Columbia County, ss:

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for said County, before the Honorable Judges of said Court, on Tuesday the seventh day of February, A. D. 1882. The petition of divers inhabitants of Adams Township in said County was presented, representing, that they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, "to lead from the Bedford Road at or near the saw mill of George Eichenschel, to the road from Elton to Wilmore near Lutheran Church, in Adams township" and praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint S. B. Donnyer, Hiram Orris and W. Fleck, to view the ground proposed for said road, who after first having given due and legal notice by printed or written advertisements of the time and place of meeting, of the time and place of meeting, and having been duly qualified according to law to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, shall proceed to view the same, and if all the said viewers view the same, and a majority of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property. If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favour of locating said road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from persons through whose land the same may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such land refuse ~~releasing~~ ^{releasing} their claim for damages, the said viewers shall apportion the damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present, and transmit the same together with all releases, to be filed with the papers relating to said road. And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which the same

papers, in which report they shall state distinctly that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law: and also, whether they judge the same necessary for a Public or Private Road.
