And now June the 1888, The viewers appointed to view the place where a road is requested by Michael Scherle from the New Bedford road to the Saw mill of Michael Scherle on the old Bedford road in Adams Township, having reported that they had laid out and returned for the use of said Michael Scherle the following described road to wit: Beginning at a Birch on the New Bedford road thence on land of Michael Scherle, South thirty six and a half degrees West eighty eight perches to a Birch South sixty five degrees West thirty four perches to a post South twenty one and a half degrees West twenty perches to a post South nineteen degrees West twenty seven perches to a maple North eighty nine degrees West fifteen perches to a post South eighty two degrees West eight perches to line of Archibald Nichols, continued thirty three perches to a post South sixty two degrees West twenty perches to a Birch, South thirty three and a half degrees West twenty perches to a post South forty one degrees West forty perches to a post, line of Michael Scherle, continued through log yard of Michael Scherle, fifty six perches to post on Old Bedford Road and it appearing by the said report that said road was necessary the Court approve of said report, and the same being entered on record at the next session of this Court, thereafore said road shall be deemed and taken to be a lawful private road and the Court do further order, that upon the said

payment by the said Michael Scherle of the damages sus-
tained by Archibald Nichol, through whose land a
part of the same passes, the said shall be opened twenty
feet in width.

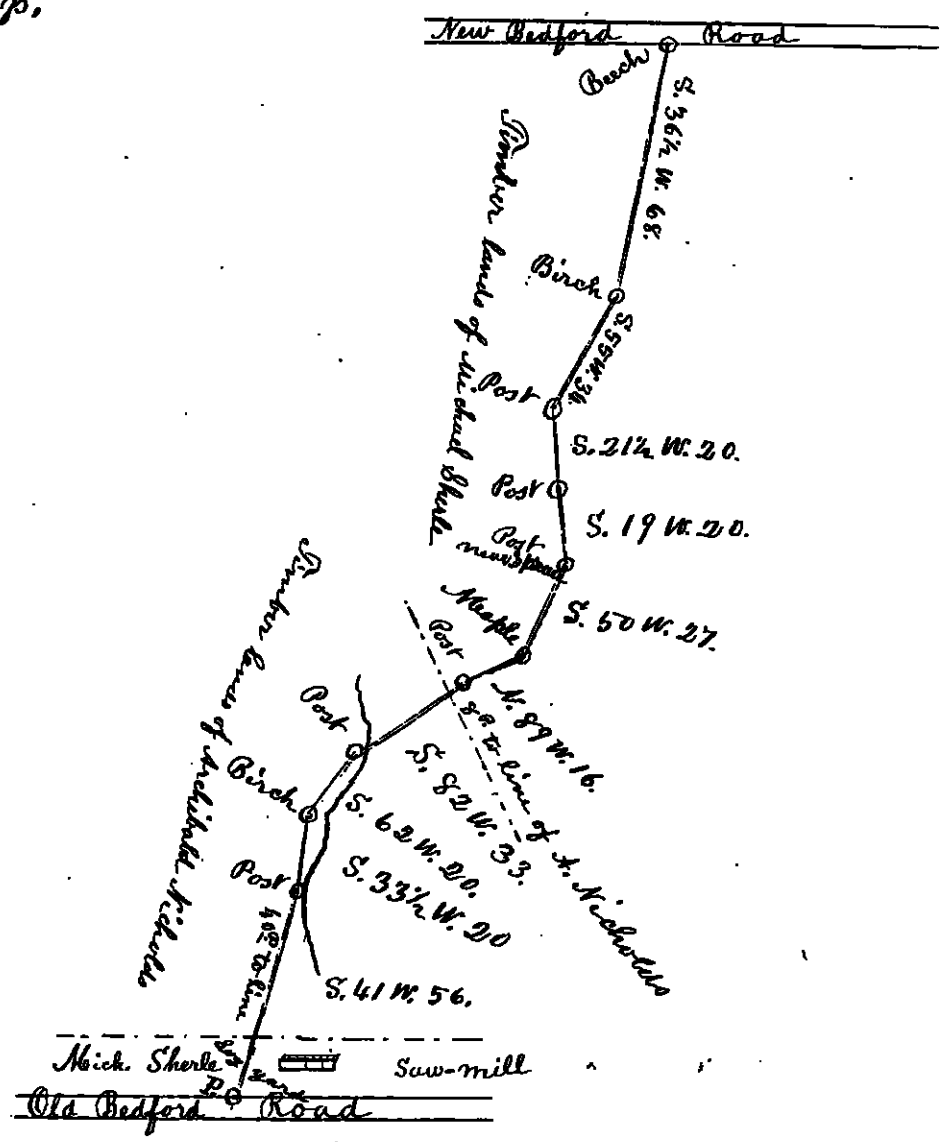
To the Honorable R. L. Johnston, Judge of

We, the persons appointed by the annexed order
of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned,
to wit: David Stofft, Surveyor, and Samuel Hoffman and
Meoso King, viewers, being present and severally sworn,
according to law, do report, that, after having given due
notice by written notices being put up according to law,
in pursuance of the said order we have viewed and laid
out and do return for private use, the following road,
to wit: Beginning at a Beech at the ^{new} Bedford road, thence
on land of Michael Sherle, South thirty six and a half degrees
West, sixty eight perches to a Birch; South fifty five degrees West,
thirty four perches to a post; South twenty one and a half degrees
West, twenty perches to a post; South nineteen degrees West, twenty
perches near Spruce; South fifty degrees West, twenty seven perches to
a Maple; North eighty nine degrees West, sixteen perches to a post;
South eighty two degrees West, eight perches to line of Archibald
Nichols, continued thirty three perches to a post; South sixty two
degrees West, twenty perches to a Beech; South thirty three and a
half degrees West, twenty perches to a post; South forty one deg-
rees West, forty perches line of Michael Sherle, continued through
log yard of said Mr. Sherle, fifty six perches to post at Old Bed-
ford road. A plot or draft whereof is hereto annexed.

same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint, David Stuff SURVEYOR,
and Samuel Hoffman & Elmore King

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such
road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioner, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.
