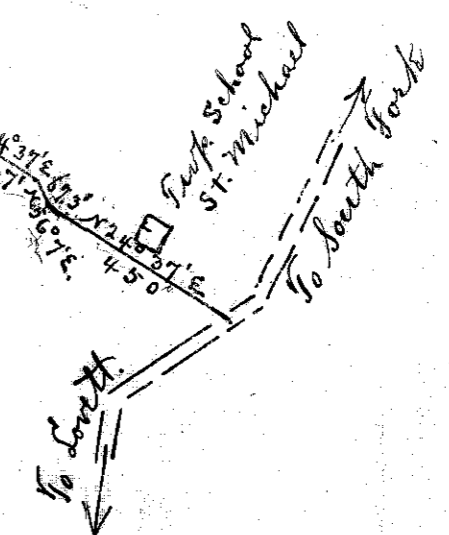
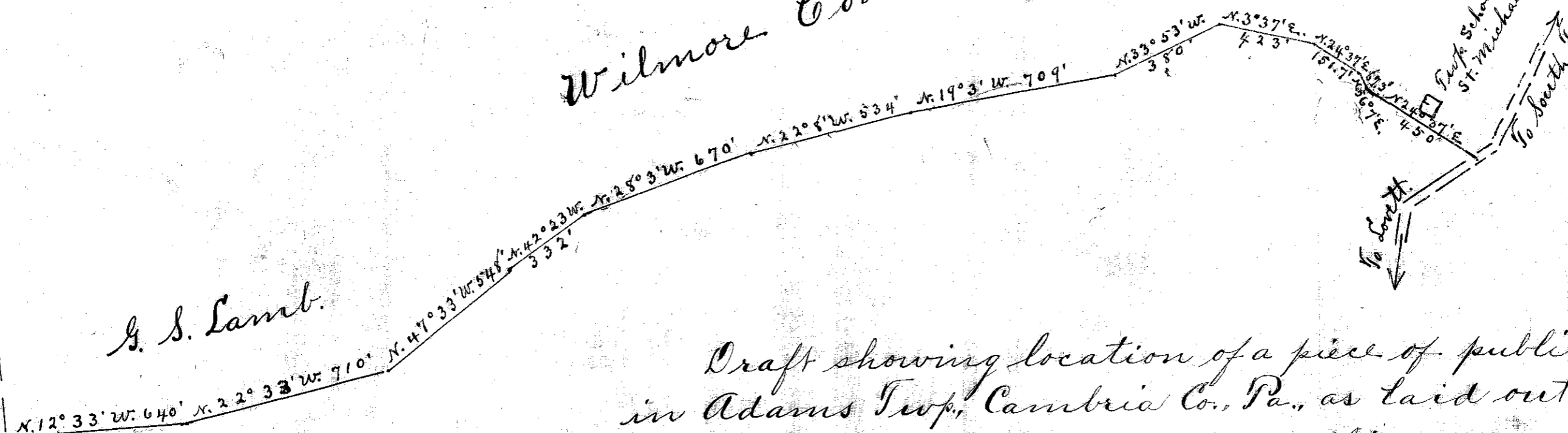
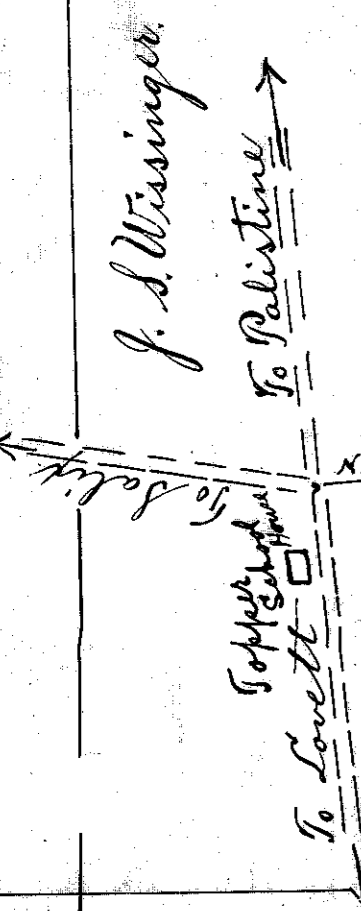

Draft showing location of a piece of public road in Adams Twp., Cambria Co., Pa., as laid out and recommended to be opened for public use.

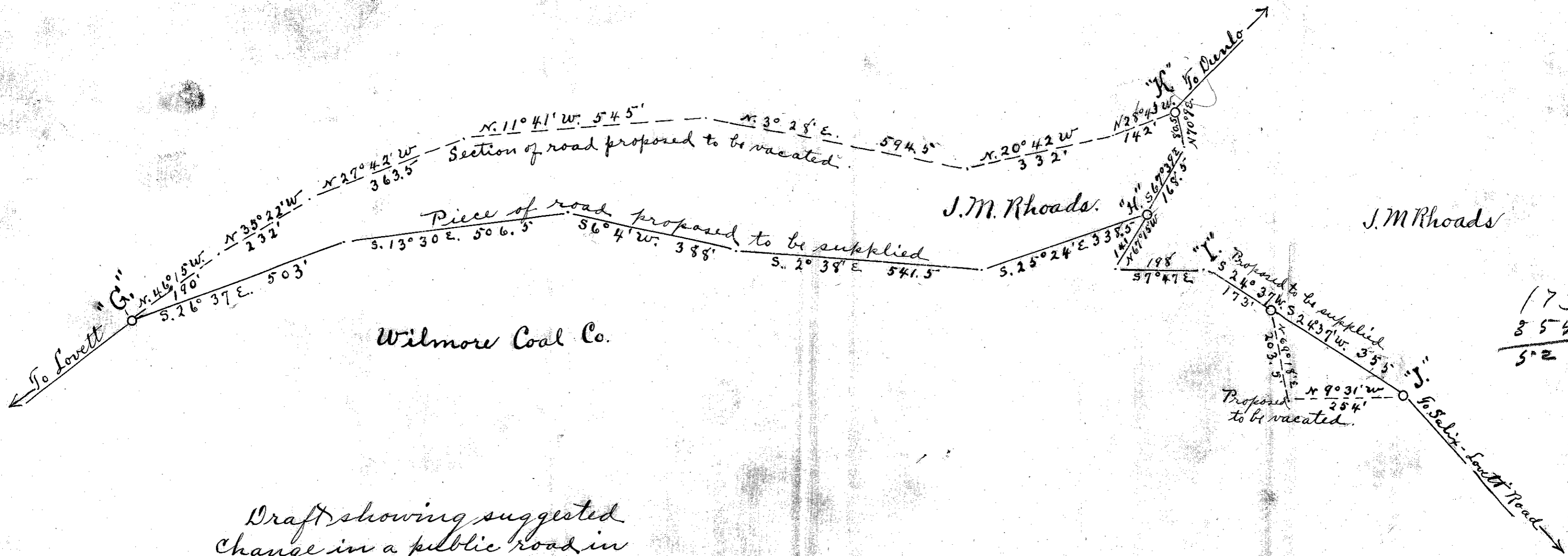

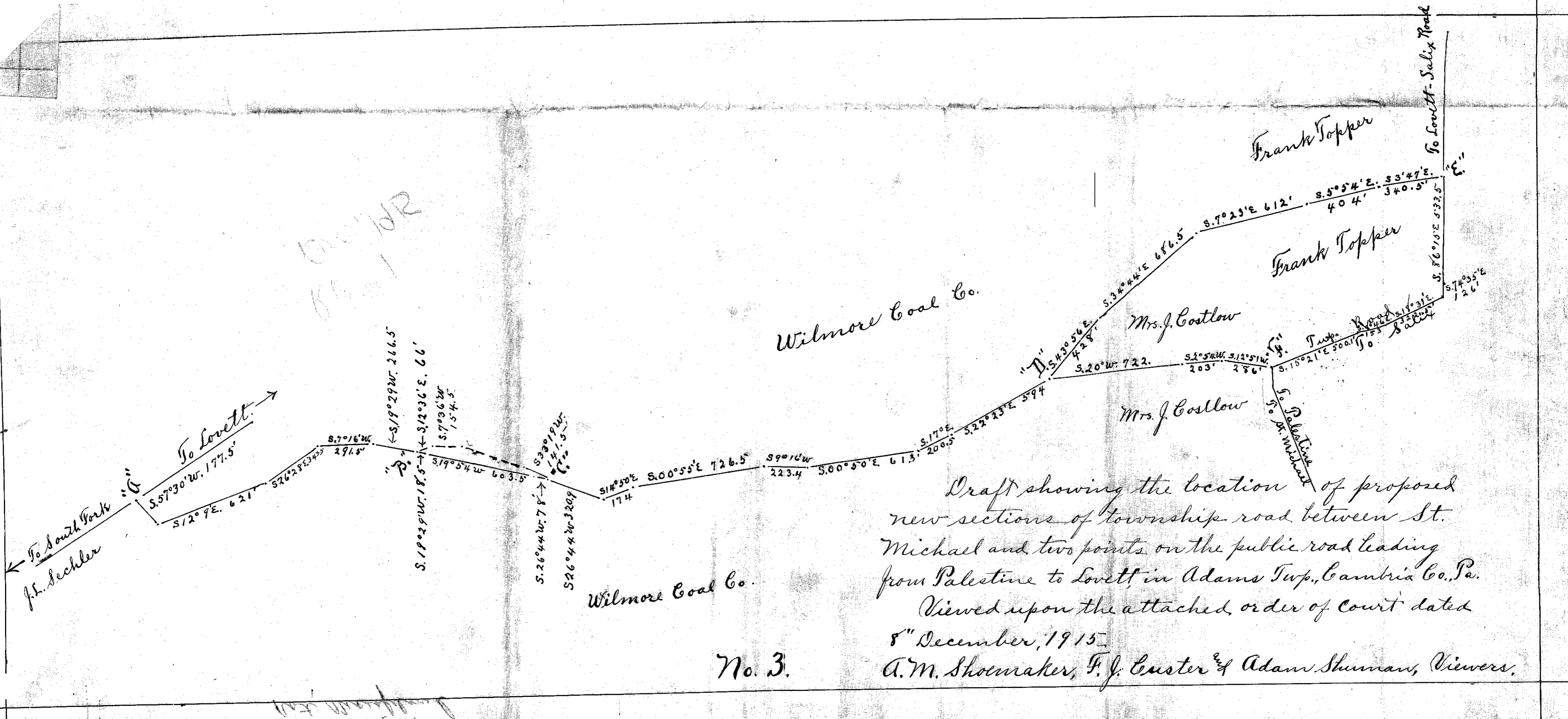


Public School St. Michael

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of December A. D. 1915, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Adams, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, ~~to be laid out~~ and hereinafter set forth;

First: That the road laid out by the Viewers and entered to No. 1, September Sessions, 1914, (Road Docket Vol. 5 at page 393) which begins at a point on the public road leading from the Village of Lovett to the Village of Palestine near the Topper School House and extending a distance of about one mile to a point near a brick School House in the Village of St. Michael, which road so recommended has not yet been opened, should be vacated.

Second. That a road beginning at a point on the road leading from South Fork to Lovett in the Village of St. Michael where the street running past Hice's Hotel intersects the same indicated on the blue print hereto attached and made a part of this petition by the letter A"; thence extending South 57 degrees 30 minutes West 177.5 feet to a post; thence twelve degrees 9 minutes East 621 feet to a post; thence South 26 degrees 28 minutes East 343.5 feet to a post; thence South 7 degrees 16 minutes East 291.5 feet to a post; thence South 19 degrees 29 minutes West 266.5 to a post; at a point indicated on the blue print by the letter

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint A. M. Shoemaker surveyor, and Fred J. Cyster and Adam Shuman

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

R E P O R T N O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of  
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of said county, appointed by your honorable court, respectfully report:-

That, having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers; to the Commissioners of Cambria County, to the Supervisors of the township of Adams and to the Wilmore Coal Co., by having them accept service of notices hereto attached; and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal points of the roads to be viewed: and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability: we met in accordance with the notices so given and after having carefully viewed the premises, are of the opinion:

First. That that section or piece of road beginning at a point on the public road near the Topper School House and extending Northward to a point on the public road leading from South Fork to Lovett near the brick school house in the Village of St. Michael- referred to in section "First" of the petition, and more definitely and clearly indicated on draft No. 1., hereto attached; is necessary for the convenience and accommodation of the citizens of Adams township and the traveling public generally, and should not be vacated.

Second. That the prayer of the petitioners with reference to vacating a piece of public road between Lovett and Dunlo and a small section of the road leading from the Lovett-Salix road to the Lovett-Dunlo road and supplying instead thereof other pieces of road between points on the same roads, as indicated on draft No. 2., hereto attached, should be granted.

Third. That the prayer of the petitioners; with reference to the vacating and supplying of various sections or pieces of public road or roads between a point on the South Fork-Lovett road, in the village of St Michael to two points on the road leading from Palestine to Lovett and more definitely and accurately indicated on draft or sketch No. 3., hereto attached; should not be granted.

Petitioners also ask for a section of road beginning at a point indicated on the blue print by the letter "B" in the road ~~described~~ described in the preceding paragraph; thence South 20 degrees West 722 feet to a post; thence South 2 degrees 54 minutes West 203 feet to a post; thence South 12 degrees 51 minutes West 286 feet to a point in the public road leading from Lovett to Palestine, which is the end of a section of road hereby prayed for and is indicated on the blue print by the letter "F".

Fourth. And also ask that that section of the road shown by the blue prints and indicated by courses and distances between the points "G" and "K" be vacated when supplied by the proposed new road. And also that those sections of old road leading to Salix indicated on the blue print between the letters "I" and "J" which is not covered by the line of the proposed new road be vacated when supplied by the proposed new road between said points.

The piece of road referred to and recommended to be opened; shown on sketch No. 1.; takes the following courses and distances, viz.
