At a Court of Quarter Sessions held at Chenango in and for the County of Cambria on Monday the Fourth day of June 1888, before Hon R. L. Johnson President Judge the petition of C. W. Dick, Burgess of the Borough of Johnstown was presented setting forth That the Town Council of said Borough on the Eighteenth day of May 1888, passed the following ordinance viz: Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Johnstown, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, Sec. 1. That a street fifty feet wide commencing at the Easterly boundary line of Morris Street and extending in an Easterly direction to low water mark in the Stony Creek River is hereby ordained, laid out, and opened to be known and designated as Poplar Street continued. Sec. 2. That the Easterly boundary line of said Poplar Street continued shall commence at a point on the Easterly boundary line near the South-westerly corner of the property of Susanna Moyer and extend South eighty seven degrees and thirty minutes East One hundred and twenty two feet to low water mark in the Stony Creek River, and the Southerly boundary line of the street shall commence at a point on the Easterly boundary line of Morris Street and fifty feet South of the Southerly boundary line of said Poplar Street continued, and extending South eighty seven degrees and thirty minutes East One hundred and twenty <sup>two</sup> feet to low water mark in the Stony Creek River. Sec. 3. That all laws, ordinances and regulations of the Borough relating to streets be and

the same are hereby extended to and over said street as fully and to all intents and purposes as they extend to and over the other streets of the Borough. I am petitioned or therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint seven disinterested freeholders of said Borough, who after being duly sworn or offered to perform their duties under the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided with impartiality and fidelity shall proceed to view the premises described in said ordinance or petition having regard to both advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line and adjoining said Poplar Street contained and shall assess <sup>and</sup> allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages and who shall also make assessment for contributions upon all such properties as shall be benefited by laying out and opening said Poplar Street such sums respectively as they may have been benefited over and above all disadvantages and the said viewers shall make a report of their proceedings in writing to the next Session of said Court describing the properties upon which assessments have been made specifically stating whether for contribution or for damages with the amounts respectively: The Court upon due consideration had of the premises appointed P. G. Dubois, Jacob Lund, A. D. Pricker, M. H. Levergood, J. F. Speedy, John Hamman, & Wesley Green as viewers who after giving due and legal notice of the time and place of meeting shall proceed to view the premises and make report of their proceedings as herein prayed for to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of said County <sup>and</sup>

in which report they shall state distinctly that they  
had been sworn or offered according to law.

Borough of Johnstown, respectfully represents that the  
Town Council of said Borough on the Eighteenth day  
of May 1888, passed the following Ordinance, viz:—  
Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and  
Town Council of the Borough of Johnstown, and  
it is hereby ordained and enacted by the Authority of the  
Sunt—

Sec. 1. That a street fifty feet wide commencing  
at the easterly boundary line of Morris Street, and  
extending in an easterly direction to low-water  
mark in the Stonycreek River, is hereby ordained,  
laid out, and opened to be known and designated  
as Poplar Street Continued.

Sec. 2. That the northerly boundary line of said  
Poplar Street Continued shall commence at a  
point on the easterly boundary line near the south-  
westerly corner of the property of Susanna Meyer,  
and extend South eighty seven degrees and thirty  
minutes east one hundred and twenty <sup>two</sup> feet to low-  
water mark in the Stonycreek River; and the  
southerly boundary line of the street shall commence  
at a point on the easterly boundary line of Morris Street,  
and fifty feet south of the northerly boundary  
line of said Poplar Street Continued, and extend  
South eighty seven degrees and thirty minutes  
east one hundred and twenty two feet to low-  
water mark in the Stonycreek River.

Sec. 3. That all laws, ordinances, and regulations

1 of the Borough relating to Streets &c and the same  
2 are hereby extended to and over said Street as  
3 fully and to all intents and purposes as they extend to  
4 and over the other Streets of the Borough.
