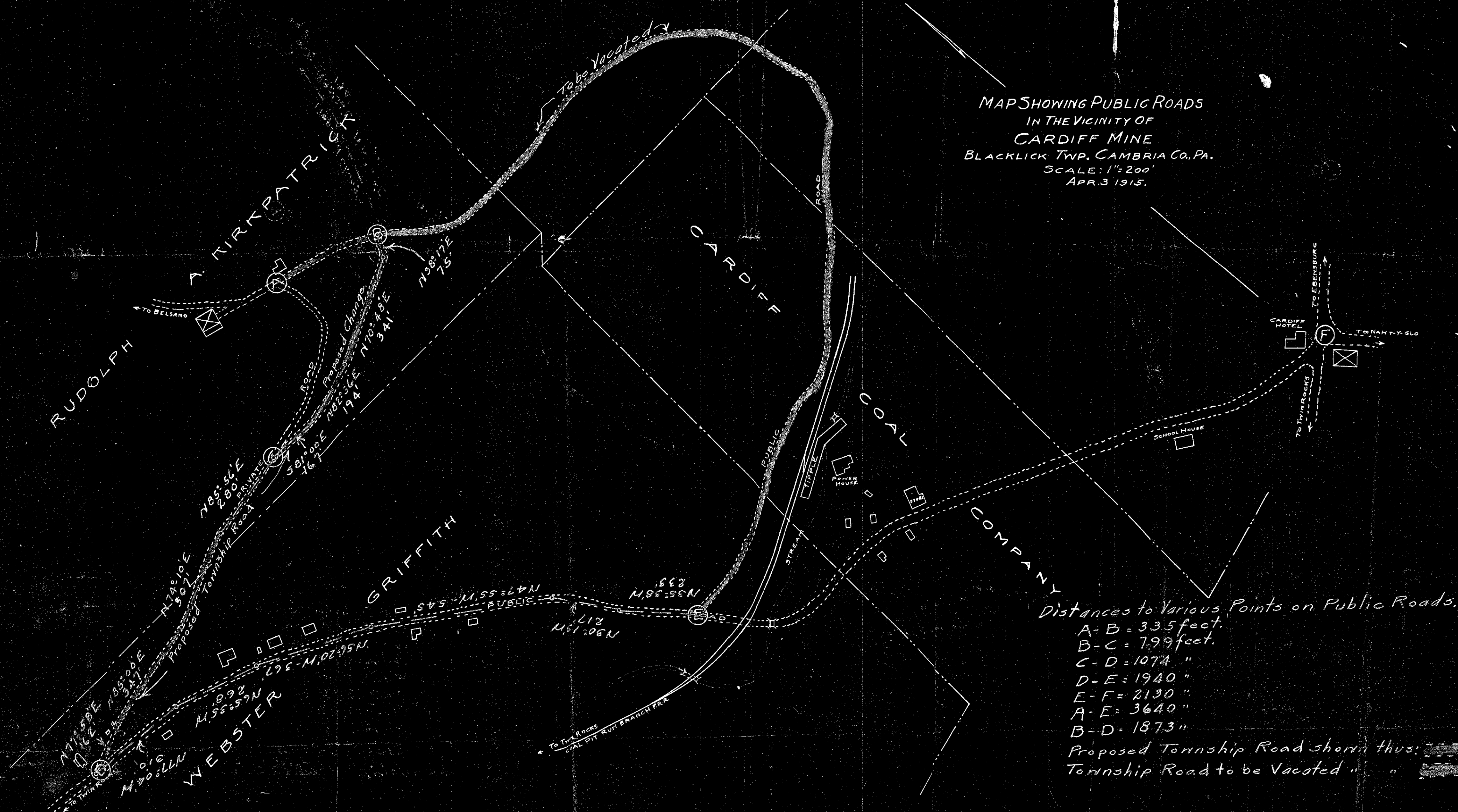



AND NOW Oct 19<sup>th</sup> 1915, the within Petition having been read and considered, and it appeared that due notice has been given to the Commissioners of Cambria County, Pennsylvania, the Court upon due consideration of all the matters set forth in said Petition, do order and decree that the change and alteration in the road leading from Nant-y-Glo to Belsano in the Township of Blacklick, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, be made as prayed for in the within Petition without the formality of a view, and such changes and new location of said road are hereby approved by the Court, and hereafter shall be taken and deemed to be the public road to all intents and purposes, and the old location shall be taken and deemed to be vacated, and the Prothonotary is hereby directed to give proper notice to the Highway Department of the State of Pennsylvania, as required by law.

PETITION OF THE SUPERVISORS OF BLACK LICK TOWNSHIP FOR CHANGE AND ALTERATION IN ROAD LEADING FROM NANT-Y-GLO TO BELSANO

P E T I T I O N

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF THE COURT OF QUARTER  
SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA:

The Petition of the undersigned, Walter Edwards, John Cunningham and Albert Hinds, respectfully represents that they are the Supervisors of Blacklick Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

THAT a road leading from the village of Nant-y-Glo in Blacklick Township to the village of Belsano, also in said Township, is located its entire length and distance in the said Township of Blacklick.

THAT a portion of said road, as hereinafter described, has become inconvenient and burdensome, and that an alteration of the same can be made so that the cost of up-keep of the road will be less, and a better and more satisfactory road obtained between the said village of Nant-y-Glo and said village of Belsano in the Township of Blacklick.

THAT your Petitioners at a meeting duly held passed a resolution authorizing proceedings to change and alter said road, provided the owners of the properties effected by such change would agree thereto, and provided further that the Court should approve such change without a view.

THAT the proposed change and alteration of said road is to be made as follows, towit:

THAT the portion of the road leading from Nant-y-Glo to Belsano shall be vacated between the following points towit:

Beginning at a point marked "E" on said map (which is hereto attached and made a part hereof) which is located in the direction of Belsano from Nant-y-Glo a distance of two thousand one hundred and thirty feet from the intersection of said road by the road leading from Twin Rocks to Ebensburg, and from said point "E" on said map in the direction of the village of Belsano a distance of three thousand three hundred five feet to a point marked "B" which is located a total distance of five thousand four hundred thirty-five feet in the direction of Belsano from Nant-y-Glo from the point where the said road is intersected by the road leading from Twin Rocks to Ebensburg near the Cardiff Hotel.

THAT the said vacated portion shall be supplied as follows:

BEGINNING at a point marked "E" on the map or plan hereto attached, which said point is located on the road leading from Nant-y-Glo to Twin Rocks at a point two thousand one hundred and thirty feet in the direction of Twin Rocks from Nant-y-Glo from the point where said road is intersected by the road leading from Twin Rocks to Ebensburg near the Cardiff Hotel, thence along and over the said road leading from Nant-y-Glo to Twin Rocks the following six (6) courses and distances, to-wit:

North thirty-five degrees thirty-eight minutes West two hundred thirty-three feet to a post, thence North thirty degrees nineteen minutes West two hundred seventeen feet to a post, thence North forty-seven degrees fifty-five minutes West five hundred forty-five feet to a post, thence North fifty-six degrees twenty minutes West three hundred sixty-seven feet to a post, thence North sixty-five degrees thirty-five minutes West two hundred sixty-eight feet to a post, and thence North seventy-seven degrees four minutes West three

hundred ten feet to a post, thence through land of Webster Griffith and Rudolph Kirkpatrick over new part of said road, as proposed, the following eight courses and distances, to-wit:

North seventy-seven degrees fifty-eight minutes East one hundred sixty-two feet to a post, thence North eighty-five degrees East three hundred forty-seven feet to a post, thence North seventy-four degrees ten minutes East three hundred seven feet to a post, thence North eighty-five degrees fifty-six minutes East two hundred eighty feet to a post, thence South eighty-one degrees East one hundred sixty-seven feet to a post, thence North eighty-two degrees fifty-six minutes East one hundred ninety-four feet to a post, thence North seventy degrees forty-eight minutes East three hundred forty-one feet to a post, thence North thirty-eight degrees seventeen minutes East seventy-five feet to a point "B" on the said map, marked and designated above as the point to which a portion of the said road leading from Nant-y-Glo to Belsano should be vacated. The said new portion of said road to have a width of thirty feet.

THAT the owners of the property effected by such change are Webster Griffith, ~~Cardiff Coal Company~~, <sup>TUNNEL COALING CO.</sup> and Rudolph A. Kirkpatrick.

THAT the said Webster Griffith, ~~Cardiff Coal Company~~, <sup>TUNNEL COALING CO.</sup> and Rudolph A. Kirkpatrick, have all agreed to the proposed change and alteration of said road as appears by their joining in this Petition to the Court asking for the confirmation of such proposed change and alteration.

THAT the total cost to the Township and the cost and expenses including damages in said change will not exceed the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300).

THAT your Petitioners, therefore, pray the Court to authorize and direct a change and alteration of said road leading from

Nant-y-Glo to Belsano in the manner as herein prayed for, without the formality of a view as provided by Act of Assembly.

AND they will ever pray, etc.
