appointed time and place, and having  
been duly sworn according to law, pro-  
ceeded to perform the duties of our appointment  
We went upon the premises - viewed the site  
for proposed bridge and believe the same  
to be very necessary for the accommodation  
of the public and further believe it would  
be too expensive for said Township to bear  
the expense of its erection, and the prayer  
of the petitioners should be granted.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, held at Ebensburg in and for said County, on the tenth day of September A.D. 1883 before the Honorable Judges of said Court: The petition of sundry citizens of Tusquehanna Township and parts adjacent in said County was presented, representing, that a Bridge is much wanted to be erected over the Tusquehanna River, near the German Meeting House, where the public highway from Carrolltown to Germans Mills and Cherry Tree crosses said river in said Township, that the probable expense of erecting said Bridge would be much greater than the said Township of Tusquehanna could bear, and that the same should be erected by the County, to be kept and maintained as a County Bridge, and praying the Court to appoint Viewers to view the site of the proposed bridge and report the facts to the Court. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, appointed Jacob Kirkpatrick, Henry J. Hopple and J. A. Shoemaker to view the site proposed for said Bridge, who after having first been duly sworn or affirmed according to law, to discharge the duties of their appointment with fidelity, are to go upon the premises, and inquire whether said bridge is necessary, and whether it would be too expensive for said Township to bear the expense of its erection, and make report of their proceedings herein to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, in which report, they shall state distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law.
