

To The Honorable the Judges of The Court  
of Quarter Sessions for the County of Cambria.  
The petition of: H. W. Story, Burgess  
of the Borough of Johnstown, and the  
Town Council of said Borough, respect-  
fully represents that the Town Council  
of said Borough, on the sixteenth day  
of October, one thousand eight hundred  
and eighty three passed the following  
Ordinance, viz: An ordinance defining  
the location and adopting part of the  
Beulah road as a public street of  
the Borough of Johnstown.  
Section I. Be it enacted and ordained  
by the Burgess and Town Council of  
The Borough of Johnstown, and it is  
hereby enacted and ordained by the  
Authority of the same, That the location  
of the Beulah Road, where the same  
crosses the Stonycreek River, is as follows:  
The westerly line thereof beginning at  
the Northwest corner of the lot of  
Joseph Layton, at the intersection of  
Somerset street and Willow Street,  
in the Fifth Ward of the Borough of  
Johnstown, thence north twenty five  
and one half degrees west to the  
southerly line of Stonycreek street, at or  
near its junction with Franklin street,  
in the Fourth Ward of the Borough  
of Johnstown. The easterly line thereof  
beginning at the northerly side of

1 Somerset Street forty feet distant from  
2 the northwest corner of the lot of  
3 Joseph Sayton, in the Fifth Ward  
4 of Johnston Borough, thence north  
5 twenty five and one half degrees  
6 west to the southerly line of Stonecreek  
7 street, in the Fourth Ward of the  
8 Borough of Johnston, forty feet  
9 distant from the westerly line of  
10 said ward.

11 Sec. 2. Said road between said  
12 points forty feet in width, is  
13 hereby declared a public street of  
14 the Borough of Johnston, and  
15 shall be known as Beulah Street,  
16 and all ordinances or parts of ordi-  
17 nances relating to streets in the  
18 Borough of Johnston are hereby  
19 extended to said street.

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The said Council authorized and directed your petitioner to make the necessary application to Court for the appointment of viewers for the assessment and awarding of damages incident to the opening of said street. Your petitioner therefore prays Your Honorable Court to appoint seven disinterested freeholders of said Borough, who, after being duly sworn or affirmed to perform their duties, under the act of Assembly in such case made and provided, with impartiality and fidelity, shall proceed to view the premises described in said ordinance or petition, having regard both to the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said Beulah Road or street, and shall assess and allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages; and who shall also make assessment for contributions upon all such properties as shall be benefited by the opening of said street, such sums respectively as they may have been benefited, over and above and all disadvantages, and the said viewers shall make a report of their proceedings in writing to the next

session of said Court, describing  
the properties upon which assessments  
have been made, specifically stating  
whether for contribution or for damages,  
with the amounts respectively. And,  
as in duty bound, your petitioner  
will ever pray.

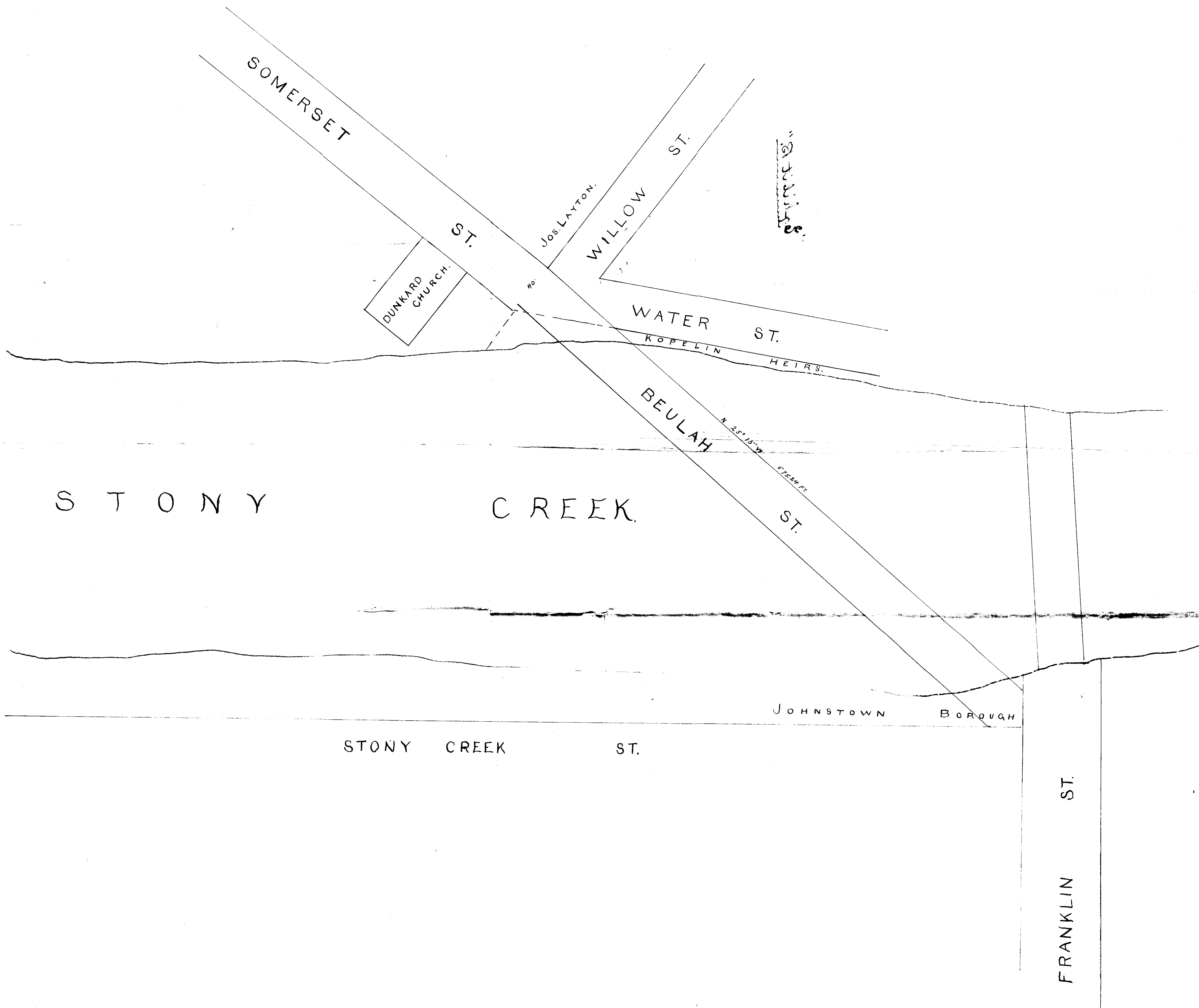

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, held at Ebensburg, in and for said County, on Wednesday the 5<sup>th</sup> day of December A. D. 1883, before the Honorable Judges of said Court: The petitions of H. W. Story, Burgess of the Borough of Johnstown, and the Town Council of said Borough being presented, representing, that the Town Council on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of October A. D. 1883 passed the following Ordinance viz: An Ordinance defining the location and adopting part of the Peulak Road as a Public Street of the Borough of Johnstown.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Johnstown, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, That the location of the Peulak Road, where the same crosses the Stony Creek River is as follows; The westerly line thereof beginning at the northwest corner of the lot of Joseph Layton, at the intersection of Somerset Street and Willow Street, in the Fifth Ward of the Borough of Johnstown, thence north twenty five and one half degrees west to the southerly line of Stony Creek Street at or near its junction with Franklin Street in the Fourth Ward of the Borough of Johnstown. The Easterly line thereof, beginning at the westerly side of Somerset Street, forty feet distant from the northwest corner of the lot of Joseph Layton, in the Fifth Ward of Johnstown Borough, thence north, twenty five and one half degrees west to the southerly line of Stony Creek Street in the Fourth Ward of the Borough of Johnstown, forty feet distant from the westerly line of said ward.

Section 2. Said road between said points forty feet in width, is hereby declared a Public Street of the

Borough of Johnston, and shall be known as "Paulah Street" and all ordinances or parts of ordinances relating to streets in the Borough of Johnston are hereby extended to said Street. Passed finally in Council on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of October A.D. 1883. and approved by the Burgesses October 19<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1883. Said petitioners further representing, the said Council authorized and directed said petitioners to make the necessary applications to Court for the appointment of Viewers, for the assessment and awarding of damages incident to the opening of said Street, and therefore praying the Court to appoint seven disinterested freeholders of said Borough, who after being duly sworn or affirmed to perform their duties, under the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided, with impartiality and fidelity, shall proceed to view the premises described in said Ordinance or petition, having regard both to the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said Paulah Road or Street, and shall assess and allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages: and who shall also make assessments for contributions, upon all such properties as shall be benefitted by the opening of said Street, such sums respectively as they may have been benefitted, over and above all disadvantages, and the said Viewers shall make report of their proceedings herein in writing to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, to be held for said County, describing therein the properties upon which assessments have been made, specifically stating, whether for contributions or for damages, with the amounts respectively. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, appointed David J. Jones, Lewis M. Wolf, James J. McManaghy, Wesley J. Rose, Charles VonLunen,

Emmanuel Young and Valentine Louthen, as Viewers,  
who, after giving due and legal notice of the time and  
place of meeting, shall proceed to view the premises;  
and make a full report of their proceedings as herein  
prayed for, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of  
said County; and in which report, they shall state  
distinctly, that they had been sworn or affirmed  
according to law.
