on the thirtieth day of June A.D. 1835 before the Judges of the same

Upon the petition of sundry Inhabitants of Clearfield township
in the said county setting forth that they labor under great inconve-
nience for want of a Public road from Walters ~~Mill~~ and Turner's
Saw Mill in said township to the Bell's Mill road at Edwards
Shoemakers and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons
to view and lay out the same according to law: Where upon the Court
upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint David
Lukens Richard J. Pondfoot Thomas Lilly Henry Krise James Mc
Dermitt (of Meck) and James Mc Dermitt (of John) who after being
respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment
with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the grounds for said road; &
if they, or any five of them view the same, and do any four of the actual views
agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the
same, as agreeable to the desire of the Petitioners as may be, having respect
to the best grounds for a road, and the shortest distance, in such a manner
as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report there-
of, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a Public or
private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and
distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass,
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said county.

sworn or affirmed according to law

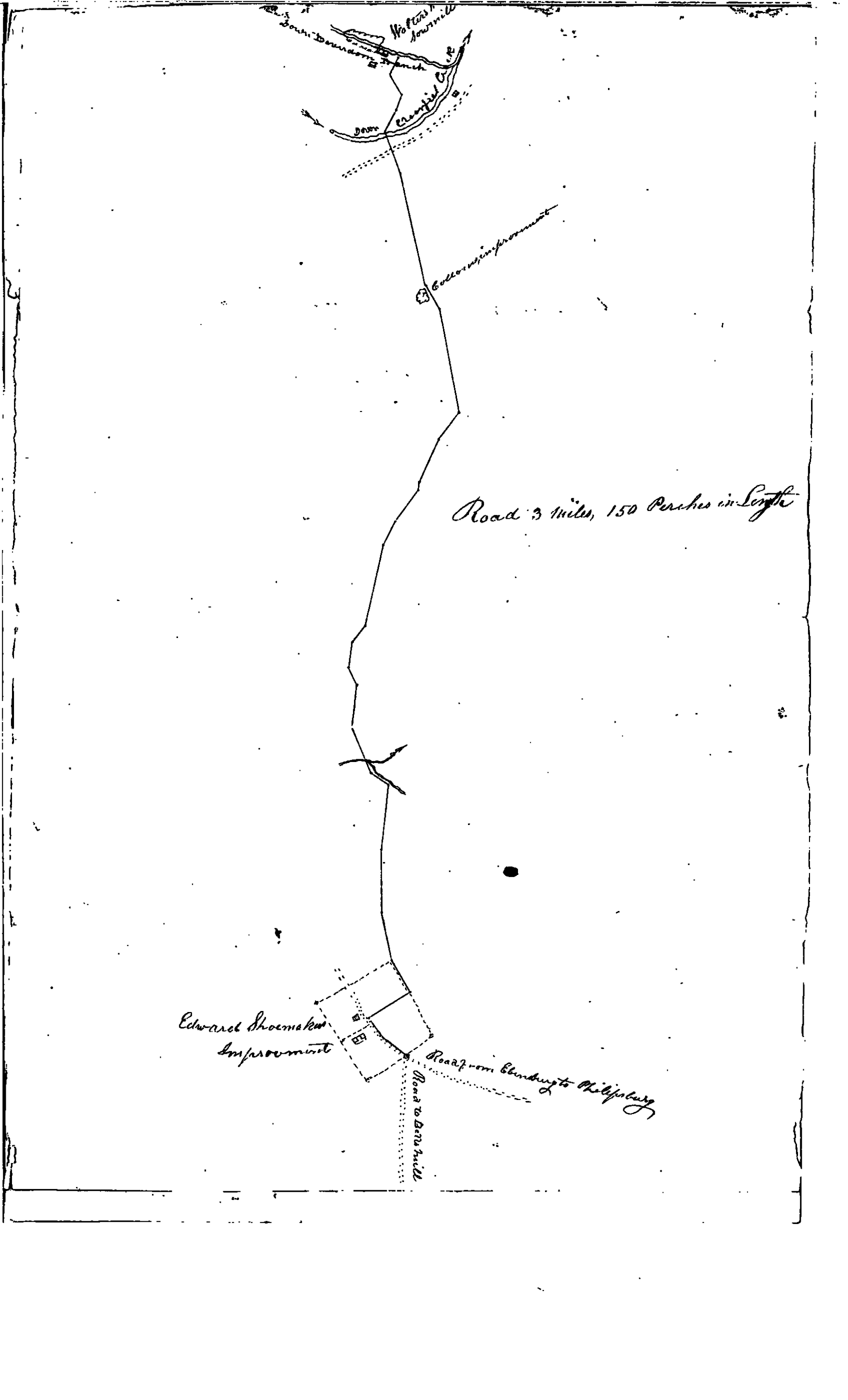

At a court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Chambersburg this in and for the said County on the fourth day of April A.D. 1835 before the Judges of the same Court upon the Petition of sundry inhabitants of the Township of Summerhill in the said County, setting forth that they labour under great inconveniences for want of a Road to lead from the public Road leading from Chambersburg to Jefferson at the end of Goefray Sillmeyer lane, the best and nearest way to ~~cross~~ ^{ascend} the public Road at or near the School house in the farm of ~~William~~ ^{William} Pungles in said Township, they therefore pray the honorable Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to Law; Whereupon the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint William Hudson, Thomas Crayle, Abraham Kinneffer, Cornelius Brown, Fleetwood Benson, Esqrs. and Joseph Bugorn, Esqrs. who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the Ground proposed for said Road; and if they or any five of them view the same, and any four of the actual Viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be having respect to the best ground for a Road, and the shortest distance, in such a manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make Report thereof stating particularly whether they judge this same necessary for a private Road, together with a Plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and reference to the improvements, through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for the said County, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to Law

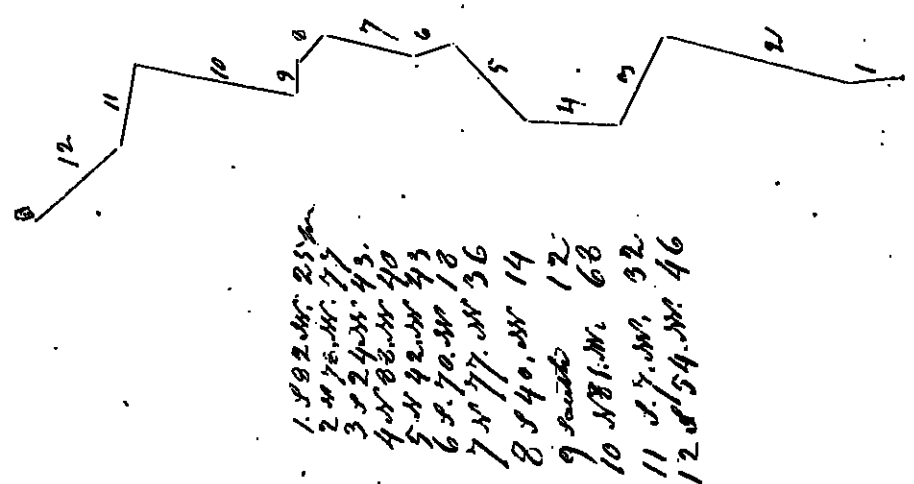

We, the persons appointed by the within order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned (after being sworn) do report, that in pursuance of the said order we have viewed and laid out, and do return for private use the following road, to wit: Beginning at the publick Road leading from Elmstony to Jefferson at the End of Godfrey Settemoyers lane thence South Eighty two degrees west twenty five perches to a post in Settemoyers lane thence North Seventy Eight degrees west Seventy seven perches to post thence South Twenty four degrees west forty three perches to a post thence North Eighty eight degrees west through Jacob Emighs improvement forty perches to a post thence North forty two degrees west forty three perches to a post thence South Seventy degrees west Eighteen perches to Hickory thence North Seventy seven degrees west thirty six perches to sugar tree thence South fifty degrees west fourteen perches to sugar tree thence South Twelve perches to a bush thence North Eighty one degrees west sixty Eight perches through John Wilcocks improvement thence South seven degrees West thirty two perches to post thence South fifty four degrees West through Martin Pringles improvement forty six perches to the School house - a plat or draft whereof is here to annexed. At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Cambria held at Obensburg in and for said County on the fourth day of April A.D. 1850 before the Judges of the same Court.

Upon the Petition of sundry Inhabitants of the Township of Allegheny in said County, setting forth that they labour under great inconvenience for want of a road or highway, from a point of the Road leading from Loretto to Philipsburg at or near Charles Bradley's farm, to a point between the farm of Michael L. McGuire and Henry J. McGuire Saw-mill on the Road leading from Loretto to Storms Mills, and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law, whereupon the Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Simon Neakland, John Storm, William Frazer, Richard Scanlan, Christian Beaman, and James Magehan who after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for the said road, and if they, or any five of them, view the same, and any four of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeable to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect to the best ground for a road and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property, and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they Judge the same necessary for a Public or private road, together with a plot or map thereof, and the course and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions, to be held for said County, in which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

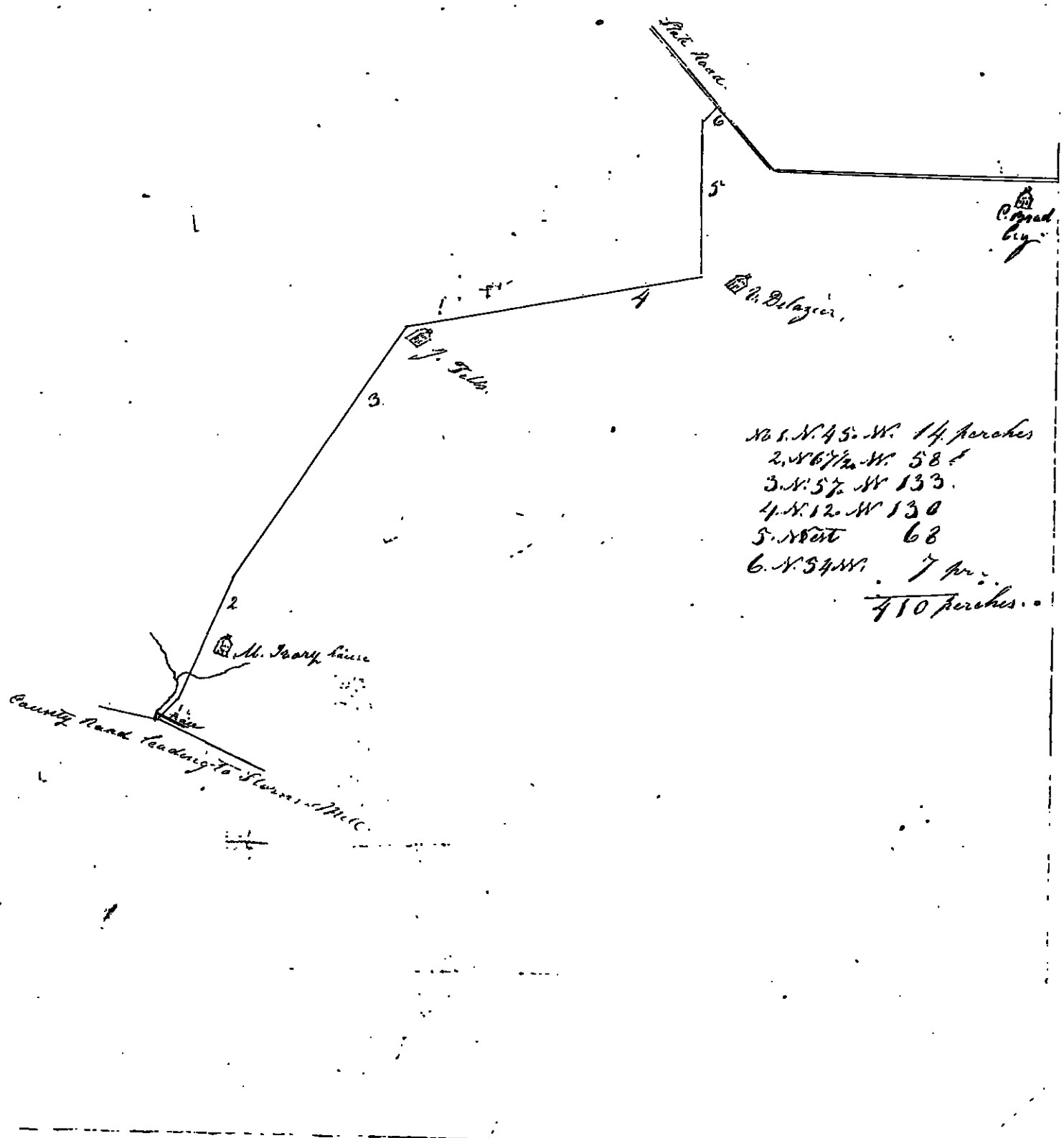
