Borough of Johnstown does not damage any of the

At a General Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Chenango in and for the County of Cambridge on Monday the 5th day of December A.D. 1887. before Hon. P. S. Johnston President Judge of an said Court the petitioner of H. W. Stoney, Burgess of the Borough of Johnstown, ^{was present} respectfully representing "That the Town Council of said Borough on the 21st day of June 1887 passed the following Ordinance viz: Whereas - The following described alley located in the Fourth Ward of the Borough of Johnstown has been used by the public twenty-one years and upwards viz: The Southern boundary line commencing on Bedford Street at the North West corner of the property of Henry Reeking and extending North 64.30 degrees East One hundred and seventy-one feet and three inches to the South East Corner of Brown Alley thence in the same general direction ~~one~~ feet to the Borough line, the Northern boundary line commencing on Bedford Street at the South-Western corner of the property of Eva Michael and extending in Easterly direction along line of said property thirty-three feet and eight inches thence in a Southerly direction two feet and six inches, thence North 62-45 degrees East One hundred and twenty-five feet and six inches to and across and to the South Eastern corner of an unnamed twelve foot alley as shown by the accompanying draft thence in the same general

direction — feet to Borough line, wherefore —
Be it Ordained and enacted by the Burgesses
and Town Council of the Borough of Johnston
and it is hereby ordained and enacted by author-
ity of the same, Section 1. That the said alley
described in the foregoing preamble be and the
same is hereby declared a public alley of the
Borough and shall be designated and known
on the plot or map of streets and alleys of the
Borough as Coal Alley, Section 2. That all
Ordinances of the Borough relating to alleys
be and the same are hereby extended to and
over said alley. Your petitioners therefore pray your
Honorable Court to appoint seven disinterested free-
holders of said Borough, who, after being duly sworn
or affirmed according to law to perform their duties
under the Act of Assembly in such case made
Provided, with impartiality and fidelity, shall
proceed to view the premises described in said Ord-
inance or petition, having regard both to the advan-
tages and disadvantages caused to the several prop-
ties along the line of and adjoining said Coal
Alley and shall assess and allow to all persons
aggrieved, thereby such damages as they shall have
sustained respectively over and above all advantages
and who shall also make assessment for contribu-
tion upon all such properties as shall be benefited
by reason of declaring Coal Alley in the Fourth
Ward of Johnston a public alley such sums
respectively as they may have been benefited
over and above all disadvantages And the said
jurors shall make report of their proceedings

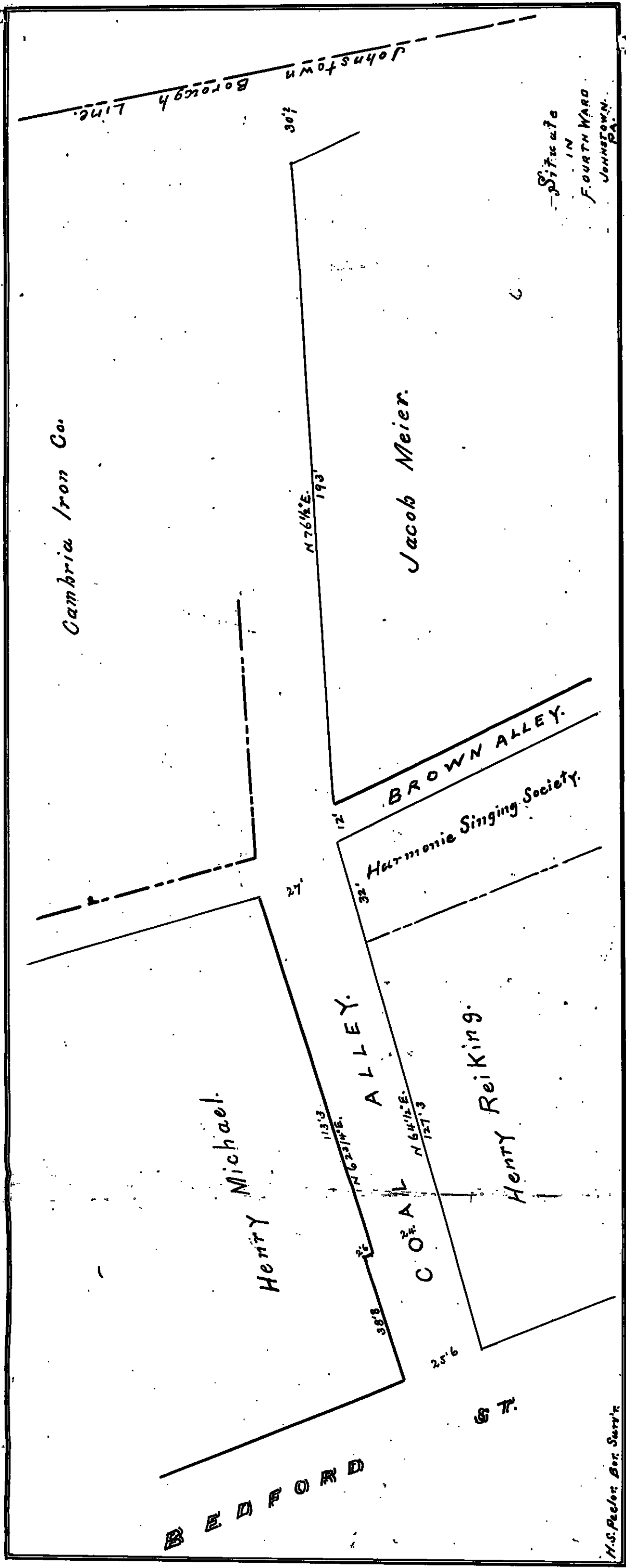

Council of said Borough on the 21st day of June,
1887, passed the following Ordinance, viz:

Whereas, the following described alley, located in
the Fourth Ward of the Borough of Johnstown, has
been used by the public twenty-one years and
upward, viz: The southern boundary line commencing
on Bedford Street; at the northwest corner of the
property of Henry Reiking, and extending north 64.30
degrees east one hundred and seventy one foot and
three inches to the southeast corner of Brown Alley,
thence in the same general direction feet to the
Borough line, the northern boundary line commencing
on Bedford Street at the southwest corner of the
property of Eva Michael, and extending in easterly
direction along line of said property thirty-eight feet
and eight inches, thence in a southerly direction two
feet and six inches, thence north 68.45 degrees east
one hundred and twenty-five feet and six inches to and
across and to the southeast corner of an unnamed
twelve-foot alley, as shown by the accompanying draft,
thence in the same general direction feet to
Borough line; therefore;

Be it Ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town
Council of the Borough of Johnstown, and it is hereby
ordained and enacted by authority of the same.
Section 1. That the said alley described in the

4 of Streets and Alleys of the Borough as Coal Alley.
5 Sec. 2. That all Ordinances of the Borough relating

7 over said alley.
