

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County:

The petition of James B. McDonald respectfully represents: That a public road leading from a point on the Frankstown road at Jacob Singers to a point on the Johnstown & Sculp Level Turnpike at or near the Old Brewery of Oscar Grafe was laid out by order of Court at Term, and a review ordered of said road at June Term 1882; that he will sustain injury and damage thereby if such view of said road is adopted and confirmed by the Court, for the reason that the said proposed road as laid out by the viewers and reviewers would pass through or over one building lot on the line of said road as laid out, and through a house which he has built on said lot, and be a damage to him of five hundred dollars; that he was not notified by the viewers or reviewers of the time and place of meeting of the said viewers or reviewers, nor did he know of the time and place of their meeting or meetings, nor did he know that said proposed road would pass through his house and lot until after he had built his house; nor did said viewers ever come to him or any of him to obtain a release for damages which he might claim for passing over said lot. The petitioner therefore prays the Court to appoint disinterested viewers to view the premises and assess the damage, if any which the petitioner may sustain, or grant a review of said proposed road
