To the Honorable the Judges of the Court
of Quarter Sessions for the County of Cambridge

The petition of the Hon. H. W. Storey, Burgess
of the Borough of Johnston, humbly represents
that the Town Council of said Borough, on
the 16th day of December 1885, passed the follow-
ing Ordinance, viz.:

Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess
and Town Council of the Borough of
Johnston, and it is hereby ordained and
enacted by authority of the same

Sec. 1. The Alley in the Fourth Ward, extending
from the southerly side of Main Street to
Spuyecreek Street, shall be and it is hereby
declared to be a public Alley, and shall not
be less than fourteen feet in width, and shall
be known as Finch Alley. The westerly line
of said Alley, commencing at Main Street, to
be along and adjoining the property line of
the estate of Henry Schable, deceased, to Apple Alley,
thence across Apple Alley and along and
adjoining the property line of Jacob Fencil, the
Johnstown Electric Light Company, and the
Lutheran Cemetery to Spuyecreek Street, and
the easterly line of said Alley, beginning at
Main Street, to be along and adjoining the property
line of the Estate of John Mueller, deceased, to
Apple Alley, thence across Apple Alley and along
and adjoining the property line of the Estate of
Henry Schable, deceased, Wesley J. Rose, Mrs. S. A.
Davis, Peter H. Levergood, Wm. H. Levergood,
Wm. Caldwell, and of the Levergood estate to

Shaycreek Street-

1 Sec. 2. That all Ordinances of said Borough
2 relating to Streets and Alleys shall be and
3 the same are hereby extended to and over said
4 alley.

5 Sec. 3. That all ordinances and parts of
6 Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance
7 be and the same are hereby repealed so far
8 as the same relate to this Alley.

22 said ordinance or petition, having regard
23 both to the advantages and disadvantages
24 caused to the several properties along the line
25 of and adjoining said End Alley, and shall
26 assess and allow to all persons injured thereby

28 respectively over and above all advantages;
29 and who shall also make assessment for
30 contributions upon all such properties as
31 shall be benefited by the opening of said Alley.

And the said viewers further report that none of the said lot owners along and adjoining the lines of said Alley are benefited more and above all disadvantages by reason of fixing the width of said Alley, and therefore do not assess Contributions on the lots of any of said owners.

All of which lots of ground along and adjoining the boundary lines of said Alley are more particularly designated on a map or plat of said Alley, which is herewith attached and marked "Exhibit B," and made part of this report.

On Monday the first day of March
A. D. 1886. before the Honorable
Judge of said Courts.

The Petition of the Burgesses of Johnston Borough
and the Town Council of said Borough. Respectfully
represents that the Town Council of said Borough
on the 15th day of December A. D. 1885, passed the
following Ordinance Viz;

Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgesses
and Town Council of the Borough of Johnston and
it is hereby Ordained and Enacted by the authority of the
same.

Sec. 1. This alley in the South Ward extending
from the Southern side of Main Street to Stony Creek
Street shall be and it is hereby declared to be a
public Alley, and shall not be less than fourteen
feet in width and shall be known as Bond Alley.
The westerly line of said alley commencing at Main
Street to be along and adjoining the property line
of the Estate of Henry Scheble deceased to Apple Alley.
Thence across Apple Alley and along and adjoining
the property line of Jacob Bond, the Johnston Electric
Light Company, and the Lutheran Cemetery to Stony
Creek Street, and the Easterly line of said alley
beginning at Main Street, to be along and adjoining
the property line of the Estate of John Mueller, deceased, to
Apple Alley. Thence across Apple Alley and
along and adjoining the property line of the Estate

of Henry Schnable deceased, Maloy J. Rose, Mr. S. A. Davis, Peter H. Loringood, William H. Loringood, William Calderwell and of the Loringood Estate to Long Creek Street.

Sec: 2. That all ordinances of said Borough relating to streets and Alleys shall be and the same are hereby extended to and over said Alley.

Sec: 3. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed so far as the same relate to this alley.

The Petitioners therefore pray Your Honorable Court to appoint three disinterested Freeholders of said Borough who after being duly sworn or affirmed to perform their duties under the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided with impartiality and fidelity shall proceed to view the premises described in said Ordinance or Petition, having regard both to the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said Road Alley, and shall assess and allow all persons injured thereby such damage as they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages; and who shall also make Assessments for contributions upon all such properties as shall be benefited by the Opening of said Alley such sums respectively as they may have been benefited over and above all disadvantages. And the said Viewers shall make a report of their proceedings in writing to the next Session of said Court, describing the properties upon which Assessments have been made. Specifically stating whether for contribution or for damages, with amounts respectively.

The Court, upon due consideration had of the

premises appointed L. J. Meyer, B. J. Hermer, James
Haugh, Herman Paumer, William H. Thompson, A.
A. Bunker and Waley Green, as Viewers, who, after
giving due and legal notice of the time and place of
meeting, shall proceed to view the premises
and make full reports of their proceedings as herein provided
for, to the next Court of Quarter sessions of said County,
and in which reports they shall state distinctly what they
had been sworn or affirmed according to law.
