

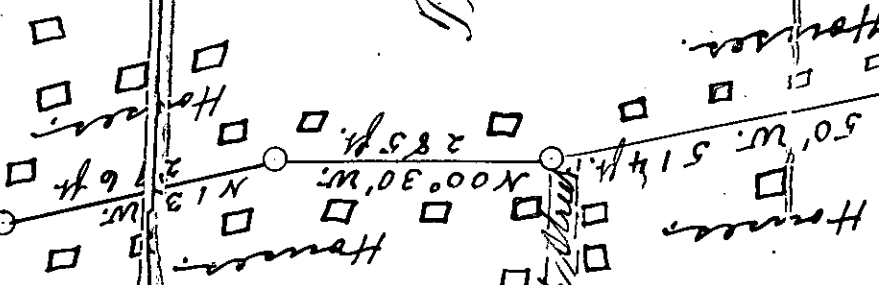

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, Stanley

Jochimovics, and Wm. Shirelon's

Both of the Township of Croyle, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, are held and firmly bound unto the County of Cambria, aforesaid, in the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, lawful money of the United States, to be paid to the said County of Cambria, to which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, and every of them firmly by these presents.

Sealed and dated the 27 day of October, 1914.

Whereas, John Yocomovitz, and John Retunick have presented a petition to the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania, praying for the appointment of viewers to view and locate the above mentioned road beginning at the western terminus of Luke Street in the Borough of South Fork, a public road in said Township of Croyle and ending at the Jackson Road, a public road, likewise located in the said Township of Croyle and whereas, the said Court has appointed viewers for the purpose aforesaid;

NOW THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH That if the above bounden Stanley Jochimovics and Wm. Shirelon's, their heirs, executors or administrators or any of them shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Cambria County a sufficient sum to pay for the purpose of viewing the above mentioned road, if the Court shall so direct, when the same is concluded, then this obligation to be void, or else

to remain in full force and effect.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable the Judges of the Course of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable court upon the attached order, for the purpose therein specified, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria County and to the Supervisors of the Township of Croyle, by having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printer hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places in the vicinity of the proposed new road; and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment impartially and to the best of our judgment, skill and ability: All of us met at the time and place appointed and having gone over the situation carefully, we are of the opinion that only a portion of the road as petitioned for is necessary for the accomodation and convenience either of those residing in the immediate vicinity of the road petitioned to be laid out and opened for public use or for the traveling public; therefore we recommend that a public road, to lead from the South Fork Borough terminus of Luke Street for the following courses and distances, viz: North 12 degrees 50 minutes West 514 feet, North 30 minutes West 285 feet, North 13 degrees West 296 feet, North 17 degrees 30 minutes East 274 feet, to a point opposite the Bolish Catholic Cemetery, is necessary for the convenience and accomodation of a great many citizens of the township and should be opened and maintained as a public thoroughfare: said piece of road is designated on the attached draft as lying between points marked "A" and "B":

but that portion of the road petitioned for, which lies between the points marked "B" and "C" on the plot or draft hereto attached and made a part of this report, is not necessary for a public thoroughfare and if opened would be of little use and would be burdensome to the taxpayers of the township to construct and to maintain. Said point of ending as noted on the petition and order to view is situate North 23 degrees 5 minutes West from point "B" on the attached draft, on the public road leading from Mineral Point to Summerhill. To the Honorables, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions in
and for Cambria County, Pennsylvania:-

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the said
Township of Croyle respectfully represent:

That your petitioners labor under great inconvenience for
want of a public road or highway in the said Township of Croyle,
to begin at the South Fork Borough terminus of Luke Street, and ex-
tending thence in a Northerly direction to a point on the Jackson
Road in said Township of Croyle, the length of said proposed road
being approximately four thousand and fifty (4050) feet;

The exact distance of the beginning of such road at the
western boundary line of South Fork Borough is 175 feet from the
intersection of said Luke Street, in said Borough, with Portage
Avenue a public thoroughfare in the Borough of South Fork; and the
exact distance of the western terminus of said proposed road on the
Jackson Road in Croyle Township, a public thoroughfare, is two
thousand six hundred and forty (2640) feet westerly from the thor-
oughfare to Summerhill Borough, a public road, which intersects
said Jackson Road.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Honorable Court to

to law.
