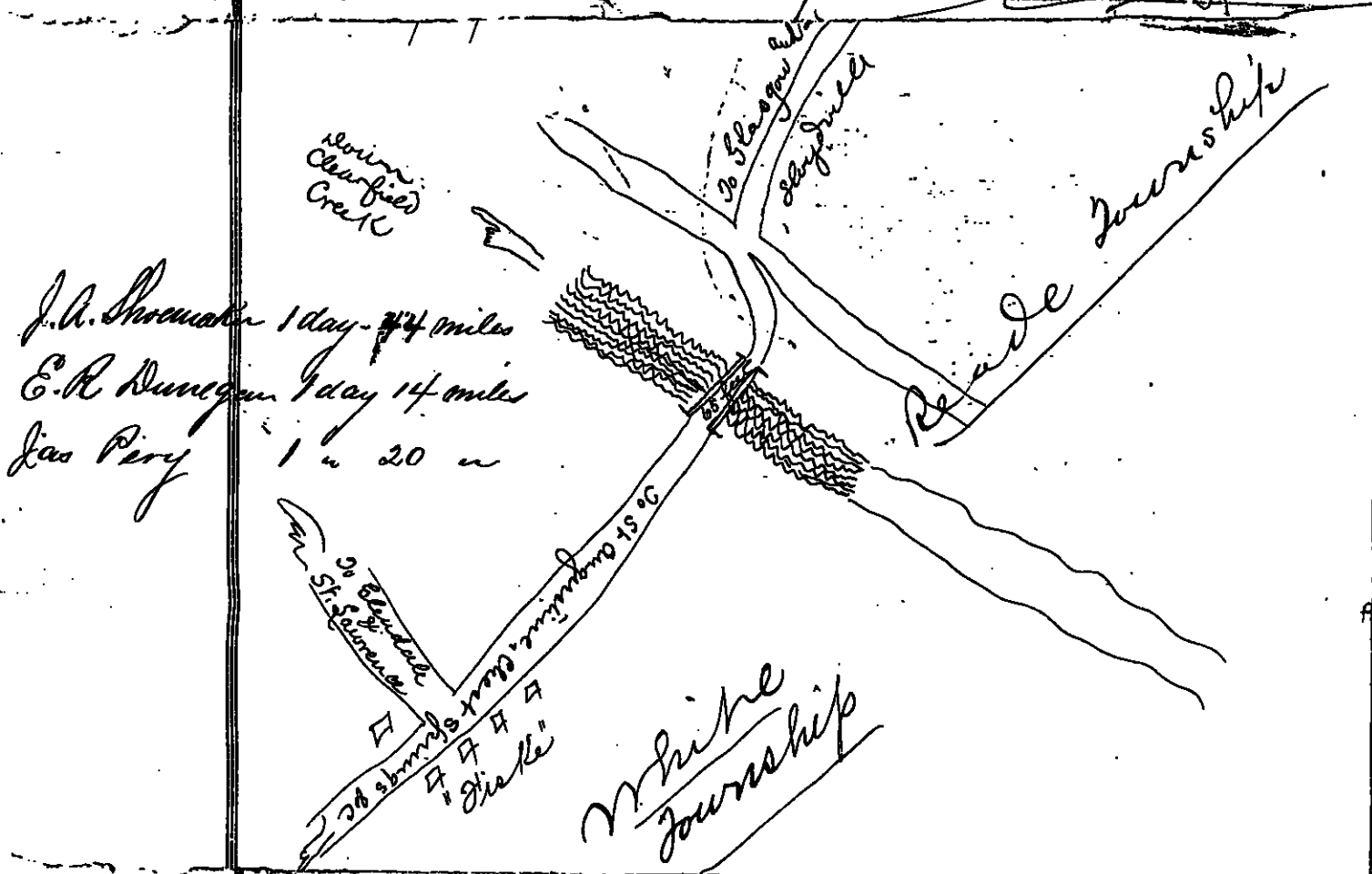

At a Court of General Quarter
Sessions of the Peace held at
Chenango in and for said
County, on Tuesday May 7,
A.D. 1884 before the Honorable

Judge of said Court: The peti-
tion of Sidney Otis of White and Reed Townships
in said County was presented setting forth, "that a new
bridge is much wanted over the Clearfield Creek at the
place where the public highway from Fiske to Glasgow crosses
the said Creek; the creek being the dividing line between said
Townships: the bridge now in use being rendered unsafe
by reason of decay, and ice, and that the expense of erect-
ing said bridge would be too heavy and burdensome upon
the inhabitants of said Townships" and therefore pray-
ing the Court to appoint three persons qualified according
to law to view the place proposed for said bridge, and in-
quire whether such bridge is necessary and would be too ex-
pensive for the said Townships of White and Reed to bear.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises
appointed, J. A. Shoemaker, E. P. Dunagan, and James
Perry, to view the place proposed for said bridge, who after
having first been duly sworn or affirmed according to law
to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity are
to go upon the premises and inquire whether said bridge
is necessary, and whether it would be too expensive for said
Townships to bear the cost of its erection; and make report of
their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Ses-
sions to be held for said County: in which report they shall
state distinctly that they had been sworn or affirmed accord-
ing to law.

Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pa.

The petition of John Campbell, S. M. Davis and Joseph
Hoque, Commissioners of Cambria County, respectfully
represents: That it appearing to your Honorable Court, to the
Grand Jury of the said County and to your petitioners that a
bridge over Clearfield Creek, at the place where the public
road from Fallen Timber to Glasgow crosses said creek,
between White and Reade Townships, was necessary, and
that it would be too expensive for the said Townships
to erect; the same was entered of record, and your petitioners
did procure an estimate as nearly as might be of the money
which would be necessary to erect such bridge; and did pro-
ceed to have such bridge erected by entering into contract with
Michael J. Kirsch of Barr Township in said County to build
the same for the sum of \$995⁰⁰ of which the County of Cambria
is to pay one-half, and the Townships of White and Reade
each one-fourth; that said bridge is to be completed on or
about 30th October, 1884. Your petitioners therefore pray the
Court to appoint fit persons to inspect the said bridge,
and the workmanship thereof, and make report accordingly
to the next Court.
