The petition of A. W. Storey, Burgers of the Borough
of Johnston, respectfully represents that the Town
Council of said Borough on the 20th day of September,
1887 passed the following Ordinance, to-wit:

Whereas, the Street known as Stoney Creek Street,
extending from the public grounds at the Point up and
along the Stoney Creek River to Vine Street, at Park Alley,
having been encroached upon by different persons at
various times and places; and

Whereas, At the present time the correct boundaries, as
established by the Brawley Surveys, appear to be in doubt,
at least along that portion extending from the Point to the
Union Graveyard; and

Whereas, The public interests now demand that the
said boundaries should be fixed and established
without unnecessary delay, thus securing to the public
a continuous street around that portion of our town
west of Franklin Street; therefore

Be it enacted and Ordained by the Burgers and
Town Council of the Borough of Johnston, and it
is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

Sec. 1. That the northern boundary line of Stoney Creek
Street shall commence at its junction with John Street,
at a post on the South Side of the Western End of Lincoln
Street, at a distance of two hundred and forty-four feet
west of Union Street, thence South thirteen and one fourth
degrees west two hundred and nine feet to an alley, thence
South eighteen and one fourth degrees east forty feet

feet to the northern side of Vine Street: at a point seventy
feet west from Union Street; thence south eighteen and
one fourth degrees east four hundred and eighty seven feet
to the western side of King Street at a point two
hundred and sixty eight feet south of Vine Street;
thence south twenty degrees east seven hundred and
eighteen feet to a post; thence south thirty one and three
fourth degrees east one hundred and thirty seven feet
to a post; thence south fifty nine degrees east one hundred
and sixty two feet to a post; thence south seventy two degrees
west sixty feet to a post on the western side of Market
Street at a distance of one hundred and twenty six feet
south of Chestnut Street; thence south seventy two degrees
west two hundred and fifty four feet to a post; thence
south fifty four and one half degrees west four hundred
and fifty one feet to a post at a point one hundred and nineteen
feet south of Vine Street; thence south thirty two and
one fourth degrees west one hundred and nineteen feet
to Vine Street. The northern line or boundary of
said Stoney Creek Street; from its junction with
John Street to a point opposite the line of the western
side of the Union Graveyard, shall be the low water
mark in the Stoney Creek River, and from said point
opposite the line of the western side of the Union
Graveyard shall be sixty feet south and east of and
parallel with the northern and western line or boundary
of said Street to a point one hundred and nineteen
feet south of Vine Street; at or near Court Alley, and from
that point one hundred and nineteen feet south of
Vine Street; the southern and eastern boundary to Vine
Street; shall be as now fixed and located.
Sec. 9. That all the ground lying between the northern

line of said Straycreek Street as laid out and fixed
by the Brawley survey, and the northern line as fixed
by the Ordinance, be and the same is hereby declared
to be vacated.

Sec. 3. That all Ordinances of said Borough relating to
Streets and alleys be and the same are hereby extended
to and over said Straycreek Street.
