The petition of the Hon. H. W. Storey,
Burgess of the Borough of Johnston, humbly
represents that the Town Council of said
Borough on the 19th day of January, 1886
passed the following Ordinance; To-wit:

An Ordinance defining the width of Morris
Street, Fifth and Sixth Wards, and fixing
the width of sidewalks thereon

Whereas, Morris Street is and always has
been a public highway of the Borough of
Johnston, forty-nine feet six inches wide;
Therefore,

That Ordinance is hereby
the Burgess and Town Council of the
Borough of Johnston, and it is hereby
ordained and enacted by Authority of the same
Sec 1. That Morris Street, extending from the
south end of the bridge over the Stonycreek
through the Fifth and Sixth Wards of
Johnston Borough, to the boundary line
of said Borough, be and the same is hereby
declared to be one of the Public Streets of the
Borough; of the width of forty-nine feet and
six inches; That the western boundary
line of said Street shall be along and
adjoining the property line as now fixed,
extending from said Stonycreek bridge south
to the boundary line of said Borough; That
the eastern boundary line of said Street

1 shall be along and adjoining the property line
2 as now fixed, extending from said St. Lawrence
3 Bridge to the Boundary line of said Borough.
4 Sec. 2. That the width of the sidewalks on
5 said street are hereby fixed at eleven feet.
6 Sec. 3. That all the Ordinances of said
7 Borough relative to Streets and Alleys be
8 and the same are hereby extended to and
9 over said Morris Street.

16 Court to appoint seven disinterested free-
17 holders of said Borough, who, after being duly
18 sworn or affirmed to perform their duties,
19 under the Act of Assembly in such case
20 made and provided, with impartiality and
21 fidelity, shall proceed to view the premises
22 described in said Ordinance or petition,
23 having regard to both the advantages and
24 disadvantages caused to the several properties
25 along the line of and adjoining said Morris
26 Street, and shall assess and allow to all
27 persons injured thereby such damages as
28 they shall have sustained respectively over
29 and above all advantages; and who shall
30 also make assessment for contributions upon
31 all such properties as shall be benefited.

1 by the reason of defining the width of said
2 street, and fixing the width of sidewalks of
3 the same, such sums respectively as they may
4 be benefited, over and above all disadvantages,
5 and the said viewers shall make a report
6 of their proceedings in writing to the next
7 session of said Court, describing the proper
8 basis upon which Assessments have been made,
9 specifically stating whether for Contributions
10 or for Damages, with the amounts respectively,
11 and, as in duty bound, your petitioner will ever
12 pray.

and fidelity, did proceed to view the premises
described in said Order of Court, and found
that the fixing of the width of said Street as

The Petition of the Burgesses of Johnston Borough and the Town Council of said Borough, Respectfully Represents. That the Town Council of said Borough on the 19th day of January A. D. 1886 passed the following Ordinance to wit;

All Ordinance defining the width of Morris street Fifth and Sixth Wards, and fixing the width of sidewalks thereon. Whereas Morris street is and always has been a Public Highway of the Borough of Johnston forty nine feet six inches wide. Therefore Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgesses and Town Council of the Borough of Johnston, and it is hereby Ordained and enacted by the Authority of the same

Sec. 1. That Morris street extending from the south end of the Bridge over the Stony Creek through the Fifth and Sixth Wards of Johnston Borough to the boundary line of said Borough be and the same is hereby declared to be one of the public streets of the Borough of the width of forty nine feet and six inches. That the Western boundary line of said street shall be along and adjoining the property line on one side, extending from said Stony Creek Bridge South to the boundary line of said Borough. That the Eastern boundary line of said street shall be along and adjoining the property line on one side, extending from said Stony Creek Bridge to the boundary line of said Borough.

Sec. 2. That the width of the side Walk on said

Street is hereby found at Elerens feet.

Sec: 3. That all ordinances of said Borough relative Streets and alleys be and the same is hereby extended to and over said Morris Street.

The Petitioners therefore pray this Honorable Court to appoint seven disinterested Free holders of said Borough who after having duly sworn or affirmed to perform their duties under the Act of Assembly in such Cases made and provided with impartiality and fidelity, shall proceed to view the premises described in said Ordinance or Petition, having regard to both the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said Morris Street; and shall assess and allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages; and who shall also make Assessments for Contributions upon all such properties as shall be benefited by the reason of defining the width of said Street and fixing the width of side walks of the same such sums respectively as they may be benefited over and above all disadvantages. And the said Viewers shall make reports of their proceedings in Writing to the next Sessions of said Court describing the properties upon which Assessments have been made specifically stating whether for Contributions or for Damages with the Accounts respectively.

The Court upon due Consideration had of the premises appointed Jacob Bond, John James, Evan R. Lloyd, John Coad, John Pyarr, Thomas S. Davies and James J. Murphy as Viewers, who, after giving due and legal Notice of the time and place of meeting shall proceed to view the premises and make full report of their proceedings as here in prayed for to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of said County, and in which reports

they shall state distinctly that they had been sworn and
affirmed according to law.
