Ritter not appearing; and having gone over and carefully viewed the premises, we are of the opinion that the piece of road in question: a plot or draft of which is hereto attached and made a part of this report: is not necessary for the accomodation of the traveling public and that therefore the prayer of the petitioners should not be granted.

The piece of road petitioned for takes the following courst and distance from the point of beginning designated on the attached order; viz, North eighty one (81) degrees and fifteen (15) minutes West twelve hundred eighty(1280) feet to the point of ending also definitely specified on said attached order of the Court; and as indicated on the attached draft, above referred to, and is practically parallel to and approximately midway between two other public thoroughfares, each of which are of a better grade and so located as to serve a greater portion of the local population and also the traveling public.

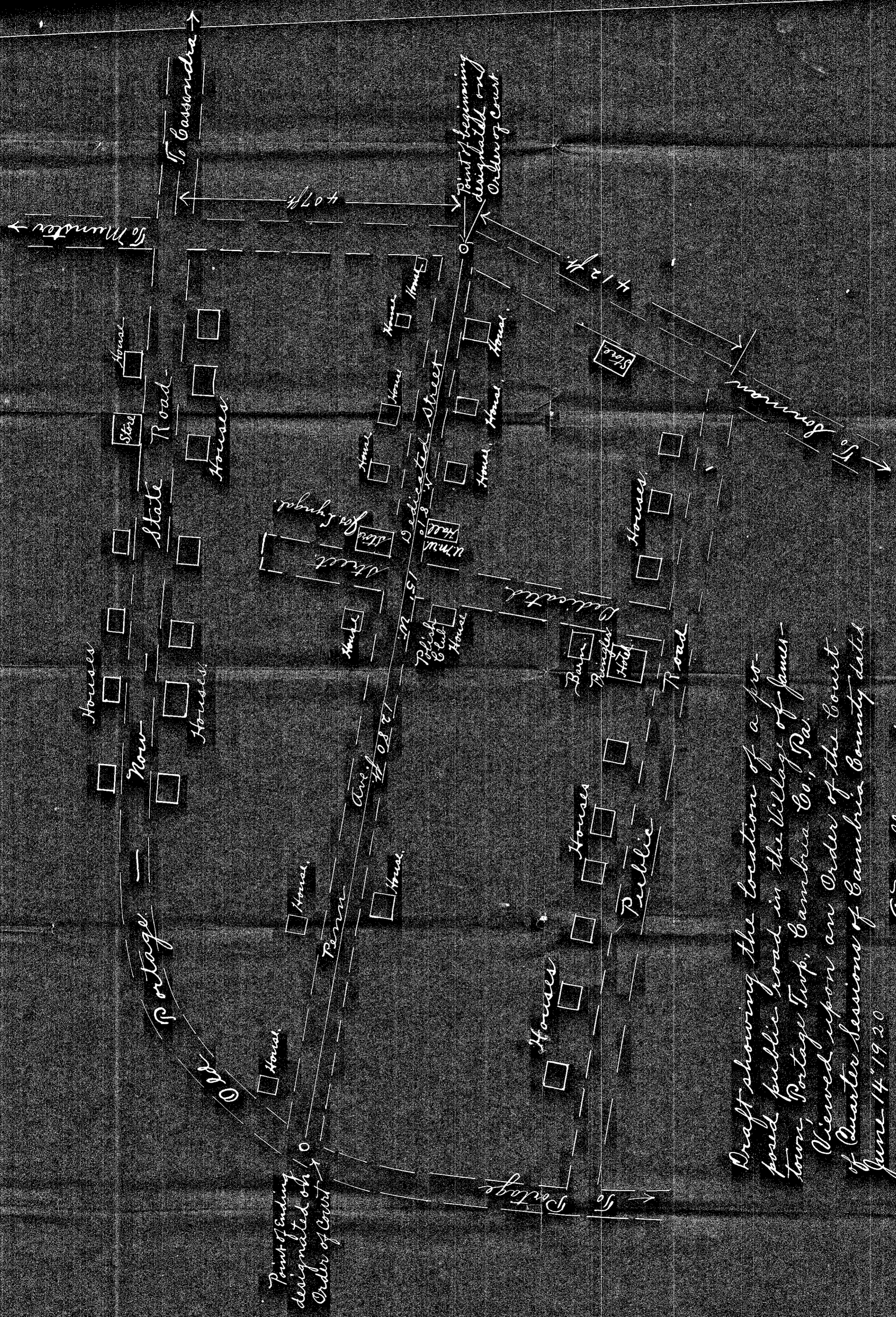
