perches thence South two and one half
degrees East ten perches North seventy nine degrees
East twenty nine perches North Sixty four degrees East

One hundred and twenty perches North sixty one degrees
East twenty eight perches North fifty six and one half
degrees East twenty six perches North seventy seven de-
grees East at fifty perches to private road of Hugh
Hogans thence by said private road North forty six
and one half degrees East at one hundred and twenty
six perches to point on public road leading from Glenn
Cannell to Adams Sanford, a line of land of Sam
Hool and Cannon Kelly all in Blairfield Township
which said several road in our opinion is necessary
and will be convenient to the traveling public
And we do award and assess a damage of fifty
dollars to Roselia Lutzger the other properties ad-
jacent to said road will be benefited by said road
all of which is respectfully Submitted
