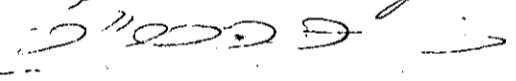



We the undersigned appointed by the judges of the Court
of quarter Sessions of Cambria County to view & private road from
the bridge across Clearfield Creek near Storms Mill, to intersect the great
road from Elders Mill to the north part of Allegany township, after
being sworn according to law, and viewing the grounds for said road
do report it as follows viz. - Beginning at a spruce near Clearfield bridge
thence North, eight degrees East, fifty perches to a Maple, thence North sixty
degrees West fifteen perches to a spruce, thence North twenty four deg-
rees West thirty perches to a beech, thence North seven degrees West sixteen
perches to a Maple, thence North nineteen degrees West sixteen perches to a
spruce, thence North fifteen degrees East twelve perches to a spruce,
thence North twenty degrees East twenty four perches to a spruce
on the road from Elders Mill ^{leading} North. Being in all one hundred & sixty the
perches, which we do report agreeable to the prayer of the petitioners

To the honourable judges of the Court of Common Pleas and quarter sessions in and for the County of Cambria

We the undersigned petitioners inhabitants of Cambria County humbly represent that we labour under serious difficulties and inconveniences for want of a publick road from Lillys Mills in Somerhill Townshipp the nearest and best rout to a point on the Cambria County line at the Summit level between the heads Blains gap run and Bearrock run and then to intersect a road now petitioned for in Bedford county leading from said Summit level to the elk lick near William Dickies farm on the Newry and Johnstown road.

The great and unceasing demand for Stone Coal. White pine wild Cherry and other timbers on the East Side of the Mountain all of which abound more immediately in the vicinity of this road than any yet known, would alone highly justify the making of the afforsaid publick road, but it will also be a road to mill to market and to church for many on both sides of the Mountain.

The distance from Lillys Mills to Newry by the turnpike is 15 miles by way of this road it would not exceed 10 miles the portion of this road lying in Cambria County will not exceed four miles in length.

We therefore pray your honourable body to appoint suitable persons to view and lay out said road as above described and your petitioners will humbly and respectfully pray
