At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the 28th day of January A. D. 1919, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Summerhill, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience ~~for want of~~ a public road or highway, to lead from a point in an old road branching from the public road between Lloydell and Onnalinda, in said Township, distant six thousand and fifty eight feet to the intersection of said road with the public road leading from Beaverdale through Lloydell and Dunlo one thousand two hundred and eighteen feet distant to the intersection of the Lloydell and Onnalinda road with the Main Street of the Village of Onnalinda, and to end at the termination of the public road leading to Pavia, Union Township, Bedford County, on the dividing line of Cambria and Bedford Counties, said ending point being five and one half miles distant from Pavia and the intersection of the public road leading from Bedford to Butlersville.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~by~~ <sup>vacate</sup> the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ <sup>to be vacated</sup> the same, ~~having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and to the convenience of the public, and to the interests of the property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public ~~or private~~ <sup>to be vacated</sup> road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.~~

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case it shall be their duty to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agree-able to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declina- tion of the road may be preserved within that limit."

R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of  
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your Honorable Court; upon the attached order; and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating a certain piece of public road in Summerhill Township, Cambria County, Pa., between the points of beginning and ending specified in the petition for the appointment of viewers to view and pass upon the propriety of vacating said piece of road; respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria County and to the Supervisors of the Township of Summerhill, by having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal points of the road suggested to be vacated; having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability: All of us met at the time and place appointed in accordance with the notices so given and having carefully viewed the premises, investigated and enquired into all matters pertaining to the use, convenience and benefit of the piece of road sought to be vacated and are of the opinion that the prayed of the petitioners should be granted.

The piece of road sought to be vacated; a plot or draft of which is hereto attached and made a part of this report; takes the following courses and distances, viz:- Beginning at the line dividing the counties of Bedford and Cambria, where said line is <sup>met</sup> ~~crossed~~ by the public road leading from said line to the Village of Pavia, in Bedford County and running thence through and over unimproved lands as follows, North 55° West 360 ft., South 81° West 500 ft., North 80° West 500 ft., South 86° West 350 ft., North 46° 30' West 400 ft., North 29° 30' West 400 ft.

South 41° West 400 ft., South 46° West 600 ft., South 58° 30' West 500 ft., South 42° 30' West 300 ft., South 64° 30' West 190 ft., North 46° 30' West 300 ft., South 88° 30' West 300 ft., South 88° West 600 ft., North 59° West 500 ft., North 7° 30' West 500 ft., North 5° 30' West 1100 ft., North 63° 30' West 200 ft., North 85° 30' West 300 ft., North 46° West 200 ft., North 2° East 500 ft., North 19° West 200 ft., North 78° 30' West 1000 ft., North 36° West 1200 ft., North 70° 30' West 464 ft., North 68° West 238 ft., North 46° West 247 ft., North 61° 30' West 498 ft., North 83° 15' West 346 ft., North 81° West 126 ft., North 83° 45' West 232 ft., North 78° 15' West 169 ft., North 75° 30' West 324 ft., North 84° 30' West 199 ft., North 88° 40' West 148 ft., North 84° 30' West 164 ft., North 74° 30' West 165 ft., North 61° 30' West 120 ft., North 55° 30' West 116 ft. and North 61° 45' West 144 ft., to the point of ending on the public road leading from Lloydell to Onnalinda at a point 1218 ft., from the intersection of said road with the main street of the Village of Onnalinda.

Upon investigation the viewers found that the road as laid out would be of special benefit to some twelve to fifteen citizens of Bedford county and of like benefit to some six or eight persons residing in Cambria county but would not be of general public use: that the use would not be at all commensurate with the cost of construction and maintenance; that although two petitions for practically the same piece of road above referred to have been filed and favorable reports returned to the court and a third petition - signed by a great number of citizens of Cambria county and entered to No. 2. Dec. Session 1918 - presented representing that another road between the Bedford and Cambria county line and the Village of Beaverdale; which if needed would accommodate practically the same traveling public; a very great number of the petitioners and promoters of the movement together with numerous other representative citizens of Cambria county, living in the vicinity of the termini of the proposed road, appeared enmass before the viewers and urged that the roads as previously recommended and as petitioned for and then pending for the consideration of the viewers, was positively not necessary for the convenience or accommodation of the traveling public nor the citizens of that community and urged also by the Supervi-

sors that even the road for which they had petitioned was not necessary for the accomodation of the traveling public.

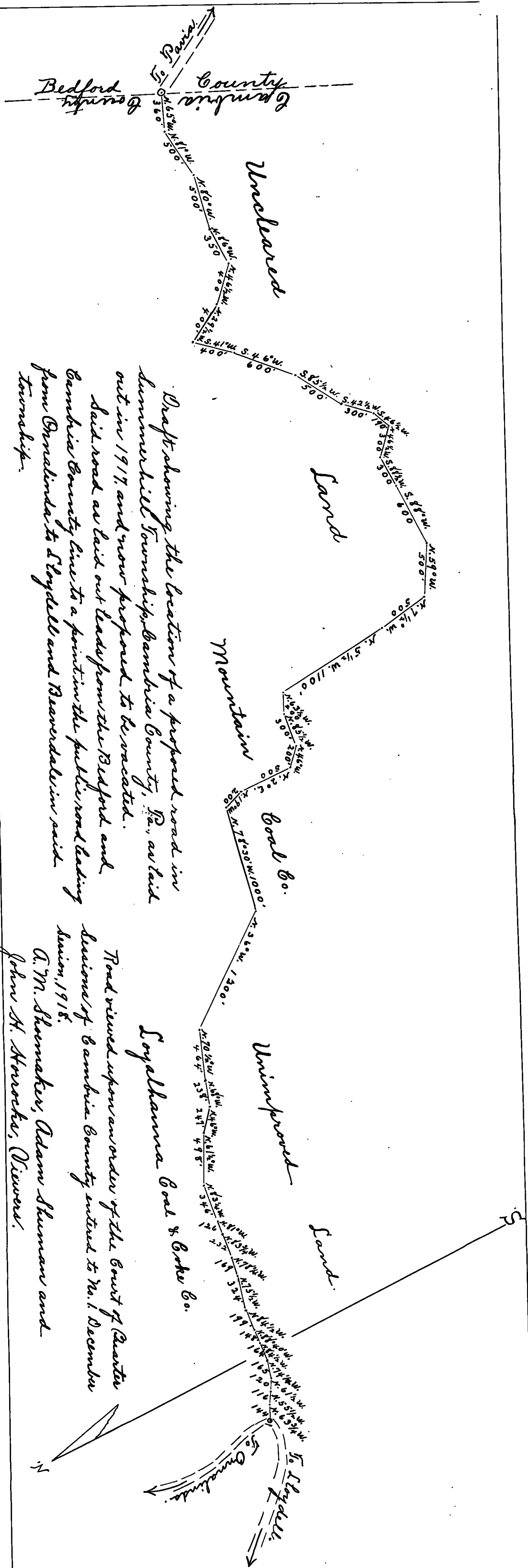

IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

WHEREAS, on the 3rd day of September, 1917, a petition of the citizens of the Township of Summerhill was presented to your Honorable Court praying for the appointment of viewers to lay out a road in Summerhill Township, beginning at a point in an old road branching from the public road between Lloydell and Onnalinda, in said Township, distant six thousand and fifty-eight feet to the intersection of said road with the public road leading from Beaverdale through Lloydell and Dunlo one thousand two hundred and eighteen feet distant to the intersection of the Lloydell and Onnalinda road with the Main Street of the Village of Onnalinda, and to end at the termination of the public road leading to Pavia, Union Township, Bedford County, on the dividing line of Cambria and Bedford Counties, said ending point being five and one-half miles distant from Pavia and the intersection of the public road leading from Bedford to Butlersville; at which time viewers were appointed, who filed their report on the 5th of December, 1917, which said report was approved by your Honorable Court on December 6, 1917, and the breadth of the road fixed at forty feet, and said report was confirmed on March 6, 1918, and an order to open was issued.

We, the undersigned, residents and citizens of the Township of Summerhill, in said County, and being a majority of the persons who signed the petition in the above mentioned proceeding, respectfully represent:

That while the above road as laid out and ordered to be opened is the best road between the points designated, in said above mentioned petition, the cost of opening and maintaining the same will be exceedingly high, and since the same crosses over the mountain, it

has of necessity steep grades and sharp turns, and that by starting a road at Beaverville to cross the mountain and intersect with said road at its intersection with the Bedford County line, a much better grade could be made, and that there would be no excessive grades or steep curves, and that the cost of building and maintaining this road would be very much less than the first above mentioned road, although of a little greater length.

Your petitioners, therefore, pray that the said road, the report for which was confirmed on March 6, 1918, as aforesaid, and which has not yet been opened, be vacated, and that your Honorable Court appoint viewers for this purpose.
