In the Court of Quarter Sessions of
the Peace in and for the County of
Cumbria,

In the matter of the Report of
viewers to vacate a Public Road,
"leading from Maguins Mill (known
as Marps Mill) to a point near the
late residence of Bennet Sawyer,
near farm formerly owned by R. J.
Poulfoot."

Exceptions to confirmation of
Report of viewers:

First: The viewers simply report in the
language of the petition, without spe-
cifying grounds, or cause, or reason,
that the road is "useless and
burdensome."

Second: It would seem the viewers ac-
cording to the petition praying their
appointment, had no duty to per-
form only to vacate said road, and
this, apparently, without regard to the
merit or demerit, or advantages or
disadvantages of said road,

Third: The discretion, judgement or opin-
ion of the viewers as to the use and
necessity of the road in question, un-
der the terms of the petition, was
not to be used, or to govern in their

their report, but their duties were simply to enforce and put in force the behests of the petitioners and representing only their views, regardless of the merits of the question.

Fourth: The vacation of the road would be a great injury to the citizens especially, of Chest and Carroll townships, and to the public generally.

Fifth: It would be injudicious and wrong to close up the road in question after spending thousands of dollars to open and make it, and particularly without supplying any route or road in its place and stead.

Sixth: The closing up of the public road would be a great inconvenience to the citizens living along its route.

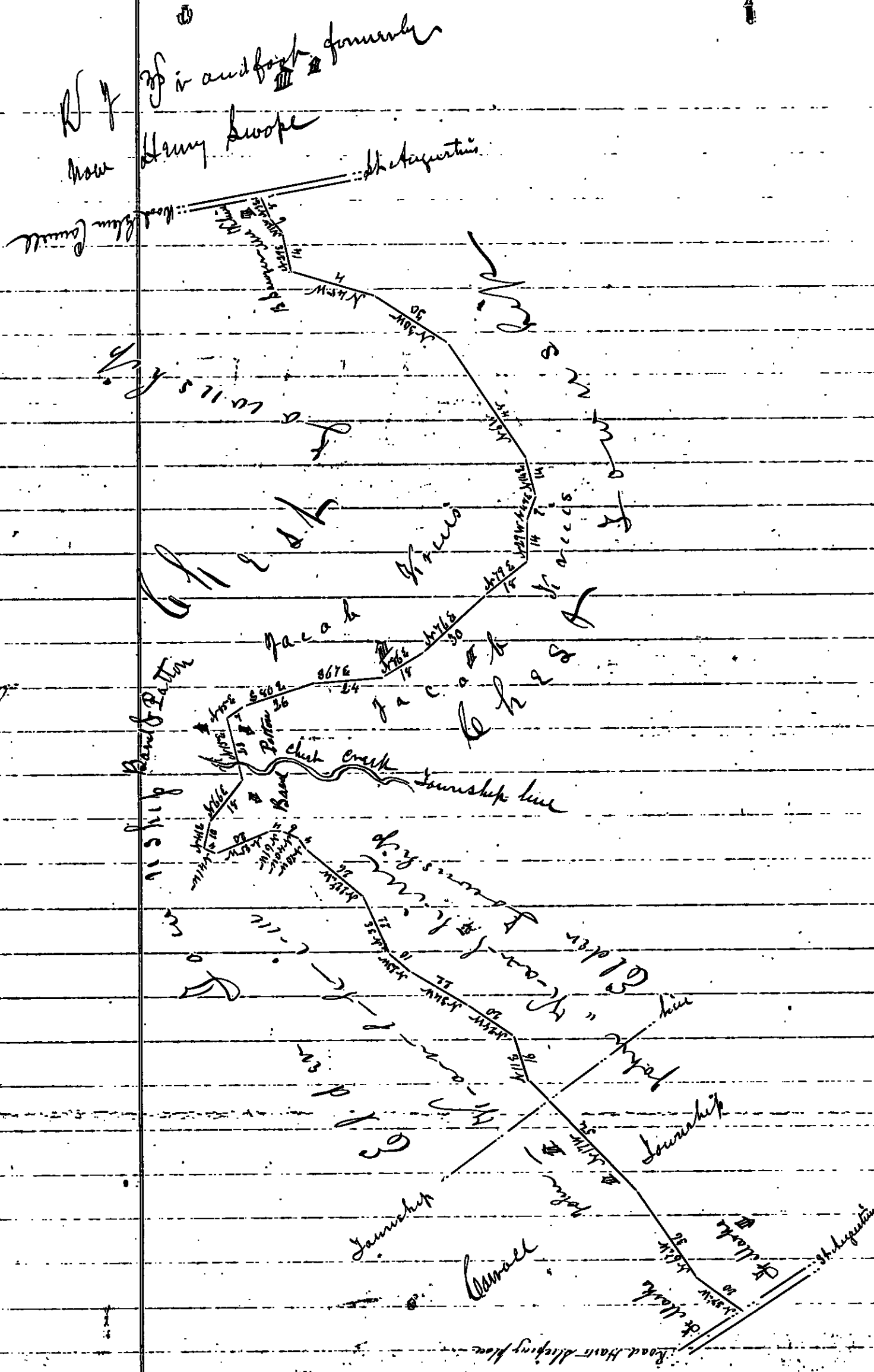

Court do report that we gave due and timely
notice of time and place of view by three written
notices posted three public places adjacent to road
to be viewed and we do further report that
having met at time and place designated in said
notices and after all jurists being duly sworn
according to law proceeded to the duties of
our appointment and in our opinion the
road mentioned in said Order of Court is incon-
venient useless and burdensome to the inhabitants
of Carroll Elder and Christ Townships and the
travelling public and in our opinion should be
located according to the Acts of General Assembly in
made and provided for. Viz beginning at a point
on public road leading from Saint Augustus to Hart
Sleeping place on farm of Ferdinand Marks thence
North twenty seven and one half degrees West twenty perches
thence North six degrees West thirty six perches thence North
seventeen degrees West fifty four perches thence North
