

1 Warren County, N.C.

2 At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace
3 held at Elkensburg in and for said County on the
4 seventh day of August A.D. 1882 before the Honorable
5 Judges of the said Court the petitions of the supervisors
6 and sundry citizens of Suggs township in said
7 County was presented setting forth that a road has long since been
8 laid out from a point on a public road leading from Plattville
9 to New Washington, near residence of Benjamin Goughlin to a
10 point on Public road from Casselton to Clearfield County line to
11 a bridge over land of Oliver Westover in Suggs township in said
12 County has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the in-
13 habitants of said township and praying that the same may be
14 vacated agreeably to the Acts of Assembly in such case made
15 and provided. The Court upon due consideration had of the
16 premises do order and appoint Henry Seaman, David Lloyd and
17 Gideon Bann to view the said road, who after having first given
18 due and legal notice of the time and place of meeting by printed
19 or written advertisements, and having lawfully qualified accord-
20 ing to law to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity
21 shall proceed to view the same, and if all the said viewers view the same and a
22 majority of them agree that said road has become useless, incon-
23 venient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said township they
24 shall proceed to vacate the same and make report of their pro-
25 ceedings hereinto to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held
26 for said County accompanying the same with a field notebook
27 of said road vacated, with reference to the improvements through
28 which the same passes, in which report they shall state distinctly
29 that they had been sworn or affirmed.

We the undersigned Reviewers do report that we gave due and timely notice of time and place of meeting of Reviewers by three written advertisements posted in three public places near road to be located mentioned in the order of Court a copy of said notice being herunto annexed and having met at time and place mentioned in notice and after first all being duly sworn according to law did Review the following parts of said road beginning at a point on Public road leading from Carrolltown to Cherry Tree Borough near Salt Well School House thence by said road to be located South fifty eight and one half degrees East twelve perches South sixty three and one half degrees East fourteen perches North eighty five degrees East twenty nine perches South sixty seven and one half degrees East eighteen perches South seventy six degrees East twelve perches South forty nine degrees East fourteen perches South twenty five degrees East forty six perches South forty five degrees East twenty perches South sixty six degrees East four perches South seventy six degrees East thirty perches South sixty one degrees East eight perches North seventy nine degrees East ten perches East eighteen perches South eighty one degrees East sixteen perches South eighty five and one half degrees East thirty six perches North eighty degrees East thirty two perches North eighty one and one half degrees East fourteen perches North seventy four and one half degrees East sixteen perches North fifty nine degrees East North thirty one and one half degrees East ten perches ^{East} Seventy seven and one half degrees East one hundred and thirty four perches South
