TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT:-

The petition of the undersigned citizens of the Township of Reade, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:-

That on the 5th day of December, A. D. 1910, a petition of certain of the inhabitants of Reade Township was presented to this Honorable Court, praying for the appointment of viewers to open and lay out a public road in the said Township of Reade, described as follows:-

"Beginning at a point on the road at or near the property of Jerry Sheehan on the public road leading from Blandburg to Lloyds-ville, thence through land belonging to James Lamb North thirty-two degrees East one hundred and seventy two feet to H. Brown's land, thence through H. Brown's land North fifteen degrees West one hundred and Eighty six feet, thence North Nineteen degrees West Three hundred and thirteen feet, thence North Twenty eight degrees West one hundred and ninety six feet, thence North eight degrees West three hundred and sixty three feet, thence North seven degrees West seven hundred and twenty eight feet, thence North five degrees West Five hundred and eighty six feet, thence North twenty eight degrees West six hundred and sixty five feet, thence North twenty six degrees West one hundred and eighty two feet, thence North eighty and one-half degrees West two hundred and fifty seven feet to a point (near the property of Samuel Bowman) on the public road leading from Blandburg to Mountaindale."

That on the 5th day of December, A. D. 1910, J. Leard Elder,

Patrick McHugh and Robert Richardson were appointed by this Honorable Court as viewers to pass upon the necessity of said road, and on the 6th day of March, A. D. 1911, they made their Return finding in favor of said road, which report was approved on the 6th day of March, A. D. 1911, and the report was confirmed June 26, 1911.

The undersigned petitioners, who are residents and electors in the Township of Reade, and who have considered the expense incident to the opening of the new road, the damages assessed by the viewers, the burden of maintaining the road and the further fact that there are other public roads running parallel therewith sufficient to accommodate the travelling public, respectfully pray, that the portion of the road hereinbefore described, lying between the alley which adjoins the property of Elmer Edmison and Charley Brown, and leading North to the point ending at a post in the public road, which leads from Blandburg to Mountindale, be vacated, and for that purpose that this Honorable Court appoint persons, properly qualified, to view the ground and make a report of their proceedings at the next term of Court.

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions
of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, Pennsylvania, appointed by your Honorable Court upon the attached order of Court for the purpose therein specified, respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and the supervisors of the township of Reade, by having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal points of the piece of road to be viewed and in the vicinity thereof. Two of us met in accordance with the notices so given and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our ability, we proceeded to view the ground proposed for the road and are of the opinion that there is no necessity for the piece of road as described in the attached order and therefore recommend that the same be vacated.

The piece of road suggested to be vacated takes the following courses and distances as shown on the plot or draft hereto attached and made a part of this report: Beginning at a point in the alley which adjoins the properties of Elmer Edmison and Charley Brown, and running thence North seven degrees West six hundred ninety two feet, thence North five degrees West five hundred eighty six feet, thence North twenty eight degrees West six hundred sixty five feet, thence North twenty six degrees West one hundred eighty two feet, thence North eighty and one half degrees West two hundred fifty-seven feet

seven feet to a post in the public road leading from Blandburg to Mountindale, being wholly in the township of Reade, Cambria County Penn'a. In our opinion said piece of road is so located as to be of little use to the public and is not necessary for a public road and therefore we suggest that the same be vacated.

John E. Ritter and Philip Cauffiel

viewers, to view the ground proposed ^{to be vacated} ~~for a road~~ and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ^{vacate} ~~lay out~~ the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
