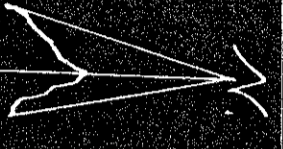

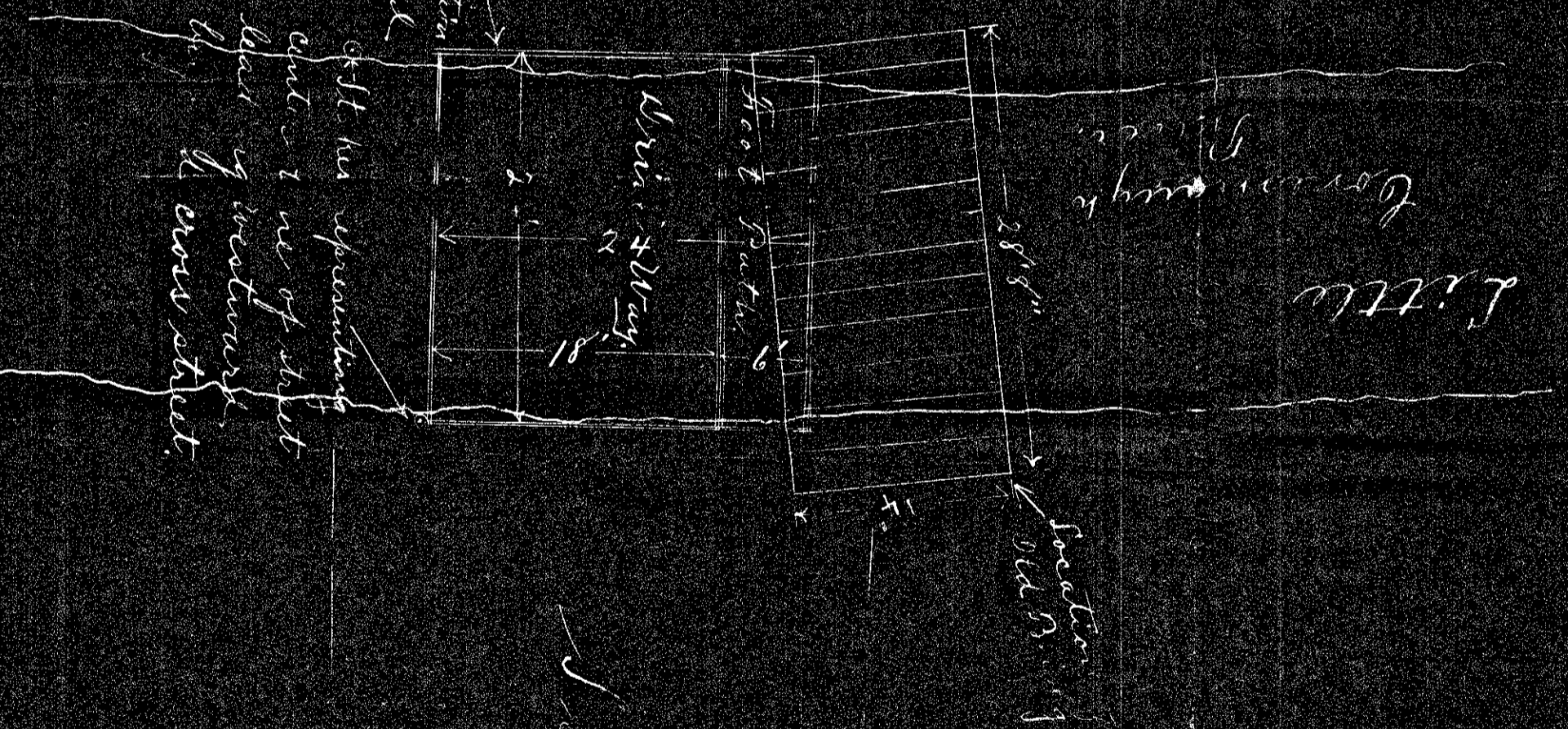

IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY .

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the Borough of Lilly, in said county, respectfully represents:

That Church Street in said Borough is a main thoroughfare and a much travelled highway, same being a continuation of three converg- highways approaching said Borough.

That the said Church Street crosses a stream known as the Little Conemaugh at a point 122 feet east of the intersection of George and Church Street, and 126 feet west of the intersection of Church and Railroad Streets.

That the bridge which spans said stream at this point is old, having been erected by the County many years ago, and is in such a condition as to require that it be removed, and a new bridge of more modern construction and more suitable to the demands of the travelling public be erected to replace same.

That the erection of such a bridge requires more expense than is reasonable that the said Borough should bear.

Therefore your petitioners pray your Honorable Court to appoint viewers to investigate the situation and report to to your Honorable Court the advisability of erecting a new bridge, and that the cost of replacing this bridge should be done at the expense of the County.

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria county, appointed by your honorable Court, upon the attached order, to view the site for a proposed new bridge over the Little Conemaugh River, where Church Street crosses said River in the Borough of Lilly, said County and State, respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and places of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Borough Council by having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the site of the proposed new bridge; and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability: All of us met in accord with the notices so given at the site of the proposed bridge and having carefully viewed the premises, inspected the old bridge, investigated and inquired into the necessity for a new and more substantial bridge over the Little Conemaugh River at the point above indicated and specified in the attached order, and are all of the opinion that a new and more permanent and more modern bridge over the Little Conemaugh River where said river is crossed by Church Street, in the Borough of Lilly, is necessary for the convenience and accommodation of the citizens of said borough and the traveling public generally.

After carefully investigating and inquiring into the financial standing of the Borough of Lilly, the viewers are of the opinion that the cost of constructing a bridge at the place above noted would entail more expense than is reasonable the taxpayers of said borough should be required to bear and therefore we recommend that the cost of constructing the new bridge; which we beg leave to suggest should be twenty four feet long and twenty four feet wide with the center line of the Westerly end of the new bridge fourteen feet and the center line of the Easterly end of the new bridge twenty feet farther South than

the center line of the present old bridge, and that the new bridge should be approximately four feet higher than the present structure, and should have a six foot walk for pedestrians on the Northerly side with an~~x~~ eighteen foot driveway to the Southerly side of same.

A plot or draft showing the location of the present old bridge and the size and location of the new bridge as recommended, is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
