

Cambria County St.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of
the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for
said County, on the Twenty eighth day of
March A. D. 1882 before the Honorable Judges
of said Court

The petition of sundry citizens of Allegheny Township in said
County was presented representing that they and others labor
under great inconvenience on account of the many and very
steep hills on the road leading from the bridge over a branch of
Chest Creek (on the road from Dorset to Carrolltown) to Dorset
many of said hills being very steep and difficult and could
easily be avoided, praying the said Court to appoint proper
persons to view said road and if practicable to lay out a road
which will avoid the said hills

The Court upon due consideration of the premises do
order and appoint Henry Seaman, Simon Gitzinger & Raphael
Krite to view the ground proposed to be vacated and supplied
who after having first given due and legal notice of the time
and place of meeting by printed or written advertisements, and
having been duly qualified according to law to discharge the
duties of their appointment with fidelity shall proceed to view
the same, and if a majority of them agree that there is occa-
sion for said road to be supplied they shall proceed to vacate
and supply the same, as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners
as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road, and
the shortest distance, and in such manner as shall do the
least injury to private property - If the said viewers shall
decide in favor of vacating and supplying said road, it is
hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through
whose land the road may pass release from any damages
that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every

where the owners of such land refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages, if any, and make report thereof signed by a majority of the viewers present and transmit the same, together with all releases, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be filed with the papers relating to said road. And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, accompanying the same with a plot or draft of said road the courses and distances and reference to the improvements through which the same passes; in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law and also whether they judge said road necessary for a Public or a Private Road.

Mr Henry Seaman Senior
Styger and Raphael Hite appointed by virtue of the aforesaid
Order of said Court do report that having gone due and
timely notice by three written advertisements put up in
three most public places along road to be located and sep-
arated and we met at time and place and after all being
sworn according to law we proceeded to the duties of our
appointment and did locate the following parts of said road
Began where line of of Joseph Undermyer and line of Jesse Eckenrode cross
said road thence 1 South fifty one degrees East sixteen perches then
2 South thirty degrees East four perches 3 South nine and one half de-
grees West (Bench No 1 7 degrees elevation) twenty two perches 4 South
twenty two degrees East ten perches 5 South three degrees East
Eight perches 6 South ten degrees West twenty perches 7
South twelve degrees East twenty perches 8 South twenty
four and one half degrees East twenty perches 9 South thirty
two degrees East twenty two perches 10 South forty four
and one half degrees East six perches to a point in old road
near residence of Joseph Boley 1 South seventy three and
one half degrees East six perches to point of Township road leading
to John B Hoffmans 2 South nine and one half degrees East
Eight perches point in old road near Thomas Rosensteels Black
smith shop 3 South twenty five and one half degrees West
(Bench No 2. 7 degrees elevation) twelve perches 4 South

Fifteen degrees West Eight perches 5 South twenty eight
and one half degrees West (Bench No 3, 6 degree Elevation)
Eighteen perches 6 South twenty four degrees West six
perches 7 South five degrees West twenty four perches
(Elevation on this Bench No 4 $7\frac{1}{2}$ degrees 8 North eighty
eight and one half degree East Bench No 5 Elevation 7
degrees twelve perches 9 South sixty three and one half

 $7\frac{1}{2}$ degree Elevation) sixteen perches 2 South eight perches

half degrees East six perches which said hills are unsafe
and dangerous to the public Travel and in our opinion
should be located as burthensome and incumbrance to
the inhabitants thereabouts

South of Bridge over Fishers Run 2 South twenty five degrees West

ches Point in old road on land of Peter Jlich Thence 5
Beginning at Stone-quarry run on land of William Litzger South
sixty seven and one half degrees East fourteen perches to
Stone pile 6 East fourteen perches Point in old road 7
Beginning at Post in old road near ~~Thomas Brown~~ on line of land

of Peter Baartman and Peter Shury three North nine degrees
22 West Ten perches 8 North one degree West thirteen per-
ches Beech 9 North thirty ^{one} degrees East twelve perches Post
10 North thirty seven degrees East Seventeen perches to point
in old road 1 to a point 10 Pm South of School House
to three North one and one half degrees East Seventeen
perches 2 North thirty nine and one half degrees East fourteen
perches to point in old road 3 Beginning at a Point in ^{old road}
North of Thomas Kosmitchs Block Smith Shop three North
forty four and one half degrees West twelve perches to Point

And we further assesse and award a damage to Joseph
Brygle of five dollars also a damage of twenty five
dollars to Peter Schick also a damage of ten dollars
to William Jozern also a damage of fifteen dollars
to Joseph Boley all of which is respectfully submitted
