That the road laid out by said viewers and ordered to be opened by your Honors has not yet been opened for public use, and if opened would be useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said Township of Chest, and to the public.

They therefore pray your Honors to appoint proper persons duly qualified according to law to view said road, and to report to your Honors upon the expediency of vacating and annulling the same.

And now June 3rd, 1918, petition read and the Court hereby appoint A. M. Shoemaker, Adma Shuman and J. D. Ritter Viewers to examine the premises and make report to the Court, as provided by law.

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of  
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court; upon the attached order; and therein directed to view and determine as to the expediency of vacating and annulling a certain piece of township road, in Chest township on the Chest Springs - St Lawrence road, which said piece of road was viewed and laid out upon an order of the Court of Quarter Sessions dated the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April, 1917, but has not yet been opened; respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria county and the Supervisors of Chest township by having them accept service of notices hereto attached and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal points of the piece of road to be viewed, and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability: All of us met at the time and place appointed in accordance with the notices so given and having carefully viewed the premises, noting the usual course of travel of those living in the vicinity of the said piece of road, as well as the general public, and also being apprised of the circumstances relative to the development of the particular locality we are now of the opinion that the new road as laid out but not yet opened should be vacated and annulled. The vacating and supplying of the piece of road heretofore recommended would necessarily be attended with some expense, which ; ; considering the limited use which we are convinced would not be commensurate with the expense of supplying the same; we feel the taxpayers of

the township should not be required to bear.

Although the change as previously recommended would be an improvement to the road and the attendant expense not excessive were the road such as would accommodate and be used by the general public or even be used to any extent by those residing in the immediate vicinity as we previously understood to be the case, but having now learned the circumstances to be different, we recommend that the change in the location heretofore suggested should not be made.

Said piece of road formerly recommended to be vacated takes the following courses and distances, - beginning at the point of beginning noted in the original petition and extending thence North 64 degrees East 128 feet, North 2 degrees 50 minutes West 100.5 feet, North 31 degrees 25 minutes West 152 feet and North 24 degrees 45 minutes West 28 feet to the point of ending, and the piece of road recommended to be supplied between the same termini took the direction of North 2 degrees West for 304 feet.

A plot or draft showing the courses and distances and indicating more definitely the location and directions of the particular piece of road is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

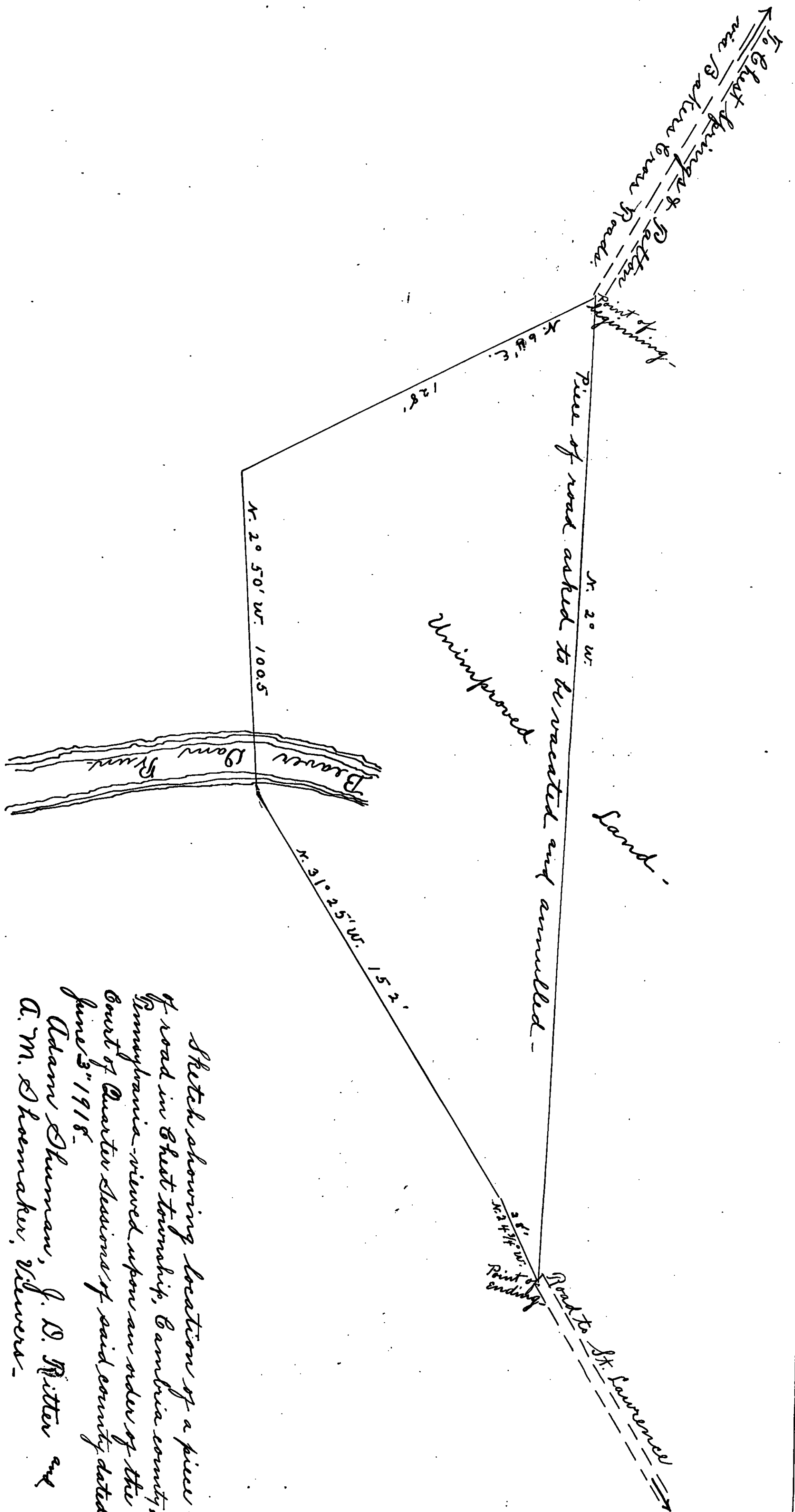



The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the Township  
of Chest in said County, Respectfully Represents:-

That a road has long since been laid out leading from Chest  
Springs to St. Lawrence in said County, that a careful search of the Road  
Dockets of Cambria County has been made, but your petitioners are unable  
to give reference to the volume and page of the Road Docket, where said  
road was ordered to be laid out for the reason that the beginning and  
ending of said road cannot now be identified on the Records; that part of  
said road has now become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the in-  
habitants of said Township; that there are heavy grades on the same and  
your petitioners desire to have part of said road vacated; viz., running  
from a point on the public road in Clearfield Township where the road  
from Patton to St. Augustine is intersected by the road leading from Chest  
Springs to St. Lawrence (known as Bakers' Cross Roads) and running thence  
along Township road leading towards St. Lawrence the following courses  
and distances; viz., North 30° West 732 feet, North 2° East 492 feet, North

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
