At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the
said County, on the Third day of December A. D. 1917, be-
fore the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township
of Gallitzin, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under incon-

venience for want of a Public road or highway, to lead from
a point in the Township Road leading from Amsbry to Loretto by way
of Spindley City, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight (1928)
feet from intersection of said road with Township road leading from
Ashville to Gallitzin, by way of Amsbry, and ending at a point in the
line between the Township of Allegheny and Township of Gallitzin, in
the Township Road leading from Amsbry to Loretto by way of Spindley
City, three thousand two hundred and forty-seven (3247) feet from
point where said road is intersected by Township Road leading from Gall
itzin to Chest Springs, as shown on plot or draft hereto annexed.
Your petitioners avers further that a number of families in this
vicinity are without any public or private road and are compelled to
trespass upon the private property in order to go to and return from
their work or church, and that there is no public or private way lead-
ing to or by which many of the children in said vicinity can reach
the public school.

Your petitioners further aver that a public road can be laid
out between the proposed points, as aforesaid, at a comparatively
small expense, as a large part of the proposed road can be located
on a former public road, which has been vacated, and upon portions
of a private road so that the same will not be burdensome to the tax-
payers of the said Townships, and will be of great benefit, not only
to the people of the section through which the road will pass, but
also to the traveling public

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according
to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall
agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the
shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that
they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County,
stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with
a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass:

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria county, appointed by your Honorable Court, upon the attached order, and therein directed to view and determine ^{as to} the necessity for a public road in Gallitzin township, said county and state; between the points of beginning and ending specified in said order; respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria county and to the Supervisors of Gallitzin township by having them accept service of notices hereto attached and to the traveling public by printed hand bills ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ posted in public and conspicuous places in the vicinity of the proposed new road; and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability; All of us met at the time and place appointed and having gone over and carefully viewed the premises; we are of the opinion that a public road between the terminal points, other than the present road which is already opened and in general use, is not necessary for the accomodation of the public.

A plot or draft of the suggested new road between the terminal points specified in the attached order is herewith filed and made a part of this report: Said draft shows the suggested new road as beginning at the Northwesterly termini and running thence as follows, N. 42° 15' E. 556 feet, N. 50° 15' E. 517 feet, N. 41° 30' E. 367 feet, N. 37° E. 601 feet, N. 41° 15' E. 359 feet, N. 48° E. 196 feet, N. 55° 30' E. 370 feet, S. 70° E. 370 feet, S. 00° 30' E. 208 feet, S. 15° W. 182 feet, S. 56° 30' W. 204 feet, S. 41° 30' W. 316 feet, S. 52° E. 617 feet,

S. 15° 30' W. 642 feet, S. 34° 30' W. 1056 feet to the Southeasterly
termini noted in the attached order.

The proposed new road as asked for in the petition, if laid out
and opened would in a measure accomodate about nine families, some
seven of whom already have an outlet by way of a private road as laid
out and dedicated by a former owner of the property of which their
respective farms are a part.
