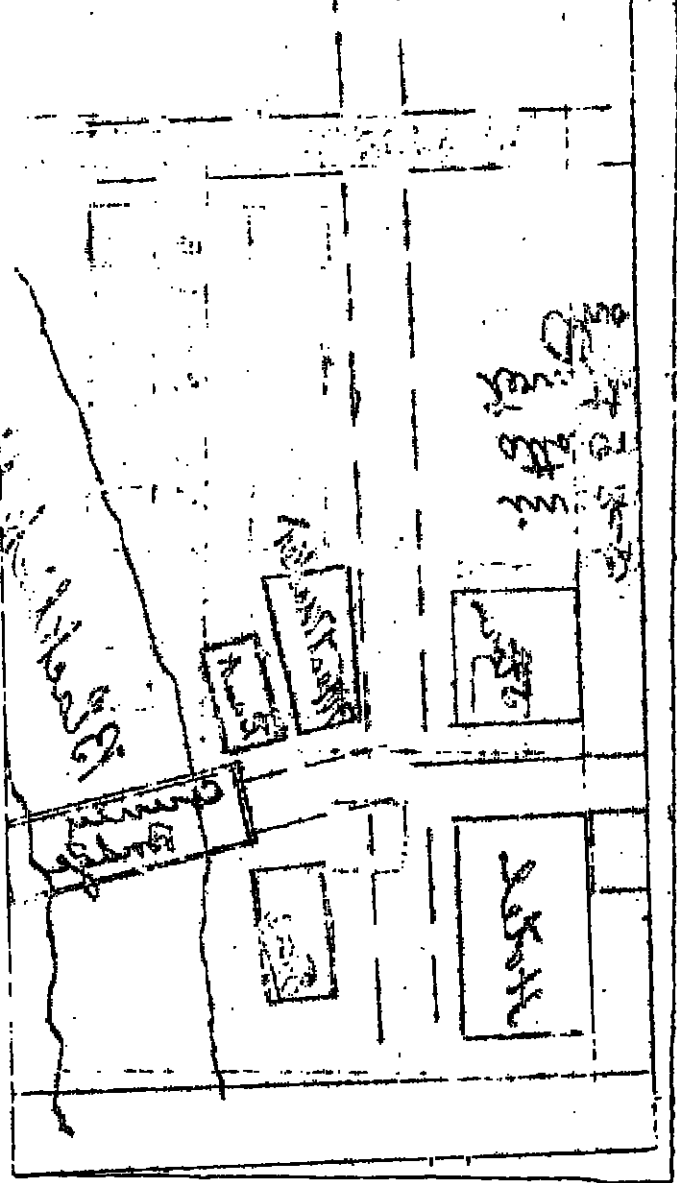
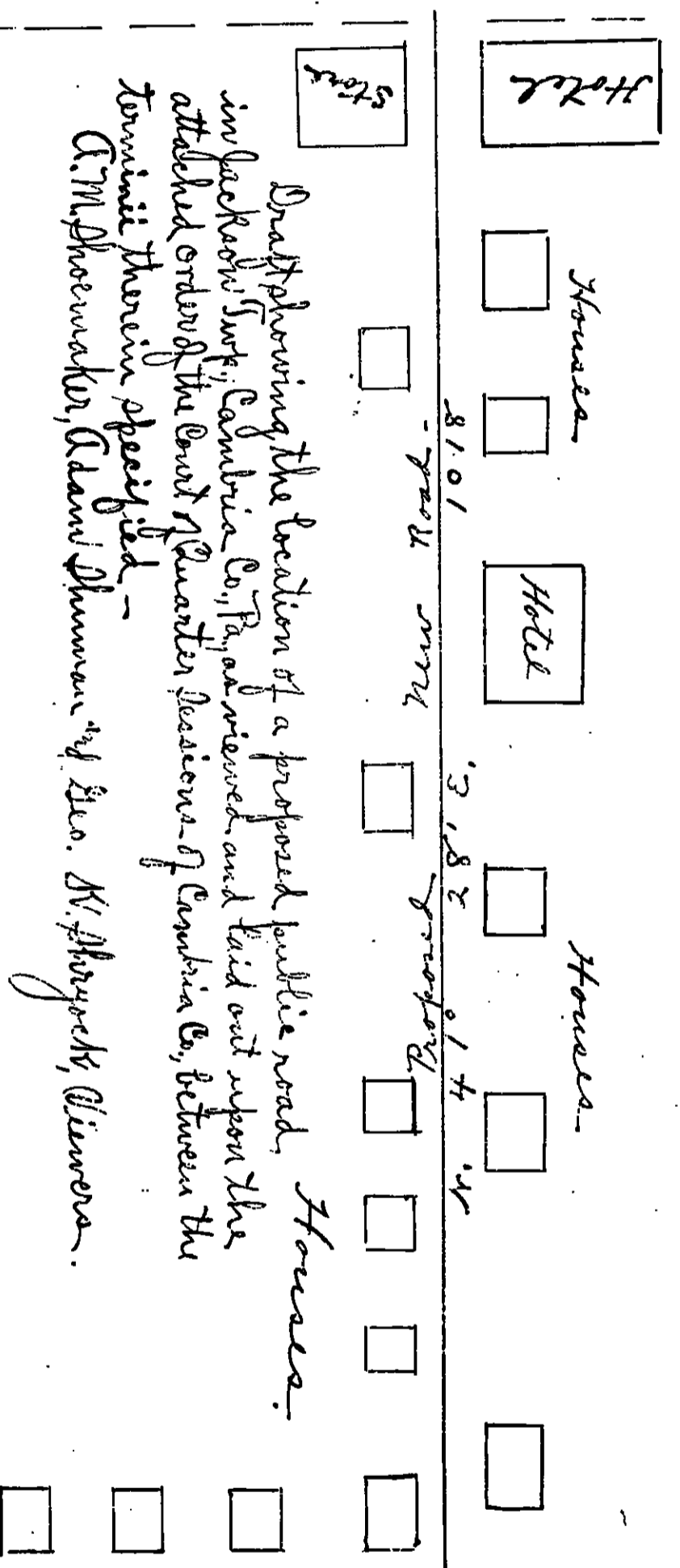

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS
OF CAMBRIA COUNTY:

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the Township
of Jackson, said County, respectfully represent:

THAT they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public
road or highway, beginning at a point at the intersection of
Roberts Street and Shoemaker Street in the Township of Jackson,
said point being seventy-seven feet from the center of the County
bridge crossing the Black Lick Creek in the Village of Nanty Glo,
the said Roberts street being a public highway, leading from Nanty-
Glo to the Pittsburg Pike; thence extending along Shoemaker Street
to the intersection of Shoemaker Street with Johnson Street and
extending along said Johnson Street and ending at a point where the
said Johnson Street intersects with Lloyd Street, a Township road
leading from Nanty Glo to the Pittsburg Pike, in the Township of
Jackson.

THE PETITIONERS therefore pray the Court to appoint three
persons, qualified according to law, to view the ground proposed for
said road and if they see occasion, lay out the same and make re-
port of their proceedings to the next term of Court.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the 25th day of October A. D. 1916, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Jackson, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a Public road or highway, to lead from at a point at the intersection of Roberts Street and Shoemaker Street in the Township of Jackson, said point being Seventy seven feet from the center of the County bridge crossing the Black Lick Creek in the Village of Nanty Glo, said Roberts Street being a public highway, leading from Nanty Glo to the Pittsburgh Pike; thence extending along Shoemaker Street to the intersection of Shoemaker Street with Johnson Street and extending along said Johnson Street and ending at a point where the said Johnson Street intersects with Lloyd Street, a Township road leading from Nanty Glo to the Pittsburgh Pike, in the Township of Jackson.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

A. M. Shoemaker, surveyor, and

Adam Shuman and Geo. K. Shryock

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria
County appointed by your honorable Court, upon the attached order, and
therein directed to view and determine as to the necessity for a public
road in Jackson Township; between the points of beginning and ending
particularly specified in said order; respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place
of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and
to the Supervisors of Jackson Township, by having them accept services
of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand
bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal
points of the road to be viewed: and having been first duly qualified
according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully,
impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability, all of us met
at the time and place appointed and having carefully viewed the premises
are of the opinion that the piece of road asked for is necessary for
the accomodation of the public and should be granted.

Said piece of road as desired by the petitioners and laid out by the
viewers; a plot or draft of which is hereto attached and made a part of
this report; takes the following courses and distances, viz:- Beginning
on Lloyd Street, in the Village of Nant-Y-Glo, at a point where Johnson
Street intersects with Lloyd St. and extending thence South seventy six
degrees East three hundred ten feet along Johnson Street and thence ~~112~~
along Shoemaker Street North fourteen degrees twenty eight minutes East
ten hundred eighteen feet to the intersection of Roberts Street, all in
the said village: the points of beginning and ending above noted being
the points more particularly noted on the order of Court hereto attached
