

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of ^{Quarter} ~~Common~~ Sessions of Cambria County

The petition of the Commissioners of Cambria County respectfully represents.

That it having appeared to the Court, to the Grand Jury and to the Commissioners of both Cambria and Somerset Counties that a bridge over the Stonycreek River between Cambria and Somerset Counties, at a point known as the Red Bridge was necessary, and that it would be too expensive for the Townships in which said bridge is situated, to erect the same, and the same having been entered of record, the Commissioners of said Cambria and Somerset Counties procured an estimate to be made, as nearly as might be, of the expense of the same, amounting to \$3307⁰⁰, and did proceed to have said bridge erected by entering into contract with the Morse Bridge Company for the building of the same. That the said bridge is now about completed. Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint three fit persons to act with three persons to be appointed by the Court of ~~Common~~ ^{Quarter} Sessions of Somerset County, in inspecting said bridge and the workmanship thereof, agreeably to the act of Assembly, and to make report thereof to the next Court.

by the Court of Quarter Sessions of Somerset
County "to view the workmanship of a bridge
erected by Morse Bridge Company over the
Stony Creek river between Somerset and
Cambria Counties" respectfully report
that we were severally duly sworn & affirmed
and discharged the duties of our said appoi-
ntment, in manner following

On Nov. 19th 1886 we went to the bridge, meeting
the Somerset County Inspectors, but owing to
a failure of the Commissioners to have the plan
and specifications placed in our hands we
adjourned to again meet on Tuesday November
23rd 1886

Pursuant to said adjournment we met with
the other Inspectors, and have carefully exam-
ined and inspected the workmanship of the
said Bridge, We do return and report to the Court
that the said Bridge has been built according to
the plan and specifications furnished the Con-
tractors, by the Commissioners of Somerset and
Cambria Counties
