 Lewisburg for the County of Cambria on the fifth  
 day of April last before the Honorable John Young  
 Esquire President of our said Court and his associates  
 one the Petitioner of Divers Inhabitants of Allegheny  
 Township setting forth that the labour under  
 great inconvenience for want of a public

Road at least way from High Street in the Town of Lewisburg the  
 nearest and best way to intersect the great road leading from the  
 Birmingham County line at the deep gap to Indiana County line  
 at or near the farm of John Bushland as indicated by plan  
 and praying the Court to appoint persons to view the land and  
 lay out the same according to law the Court appoints Lewis  
 McGuire Stephen Lloyd John Glass John Linnison Bernard Little  
 and James Olney to view the ground for the said Road and if they  
 or any one of them see the same and find of the actual  
 view agree the same in execution for the said Road they shall  
 proceed to lay out the same as agreeable to the design of the said  
 petition or in any other manner respecting the best ground  
 for a Road and the shortest distance in such manner  
 as to do the best and try to separate properly as shall make report  
 them of making particularly whether the said the same may  
 -any for a public or private Road together with a plan or  
 Plot or draft thereof and the Course and distance of the same  
 at length and not in figures only and to return to the Court of Quarter Sessions  
 sitting forth the names of those who shall see the same

of building said bridge and allow Thom  
Groye, the builder of said bridge what we  
think is just for the same agreeable  
to a law pass'd the <sup>last</sup> session of the Legisla-  
-ture of Pennsylvania for that purp-  
-ose; And after viewing said bridge  
and taking all considerations into view we  
think it just to allow said Thom Groye  
to be paid the sum of one hundred &  
fifty dollars to be paid by or on  
behalf of said County of Greene by the Commission-

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the peace Held at Evesham on the  
first Monday of September 1819 Before the Justices of the Peace  
petitioners of Peter Lewis good sitting forth that part of the public  
road from the Town of Evesham to the Indiana Camp in which  
lies between the Town of Evesham and the Broad Ford is used  
in common and burdened and praying the Court to appoint proper  
Persons to view the same. The Court appoints Isaac Brackley Shipley  
Priestly Lucy Roberts. John Han Good Samuel Child brand and  
Paul Brinkley and if they or any five of them view the same and  
any four of the actual Viewers then to prepare to locate the same  
or any part thereof they shall make Report Stating particularly what  
part of said Road they may locate together with a plan or draft thereof  
and the courses and distances expressed in words of length and not  
in figures Only to the next Court of Quarter Sessions sitting forth  
the names of those who shall so view the same the said Viewers  
to be sworn agreeably to the acts of Assembly in such case made  
and proceed -

In pursuance of the above order we the Subscribers  
after being duly sworn as the Law directs, have viewed  
the Ground between the Town of Conemaugh and the Broad  
fording and do find the same useless Inconvenient and  
Burdensome and that the same ought to be vacated  
Beginning at the Town of Conemaugh thence north  
twenty eight degrees East thirty three perches, north Sixty  
two degrees west eighteen perches, north thirteen degrees west  
twenty perches, north Sixty degrees west fifty six perches,  
north one hundred and fifty eight perches to the broad  
fording Given under hands the 9th day of October 1819
