At a Court of Quarter Sessions
of the Peace of the County of
Cambria held at Ebensburg
in said County on the
Third day of March A.D. 1886.

Before the Honorable R. L. Johnston, President and
Associate Judges of the said Court. Upon the pe-
tition of divers inhabitants of Washington Town-
ship sitting forth: That a public road beginning
at a bridge on the public road on land of Bernard
Biglan and to intersect at the public road lead-
ing from Conrad's Mill to the Turn pike at or
near the school house in said Township which
was confirmed Absolute on the 6th day of January
1885, which has been opened by the supervisors of
said Township for a distance of about three hun-
dred yards; that the said road has become in-
convenient in its present location, and would
better accommodate the public travel by being
so changed, as to begin and end at the same
points to make the location on the division lines
between James Beem, Frank Joseph Beebe,
Michael Litzinger, James Brawley, heirs of Powell
George & A. Beebe and to begin such location at
or near the house of Mr. Beebe and to run said
locating line to the public road leading to Con-
rad's Mill. The petitioners therefor pray the Court
to inquire of and change the said road, and for
that purpose to appoint three persons qualified
according to law to view the said road, and the

ground proposed for the said change and enquire of the premises and to make report of their proceedings at the next Term of this Court. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint J. A. Shoemaker James Stow and Bernard Burgoon as viewers to view the ground proposed to be vacated and supplied and if they agree that there is occasion for such change they shall after being duly sworn and affirmed to discharge their duties faithfully proceed to lay out the same having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property and also be as far as practicable agreeable to the desires of the petitioners and make report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary, together with a plat or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

Exceptions to Report of Viewers

1. The viewers are not such as is required by law two of them being Petitioners for the vacation and supply of said road.
2. Notice as required by law was not given of the time and place when the viewers would meet to discharge the duties of their appointment.
3. It does not appear that viewers offered damages for the property injured and through which the new road reported by them passes, nor did they endeavor to obtain Releases from the property owners through which land the new road extends.
3. The Report is informal and not according to law.
4. The termini of the Road are not set forth with sufficient clearness.
