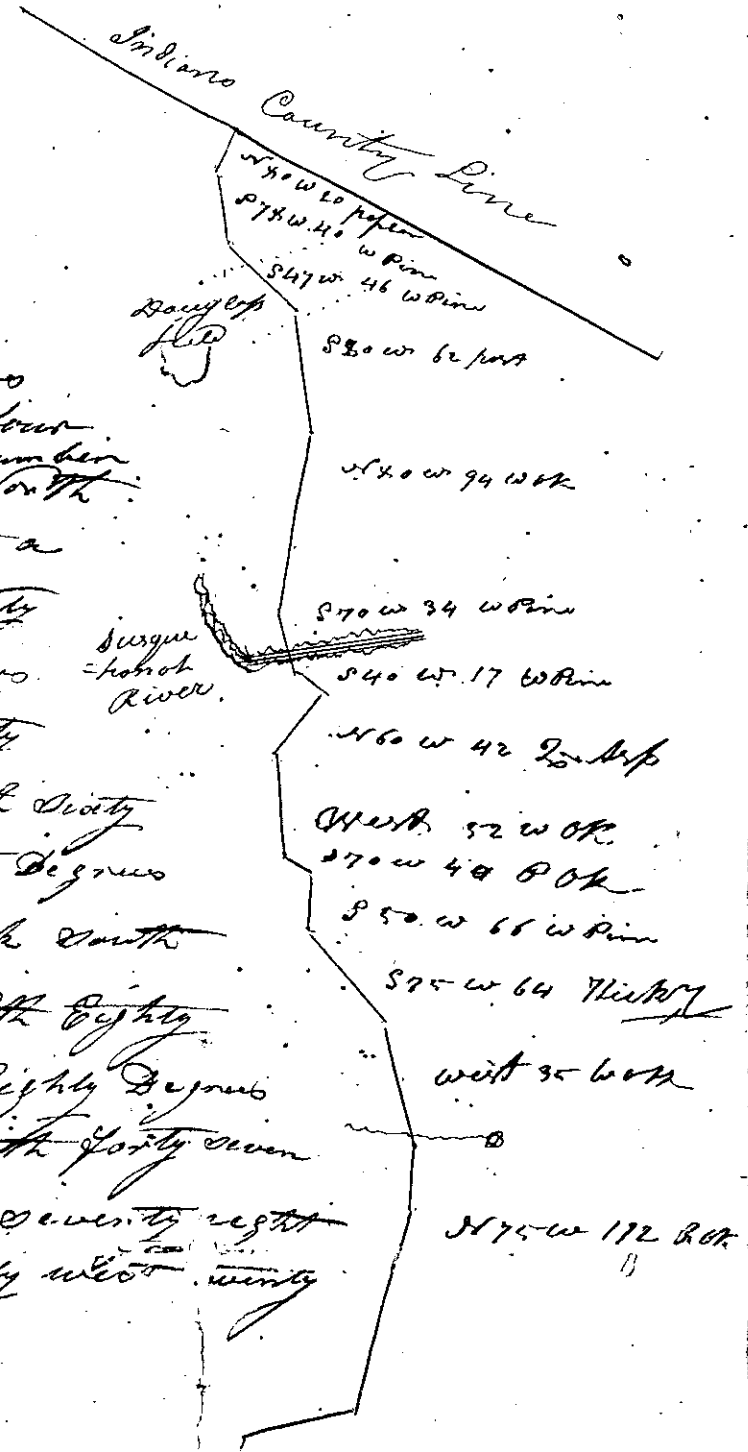

the peace held at the Court house in the Borough  
of Greensburg on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of July in the  
year of our Lord 1829. Before the Honourable  
Judges thereof on the petition of divers inhabitants  
of Susquehanna Township setting forth that they  
labour under great inconvenience for want of a public  
road or cart way from the town Road about five miles  
from the Salt works on the Susquehanna River to the  
town of Indiana County in the improvement of  
said Street a distance of about five or six miles  
and praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay  
out the same according to Law hereinafter the Court appointed  
for Viewers at a Court held on 5<sup>th</sup> day of October A.D. 1829  
David Sumner, John Bender John Byers John McKenna  
Omerius Bender & John Douglass Jurors and on the 6<sup>th</sup> day  
of January A.D. 1830 the said Order of View was renewed & the View  
and lay out the ground for said road and if any part of the said  
Viewers agree there is occasion for such road they shall proceed to  
lay out the same agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may  
be having regard to the best ground for said road and the shortest  
distance in such manner as to do the least injury to private  
property and shall make report thereof stating particularly  
whether they Judge the said necessary together with  
a plan or draft thereof and the courses and distances expressed  
in words at length and with the figures only as is referred  
to the improvement through which it may be safe to the next  
Court of General quarters of the peace of the year and setting forth

labour under great inconvenience for want of a  
private road or east way from the Court House in Cambridge  
to the Indian Township road at Co near the house of  
John Patterson in respect to the House of George Rodgers  
in the said Township and praying the Court to appoint  
proper persons to view & lay out the same according to  
Law whereupon the Court appointed for viewers David Evans,  
David Price John D Jones John Scanlan David Evans,  
and William Price who are to view and lay out the ground  
for said road and if any five of the said viewers agree there is  
to be said road and if any five of the said viewers proceed to lay out the same  
agreeably to the views of the petitioners as may be having  
regard to the best ground for said road and the shortest route  
in which persons be to do the least injury to private property  
and shall make report there of stating particularly whether  
they judge the same necessary together with a plan or  
draft thereof and the course and distances employed in  
whereat length and not by figures only and reference to the  
improvements through which it may pass to the next  
Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace setting  
forth the names of those who may show the same

of Chambersburg on the seventh day of January 1830  
1830 on the Petition of 30 members of the inhabitants  
of Sommerhill township setting forth that a  
Public Road has been ordered to be opened between  
the following points to wit from the Frankstown  
road at or near the place where the road leading  
from Hobbs mill intersects the road leading from  
Croyles Mills to Chambersburg, at or near the place  
where the road leading from the Glensfields of John  
Pitts is fronted as per papers through the Glensfields of John  
located on the other side of said road and that the said  
road is equally good ground and not injurious to the public. They  
therefore pray that a view be granted to locate so much of  
the said road as passes through the Glensfields of John  
Pitts and to lay out another road on  
the ground above described, and praying the court to appoint  
proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law  
whereupon the court appointed for viewers Frederick Dawson  
Egg Michael Dawson, William Gudum, George Emigh  
John Maxwell & Godfrey Knipper Esqs to view the ground around  
said fields for said road if any part of said view is occasioned for  
and any loss of the actual viewers agree there is occasioned for  
said alteration in said road they shall proceed to lay out  
the same agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be  
having regard to the best ground for said road and shall  
make report thereof stating particularly whether they judge

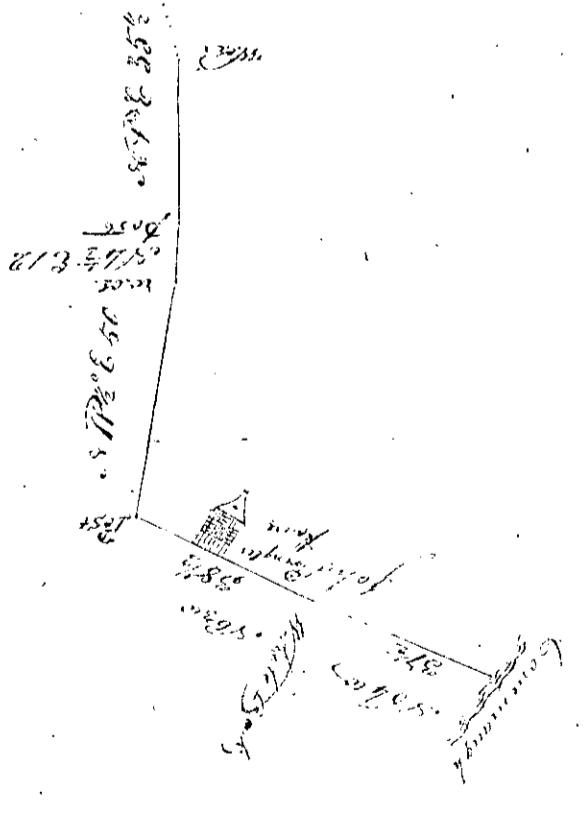

The Humble Remonstrance of the subscribers & Inhabitants of the counties of Cambria & Indiana Most Respectfully Represent-

That whereas your Honourable Court did grant an order of Review of the State road leading from Ebersburgh, to the Borough of Indiana, to Report whether a part of said road were useless and Burdensome, And whereas said Viewers did Report that a part of said road west of John Evans, to the line of Indiana county are Useless and Burdensome, and ought to be Vacated. And if your Honourable Court will adopt, and confirm the said Report, it will render the situation of the subscribers, and the public Grievous, and Embarrassing, having no out let, either Eastward, or Westward, but by forming new Roads of a circuitous Court to the Mudd Turnpike more expensive than the repairing of the old road, as it now is. The Viewers were taken from the settlers who live in the Vicinity of the Stone Turnpike, and to say the least, had not much feeling for our situation. Your Remonstrants. Therefore Pray that your Honourable Court will take into consideration and grant us relief in the premises, by leaving the said State Road permanent as usual, And your Remonstrants shall as in duty bound ever pray.
