

To The Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County;

We, The undersigned, persons appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report: That having first given notice of the time and place of meeting as required by the act of assembly they met at the steam saw mill of Thomas Griffith in Cambria Township on Monday November 20<sup>th</sup> 1882 for the purpose of performing the duties of their appointment, and having been first duly affirmed they viewed and laid out and do return for private use the following road:

Beginning at saw-mill of Edward Owens in said township, thence North sixteen and one half degrees East, along old road formerly opened and used from said mill, ten rods, thence North forty-three degrees East eighteen rods, thence North sixteen degrees East two rods, thence North forty-five degrees East thirteen rods, thence North two degrees East eight rods to line of Joseph Mack's land, thence North fifty degrees East twenty four rods, thence North forty degrees East sixteen rods, thence North nineteen degrees East four rods, - thence North thirty three degrees East fourteen rods to line of land of David J. Jones, thence still by old road South eighty four degrees East nine rods to a beech, thence through unimproved land

of David I. Jones North Eighty East twenty rods  
to beech, Thence by same North Sixty five degrees East  
ten rods to Spruce, Thence still by same North  
fifty seven degrees East nineteen rods to birch,  
Thence along edge of improved land of same  
North forty two degrees East four rods to bars on  
public road known as Indiana Clay Pike, -  
a plat or draft of which is hereto annexed.

Which said road so as aforesaid laid out  
we are of opinion is necessary for a gravel road.

Witness our hands the twentieth day of November  
A. D. 1882, - And we further report that we endeavored  
to procure a release from D. J. Jones for any damage  
done to his land, that he refused and we assessed his damages  
at \$10. =

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the  
Peace held at Edinburg, in and for said County  
on Monday the fourth day of September A.D.  
1882 before the Honorable Judges of said Court,  
The petition of Edward Owens of said County  
was presented representing that he labours under great inconvenience  
"for want of a private road to lead from the public road, at or  
near Thomas Griffith's saw mill in Cassinia Township and  
running to the saw mill of said petitioner in said Township  
and County" and therefore praying the Court to appoint  
proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law.  
The Court upon due consideration had of the premises appointed A. V.  
Barker Esq. G. J. Lloyd and John W. Hughes to view the ground  
proposed for said road, who after giving due and legal notice of the  
time and place of meeting by printed or written advertisements and  
having been duly qualified according to law shall proceed to view the  
same and if all the said viewers view the same, and a majority of  
them agree that there is occasion for said road, they shall proceed to  
lay out the same as agreeably to the desire of said petitioner as may  
be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest  
distance, and in such manner as to do the least injury to private  
property. If the viewers aforesaid decide in favour of locating said  
road, it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through  
whose lands the road may pass releases from any damages that may  
accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case, where the  
owners of such lands refuse releasing their claims for damages, the  
said viewers shall appraise the damages, if any, and make report  
thereof, signed by a majority of the viewers present and transmit the  
same together with all releases to be filed with the papers relating to  
said road. And the said viewers shall make report of their  
proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held

1 For said County, accompanying me same with a plat a draft  
2 of said road, the courses and distances, and reference to the improve-  
3 ments through which said road may pass, and whether necessary  
4 for Public or Private Use; and in which report they shall state  
5 distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed according  
6 to Law.
