until it strikes the aforementioned road from St Augustine
to Dysarts mill.) which roads your Petitioners conceive
has become useless inconvenient and burdensome.
Your Petitioners therefore pray the Court that the same
may be vacated and supplied.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions held
at Chambersburg and for said
County on the Eighth day of May
A.D. 1854 before the Honorable Judge
of said Court: The petition of some
dry inhabitants of Clearfield Town-
ship was presented setting forth "That a public road
was formerly laid out by an order of the Court from St.
Augustine to Dyars mill in said County beginning on
the farm of James Gornly in Clearfield Township about
eight rods from the road leading from Chest Springs
into the above mentioned road on said farm (and to be
supplied by running the St. Augustine road into the
Chest Springs road at right angles to Chest Springs
road, and thence along the line between James Gornly
and James Anderson, until it strikes the aforementioned
road from St. Augustine to Dyars mill) which road
your petitioners conceive, has become useless, inconvenient
and burseousome, your petitioners therefore pray the Court
that the same may be vacated and supplied. The Court
upon due consideration had of the premises do order and
appoint N. Scudder, Luke Bebe and J. P. Bryner to
view the ground proposed to be vacated and supplied
who after having first given due and legal notice of the
time and place of meeting by printed or written advertise-
ments and having been duly qualified according to law to
discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity
shall proceed to view the same and if a majority of them
agree that there is occasion for said road to be vacated
and supplied, they shall proceed to vacate and supply the
same as agreeably to the wishes of the petitioners as may

be having respect to the best grounds and the shortest distance and in such a manner as shall do the least injury to private property. If the viewers aforesaid shall decide in favor of locating and supplying said road it is hereby made their duty to obtain from the persons through whose land the road may pass, releases from any damages that may accrue to them from opening the same, and in every case where the owners of such land refuse releasing their claims for damages, the said viewers shall assess the damages if any, and make report thereof, signed by a majority of the viewers present to the next Court of Quarter Sessions and transmit the same with all releases to be filed with the papers relating to said road. And the said viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County accompanying the same with a plot of Draft of said road, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements through which the same passes. In which report they shall state that they have been duly sworn or affirmed, and also whether they judge said road necessary for a public or private road.

Order of Court viz Beginning at a Post in road leading from David
Byzant to Byzant's Mills where line of land of James Caudron
and James Cornely crosses said road thence by said road
North sixty three degrees west twenty four perches thence by road
leading to Chest Springs South Eighty five degrees West twen-
ty six perches Post by same road South Eighty and one half
degrees West seventeen perches Post and supply the same
for a Public road or highway viz Beginning at a Point in
Chest Spring and Byzant road in line of land of James Caudron
and James Cornely thence by said line of land South
Eighty five and one half degrees East forty two perches thence
South thirty four degrees East twelve perches to point in
said road to be supplied and we do further report that
the road as supplied is necessary to accommodate the

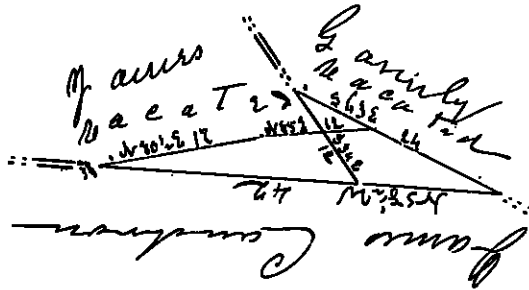
