absolutely.

of a certain lot of ground situate in the

lot is now almost entirely ruined for build-
ing purposes, as said road runs diagonally
across said lot. That he is assured by

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the
County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in said
County on the sixth day of July 1885, before
the Honorable Judges of the same Court:
Upon the petition of divers inhabitants
of the Townships of Carroll and Cambria setting
forth that a road has long since been laid out from
Carrolltown to Ebensburg, part of which road be-
ginning at a point at or near the Sharbaugh
School House in Carroll Township and ending
at a bridge on land of James Gost in said Township
of Carroll your petitioners conceive is now become useless
inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants
of said Township. Your petitioners pray that said
part of road may be vacated, and supplied by a
road beginning at a point at or near said
bridge on land of James Gost and ending at a
point on the "Blank road" running from Ebensburg
to Carrolltown at a point near a stable East of
the residence of George Gost in Carroll Township.

Your petitioners also respectfully sheweth
that a portion of the said road leading from
Carrolltown to Ebensburg, beginning at the
bridge on land of James Gost and ending at
the borough line of Ebensburg on account of the
very steep hills North and South of Dishart's
mill - the hills on land of Joseph Bunker -
the hills south of Mrs. Pryce - the hill North
of the residence of E. J. Humphrey and the hills
North of the Borough of Ebensburg, your petitioners

conceive is now useless in convenience and burdensome
to the inhabitants of said Township, and therefore
praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view
vacate and supply said portions of said road.

The Court upon due consideration had of the
premises do order and appoint Henry Scamborn,
Benjamin Mirtner and Peter Hoover as viewers to
view the ground proposed to be vacated and supplied
and if they agree that there is occasion for such
change, they shall proceed to lay out the same,
having respect to the shortest distance and the
best ground for a road, and in such manner
as shall do the least injury to private property
and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the
desire of the petitioners, and make report of their
proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions
to be held for said County, stating particularly
whether they judge the same necessary, together
with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses
and distances, and references to the improvements
through which it may pass.

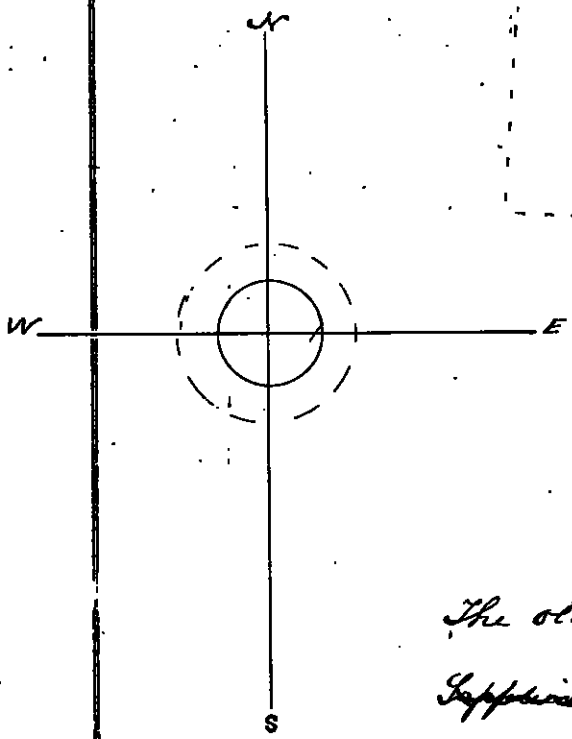
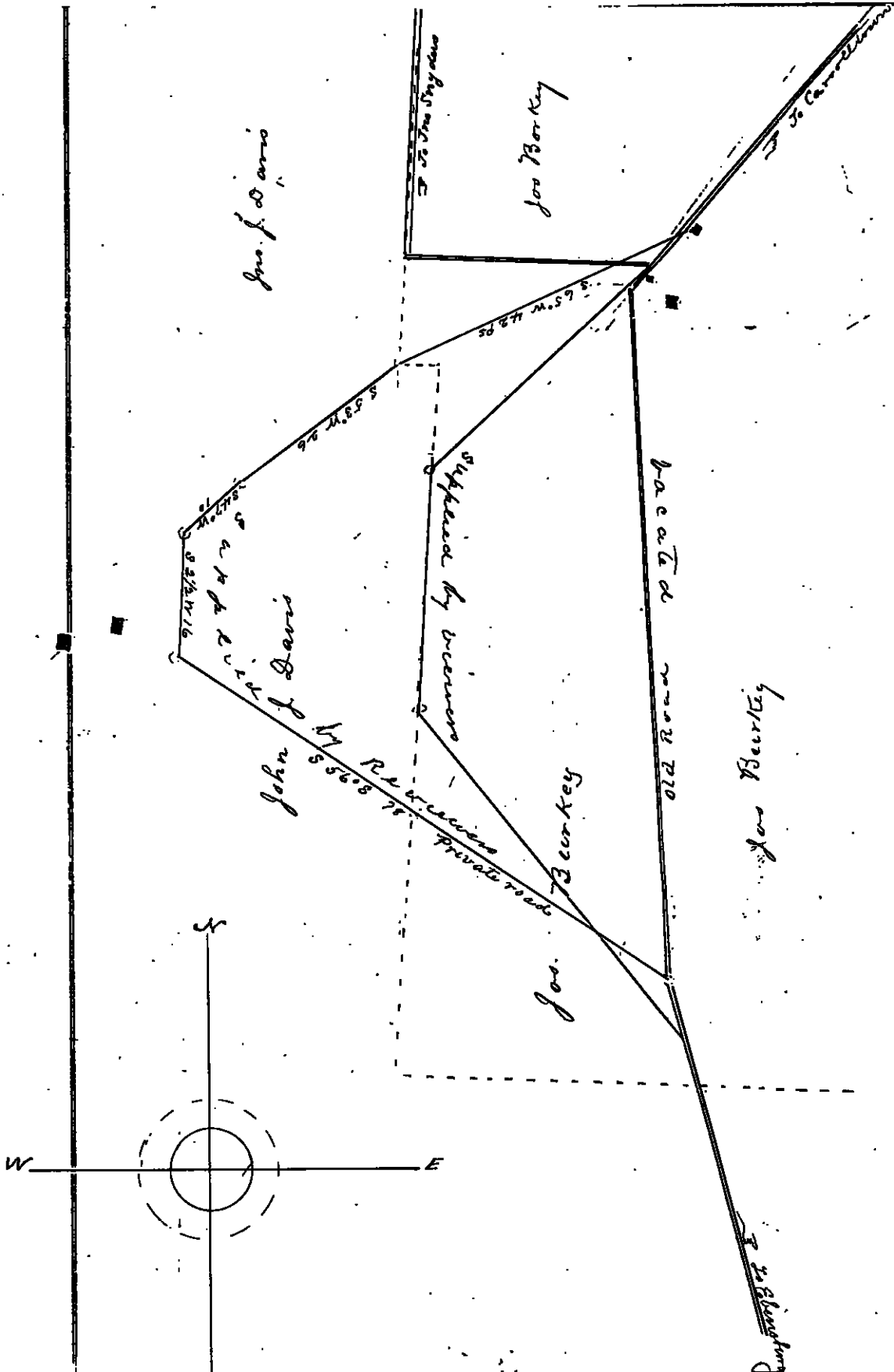

Your petitioners pray that said part of a road may be vacated, and be supplied by a road beginning at a point at or near said bridge on land of James Gost and ending at a point on the Plank Road running from Ebensburg to Carrolltown at a point near a stable East of the residence of George Gost in Carroll township:

Your petitioners also respectfully sheweth that a portion of the said road leading from Carrolltown to Ebensburg, beginning at the bridge on land of James Gost and ending at the borough line of Ebensburg on account of the very steep hills North and South of Dieharts mill, - the hills on land of Joseph Burkley, - the hills South of Mrs. Luce, the hill North of the residence of E.
