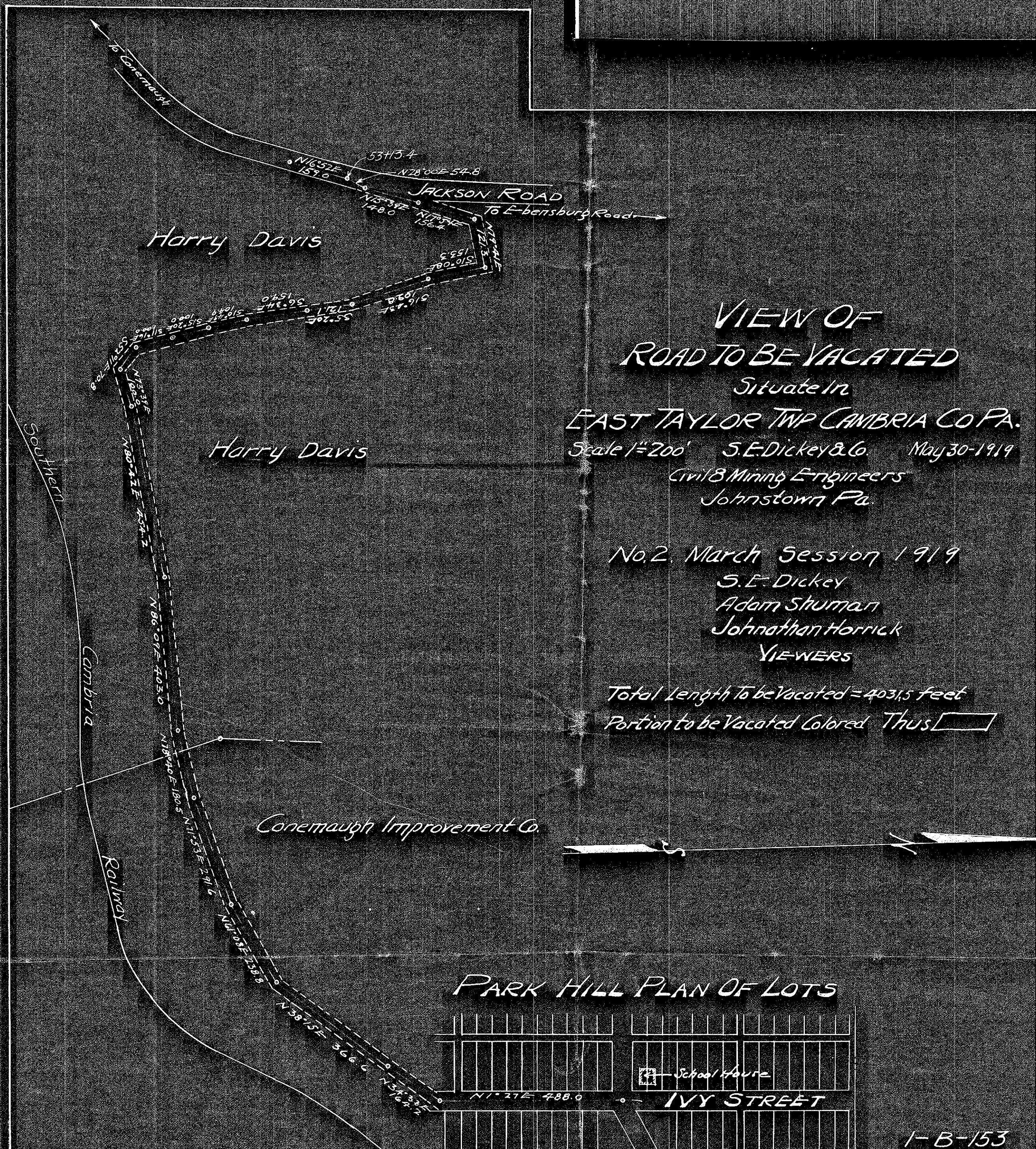

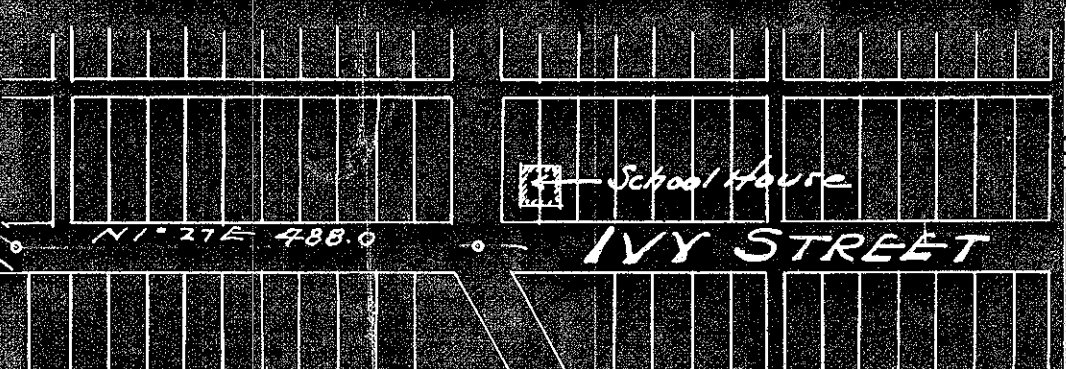
VIEW OF ROAD TO BE VACATED

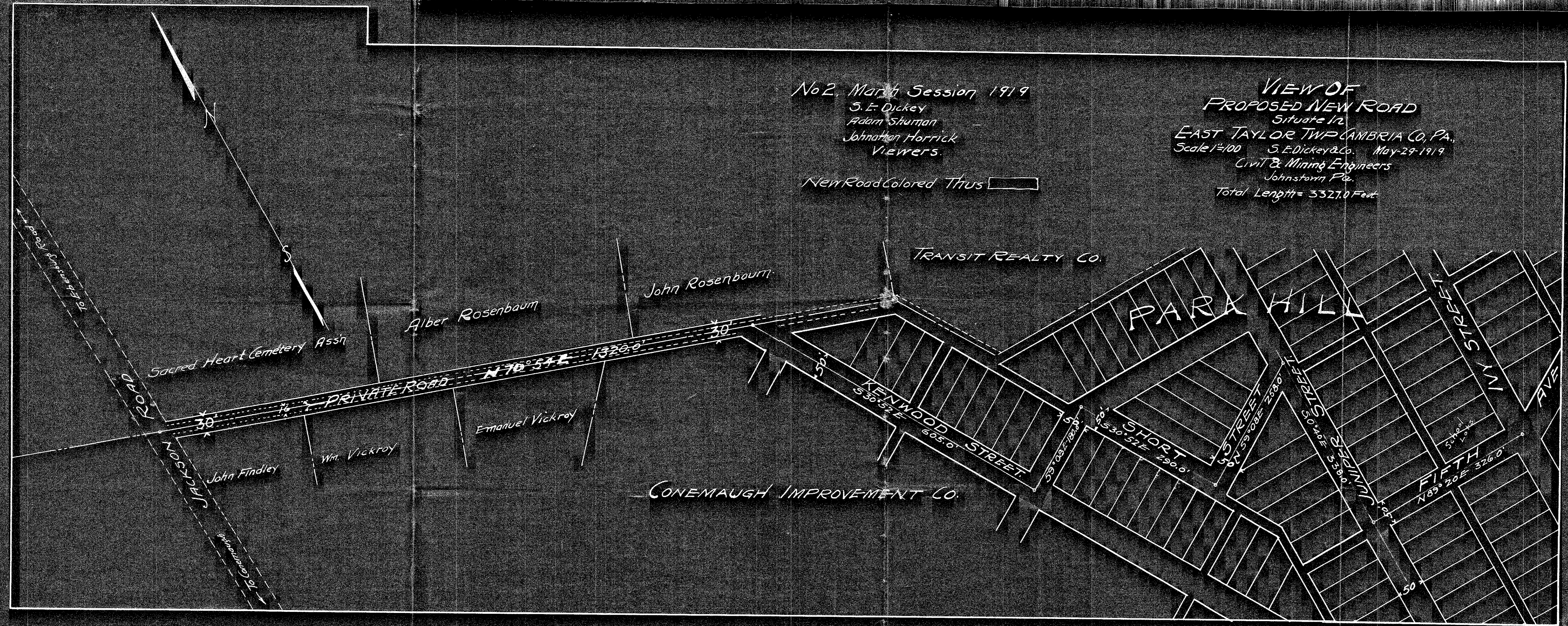
PARK HILL PLAN OF LOTS

To the Honorable, the Judges of the above mentioned Court:

This is to certify that in pursuance with the report of viewers, and the order of the above court, the Supervisors of East Taylor Township did enter upon the premises as described therein and did open a public road between the points described therein during the year 1920, and that following this during the years 1923, 1924, they did cause the same to be opened to a width of thirty two feet (32') of the forty feet (40') recommended by the courts order.

Having been shown that all the things to be done, have been done in the aforesaid mentioned report and order and that there is now due and payable for damages the following amounts,

IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court.

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the Township of East Taylor, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

That they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to begin at a point on the brick State Road, known as Jackson Road, at the intersection of said Jackson Road and a private road at the residence of John Findley, in said Township of East Taylor and ending at a point on a public road, laid out in 1916, but not yet opened, said point being on Ivy Street and said unopened road, 500 feet south of the intersection of Fifth Avenue and Ivy Streets, in the village of Parkhill in said Township of East Taylor. Said unopened road beginning at a point in the Jackson Road at a point 5313.4 feet distant from the intersection of said Jackson Road with the Ebensburg Road and by various courses and distances extending to a point on said Ebensburg Road 506.9 feet northeastwardly from the intersection of said Jackson Road and the Ebensburg Road.

The petitioners therefor pray the Court to appoint three men qualified according to law to view the ground proposed for such road, and if they see occasion to lay out the same and to inquire of and vacate that part of the public road unopened, entered, to No. 2, March Session, 1916, of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, beginning at a point on the State Brick Road, known as the Jackson Road leading from Conemaugh to the Ebensburg Road, at a distance of 5313.4 feet along the center line of said State Brick Road, known as the Jackson Road from its intersection with the Ebensburg Road, as laid out by the State Highway Department, thence north 28° 00' E. 54.8 feet, N. 15° 39' E. 148.0 feet, N. 17° 54' E. 156.4 feet, N. 79° 41' E. 121.3 feet, S. 10° 08' E. 153.3 feet, S. 16° 43' E. 109.8 feet, S. 5° 20' E. 121.0 feet, S. 6° 34' E. 159.0 feet, S. 10° 49' E. 104.9 feet, S. 15° 20' E. 100.0 feet, S. 11°

REPORT OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable, the Judges of the above mentioned Court. We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the annexed order of the Court to view the roads within mention respectfully report; that we have been duly sworn or affirmed as members of the permanent board of Viewers of Cambria County, as shown by the records of the court, that having given due public notice of the said view of the time and place of meeting by posting notices as required by law along the route and at the termini of said proposed new road and road to be vacated and by service of such notices on the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of East Taylor Township, acceptance of said notices by the Commissioners and Supervisors being hereto attached; that we met in accordance with the notice given on the 10th day of May, A. D. 1919 at 10:00 o'clock A. M. and proceeded with the duties of our appointment and viewed the premises and route of the proposed new road and the portion of road proposed to be vacated, and are of the opinion that there is an occasion for a public road as prayed for by the petitioners and therefore proceeded to lay out said new road, having due respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road and in such manner as would be as near as practicable agreeable to the desire of the Petitioners and at the same time do the least injury to private property; that by the laying out of the proposed new road we find that the portion of the public road prayed for to be vacated will become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the tax payers.

The plots or drafts showing the proposed new road and the portion of road to be vacated are hereto attached and made a part of this report and herewith returned for public use. The courses and distances of each road being shown thereon. The plots or drafts herewith attached shows the improvements and the

owners of the adjacent property along the route of said road. The said road passes along, through or over land of John Findley, Sacred Heart Cemetery Association, William Vickroy, Albert Rosenbaum, Emanuel Vickroy, John Rosenbaum and Conemaugh Improvement Company, we obtained a release of damages from the Conemaugh Improvement Company same being hereto attached and made a part of this report. We were unable to secure a release of damages from John Findley, Sacred Heart Cemetery Association, William Vickroy, Albert Rosenbaum, Emanuel Vickroy and John Rosenbaum.

Therefore taking into consideration the damages sustained and the benefits to be derived by the opening, improving, and maintaining of said new road, we assess benefits and damages as follows:

During the view on the ground a large number of the Petitioners, residents and Supervisors were present. After viewing the premises we adjourned until the 15th day of May A. D. 1919 at 10:00 o'clock A. M. at which time we met in the Judges Chambers, 1004 Johnstown Trust Building, Main Street, Johnstown, Pa., when all evidence and testimony of interested parties were heard.

That after due consideration of all the matters before us we are of the opinion that the road prayed for by the Petitioners and laid out by us is necessary, which should be a permanently constructed road and that the portion of road proposed to be vacated by reason of laying out of the new road will become useless

inconvenient and burdensome, therefore we recommend that the prayer of the Petitioners be granted.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declivity of the road may be preserved within that limit."
